The Deakin - Southern Health Nursing Research Centre was established in 2006 with the appointment of Professor Bev O'Connell, as Chair, Deakin - Southern Health Chair in Nursing. The purpose of this appointment was to provide professional leadership in the areas of nursing research and practice across Deakin University and Southern Health. This partnership has resulted in the development of the Deakin -Southern Health Nursing Research Centre which is based at Monash Medical Centre, Clayton Campus. The Nursing Research Centre conducts research activities across all Southern Health sites.

The objectives of the Deakin - Southern Health Nursing Research Centre are to conduct a research program enhancing quality and patient safety through:

- Enhancing the independence and wellbeing of individuals in clinical and aged care settings
- Encouraging and supporting nurse clinicians to participate in research activities
- Promoting the integration of research findings into educational programs, health care policy and clinical practice
- Developing and supporting research collaboration between Southern Health, Deakin University and industry partners

Nursing management of behaviours of concern in residential aged care facilities

The Tri-focal Model of Care: Teaching and Research Aged Care Services (TRACS)

This project further develops the Teaching Nursing Home model to include multidisciplinary and interprofessional learning and training opportunities that could form the basis of a TRACS hub in aged care and to develop a structure and process to incorporate more multidisciplinary research as part of everyday activities.

Uplanned readmissions for elderly patients with congestive heart failure

Tri-focal Model of Care: Advancing the Teaching Nursing Home concept
