OPTIONS FOR REMAINING UNITS: Students must select Option A, Option B, or Option C as detailed below

Note for Option A and Option B: You will undertake a project towards the end of your course. This project is intended to provide you with the opportunity to develop a depth of understanding by *applying* knowledge and skills developed during the course and you will work closely with a supervisor while undertaking the project. You must have a WAM of >70 to be accepted into the Major Project. If you intend to progress to a PhD you are advised to do a Major Project. Students undertaking the Minor/Major Project options are normally required to have completed HSH725 as a prerequisite. This is straight forward for students undertaking the Minor Project as they have room to incorporate both HSH725 and the Minor Project among their four credit points of electives. However, for students wishing to study the Major Project, studying HSH725 as an elective before undertaking the Major Project would mean increasing the number of units in their degree from 12 to 13. As a consequence, HSH725 is recommended but not a prerequisite for MHHS students undertaking the Major Project. Because of this, students can enrol in the Major Project only with explicit approval of the Course Director.
