HOW DO I APPLY FOR A SCHOLARSHIP?

COMMENCING STUDENTS

If you apply for your course through VTAC, you will need to submit your application for a Deakin Access and Equity Scholarship using the online application located on the VTAC website at www.vtac.edu.au. You will be required to submit supporting documentation online.

VTAC applicants who wish to apply for Deakin Academic Scholarships, The Invergowrie Foundation Tertiary Scholarship for Women and The George Alexander Foundation Scholarships must apply directly to Deakin University using the online form located at www.deakin.edu.au/future-students/scholarships.

Students who deferred their course offer until 2009 should apply using the online form located at www.deakin.edu.au/scholarships.

Commencing Medical students should apply using the online form located at www.deakin.edu.au/scholarships.

CONTINUING DEAKIN STUDENTS

Continuing Deakin students should complete the online application form located at www.deakin.edu.au/scholarships or as described in the individual scholarship or bursary entries in this publication.

WHEN DO I APPLY?

Applications open on Monday 11 August 2008.

WHEN DO APPLICATIONS CLOSE?

Commencing students – VTAC applicants

The closing date for VTAC scholarship applications is Friday 10 October 2008.

Commencing Medical students

The closing date for Medical scholarship applications is Friday 10 October 2008.

Continuing Deakin students and deferrals

The closing date for continuing Deakin students and deferral applications is Wednesday 29 October 2008 at 5pm.

Applicants must provide all supporting documentation by 5pm, Monday 10 November 2008 to: Scholarships Office, Division of Student Administration, Deakin University, Geelong Vic 3217.

If supporting documentation is not received, applications will not be considered.

Note. You should be aware that the scholarships which pay you in cash, apart from Commonwealth scholarships, are not regarded as exempt income by Centrelink.

COMMENCING STUDENTS

The following scholarships are available for students beginning their studies at Deakin University in 2009.

DEAKIN ACCESS SCHOLARSHIPS

The Deakin Access Scholarships are available to help those students who, because of some hardship, disability or other form of disadvantage, might not otherwise enjoy the benefits that flow from participation in higher education.

Deakin would like to assist you to pursue a university education – so if this is your experience, please consider applying for one of the Deakin Access Scholarships.

VALUE

Deakin Access Scholarships cover the cost of your student contributions for the normal duration of the course, which may be undertaken at Melbourne, Geelong or Warrnambool.

DURATION

Normal duration of the course, subject to satisfactory academic performance.

NUMBER PER YEAR

Twenty-five

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen, or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » commencing an undergraduate course of study as a Commonwealth Supported student.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Academic merit based on ENTER or grade point average from previous higher education studies after one of the following areas of disadvantage has been established:

- » you are a full-time student who is a recipient of a Centrelink benefit or can demonstrate that you have a personal or family taxable income below the HECS repayment threshold, depending on independence status
- » you are a full-time student who has a rural or regional home location
- » you are a full-time or part-time student with a disability
- » you are a mature-age student studying on or off campus either full-time or part-time.

THE GEORGE ALEXANDER FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP AT DEAKIN UNIVERSITY

The George Alexander Foundation Scholarship at Deakin University was established by the George Alexander Foundation in 2006, with the aim of assisting undergraduate students who have the academic ability and the will to succeed in higher education but who are disadvantaged by economic, social or geographical circumstances.

VALUE

\$7000 per annum

DURATION

Three years

NUMBER PER YEAR

Three

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen, or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » commencing an undergraduate full-time course of study as a Commonwealth Supported student
- » a full-time student of good academic standing at one of the Geelong or Warrnambool Campuses who shows initiative in their academic and/or personal life.

SELECTION CRITERIA

You are a full-time student who is a recipient of a Centrelink benefit, or can demonstrate that you have a personal or family taxable income below the HECS repayment threshold, depending on independence status; and your academic ability.

HOW TO APPLY

Students will be required to complete a separate application form available on the Deakin University Scholarships website at www.deakin.edu.au/future-students/scholarships.

DEAKIN SPOTLESS SCHOLARSHIP

The Deakin Spotless Scholarship is available to help make a university education a real possibility for a student from a financially disadvantaged background.

VALUE

Payment of student contribution fees up to the value of \$7500 per annum.

DURATION

Three years

NUMBER PER YEAR

One

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen, or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a commencing full-time student undertaking an undergraduate course of study as a Commonwealth Supported student.

SELECTION CRITERIA

You are a full-time student who is a recipient of a Centrelink benefit, or can demonstrate that you have a personal or family taxable income below the HECS repayment threshold, depending on independence status.

DEAKIN ACCOMMODATION SCHOLARSHIPS

If you are moving away from your rural or regional home location to study at Deakin in Geelong or Warrnambool, please consider applying for a Deakin Accommodation Scholarship. Without the financial pressures of living away from home, you can focus on achieving academic success in your studies.

VALUE

Up to \$8000 towards annual accommodation costs in University residences at either Geelong or Warrnambool for the normal duration of the course.

DURATION

Normal duration of the course, subject to satisfactory academic performance.

NUMBER PER YEAR

Fifteen in total allocated to Geelong and Warrnambool.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

Successful applicants are not permitted to hold a Deakin Accommodation Scholarship and a Commonwealth Accommodation Scholarship concurrently.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » a commencing full-time student who has moved from a rural or regional location to study on campus at either the Geelong Campus at Waurin Ponds, the Geelong Waterfront Campus, or the Warrnambool Campus
- » an Australian citizen, or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » commencing an undergraduate course of study as a Commonwealth Supported student.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Academic merit based on ENTER or grade point average from previous higher education studies once rural and financial disadvantage has been established:

- » you are a full-time student who is a recipient of a Centrelink benefit, or can demonstrate that you have a personal or family taxable income below the HECS repayment threshold, depending on independence status
- » you are a full-time student who has a rural or regional home location
- » you are required to move away from a rural or regional home location.

DEAKIN ACCOMMODATION (MEDICINE) SCHOLARSHIPS

If you are moving away from home to study medicine at Deakin in Geelong, you can apply for a Deakin Accommodation (Medicine) Scholarship to help with your living expenses.

VALUE

Up to \$8000 towards annual accommodation costs in University residences at the Geelong Campus at Waurin Ponds for the normal duration of the course.

DURATION

Normal duration of the course, subject to satisfactory academic performance.

NUMBER PER YEAR

Three

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

Successful applicants are not permitted to hold a Deakin Accommodation (Medicine) Scholarship, Helen and Geoff Handbury Accommodation Scholarship and a Commonwealth Accommodation Scholarship concurrently.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen, or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » commencing the Bachelor of Medicine Bachelor of Surgery course of study as a full-time Commonwealth Supported student
- » disadvantaged socio-economic background, or in financial need, or that you have a demonstrable disadvantage.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Your academic merit once financial or other disadvantage has been established; and you are required to move away from your home.

ACCESS AND EQUITY SCHOLARSHIPS

THE HELEN AND GEOFF HANDBURY ACCOMMODATION SCHOLARSHIPS AT THE DEAKIN MEDICAL SCHOOL

Deakin aims to train highly skilled doctors who are motivated to pursue a career in rural or regional areas. If you are applying to the Bachelor of Medicine Bachelor of Surgery program, the Helen and Geoff Handbury Accommodation Scholarships are available to assist you with your on-campus accommodation costs.

VALUE

Payment of \$7500 towards annual accommodation costs in University residences at the Geelong Campus at Waurn Ponds.

DURATION

Four years

NUMBER PER YEAR

Two

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

The following special conditions apply:

- » academic merit once financial or other disadvantage has been established
- » you are required to move away from your home.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be a commencing student enrolled in the Deakin Medical program as a Commonwealth Supported student.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Selection is based on access and equity criteria and commitment to rural or regional medical practice in the state of Victoria.

THE DEAKIN COSTA FAMILY FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

Deakin's commitment to rural and regional engagement is reflected in many of its scholarships, including the Deakin Costa Family Foundation Scholarship. If you are applying to the Bachelor of Medicine Bachelor of Surgery program, this scholarship is available to those who come from a rural or regional area, and assists with course fees.

VALUE

Payment of student contributions up to the value of \$7000 per annum.

DURATION

Four years

NUMBER PER YEAR

Two

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen, or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » commencing the Bachelor of Medicine Bachelor of Surgery course of study as a full-time Commonwealth Supported student
- » able to demonstrate that you are from a disadvantaged socio-economic background, or in financial need, or that you have a demonstrable disadvantage.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Academic merit once financial or other disadvantage has been established.

DEAKIN HELEN MACPHERSON SMITH TRUST SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is open to women from rural and regional areas of Victoria commencing undergraduate studies at Deakin.

VALUE

Payment of your student contributions up to the value of \$7000 per year.

DURATION

For the normal length of the undergraduate course.

NUMBER PER YEAR

Seven

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » female, an Australian citizen or holding an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » commencing an undergraduate course of study as a Commonwealth Supported student.

SELECTION CRITERIA

You are a full-time student who is a recipient of a Centrelink benefit, or can demonstrate that you have a personal or family taxable income below the HECS repayment threshold, depending on your independence status.

THE INVERGOWRIE FOUNDATION TERTIARY SCHOLARSHIP FOR WOMEN AT DEAKIN UNIVERSITY

This scholarship is open to women from rural and regional areas of Victoria commencing undergraduate studies at Deakin.

VALUE

Payment of student contributions or accommodation at University residences up to \$8000 per year.

DURATION

Three to four years

NUMBER PER YEAR

One

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen, or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a commencing student enrolled full-time in an undergraduate course of study at the Geelong Campus at Waurin Ponds, Geelong Waterfront Campus or the Warrnambool Campus as a Commonwealth Supported student.

SELECTION CRITERIA

- » You are a full-time student who is a recipient of a Centrelink benefit, or can demonstrate that you have a personal or family taxable income below the HECS repayment threshold, depending on independence status.
- » You are a female resident of Victoria and can demonstrate that you are from a rural or regional area, possibly living in isolation.
- » You do not already have a bachelors degree.

HOW TO APPLY

Students will be required to complete a separate application form available on the Deakin University Scholarships website at www.deakin.edu.au/future-students/scholarships.

DEAKIN WHITEHORSE CITY COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIP

If you live in the City of Whitehorse please consider applying for this scholarship and reduce your overall study expenses.

VALUE

Cash payment of \$4500

DURATION

One year

NUMBER PER YEAR

One

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen, or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » commencing an undergraduate course of study at the Melbourne Campus at Burwood as a Commonwealth Supported student
- » a resident in the City of Whitehorse for at least the previous 12 months.

SELECTION CRITERIA

You are a full-time student who is a recipient of a Centrelink benefit, or can demonstrate that you have a personal or family taxable income below the HECS repayment threshold, depending on your independence status.

THE HAROLD CARROLL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

If you are from the Western District of Victoria, the Harold Carroll Memorial Scholarship, which was established by the late Harold Carroll in 2003, is specifically for a student from this District, to assist with the costs of your university education.

VALUE

Cash payment of \$3000 per year

DURATION

For the length of the course

NUMBER PER YEAR

One

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » from the Western District of Victoria
- » enrolled full-time in an undergraduate course as a Commonwealth Supported student
- » a commencing or continuing student
- » have undertaken some part of your education at a school in the Western District.

SELECTION CRITERIA

You are a full-time student who is a recipient of a Centrelink benefit, or can demonstrate that you have a personal or family taxable income below the HECS repayment threshold, depending on independence status.

THE DEAKIN GWEN AND EDNA JONES FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is open to commencing students from the Warrnambool area, studying an undergraduate course of study at any Deakin Campus.

VALUE

Payment of your student contributions up to \$8000 per year.

DURATION

Three years

NUMBER PER YEAR

One

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen, or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a commencing student enrolled full-time in an undergraduate course of study at the Geelong Campus at Waurin Ponds, Geelong Waterfront Campus or the Warrnambool Campus as a Commonwealth Supported student.

SELECTION CRITERIA

You are a full-time student who is a recipient of a Centrelink benefit, or can demonstrate that you have a personal or family taxable income below the HECS repayment threshold, depending on independence status.

ACCESS AND EQUITY SCHOLARSHIPS

THE DEAKIN A.L. LANE FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is open to commencing students from the south-west Victorian region, studying an undergraduate course at the Warrnambool Campus.

VALUE

Payment of \$8000 towards annual accommodation costs in University residences at the Warrnambool Campus.

DURATION

Three years

NUMBER PER YEAR

One

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen, or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a commencing student enrolled full-time in an undergraduate course of study at the Warrnambool Campus as a Commonwealth Supported student
- » reside in the south-western Victorian region.

Residents of the City of Warrnambool are not eligible for this scholarship.

SELECTION CRITERIA

You are a full-time student who is a recipient of a Centrelink benefit, or can demonstrate that you have a personal or family taxable income below the HECS repayment threshold, depending on independence status.

THE DEAKIN RAY AND JOYCE UEBERGANG FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is open to commencing students from the Warrnambool area or south-west Victorian region, studying an undergraduate course at the Warrnambool or Geelong Campuses.

VALUE

Payment of \$8600 towards your student contributions or annual accommodation costs in University residences at the Warrnambool Campus.

DURATION

Three years

NUMBER PER YEAR

One

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen, or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a commencing student enrolled full-time in an undergraduate course of study at the Warrnambool or Geelong Campus as a Commonwealth Supported student
- » reside in the south-western Victorian region.

SELECTION CRITERIA

You are a full-time student who is a recipient of a Centrelink benefit, or can demonstrate that you have a personal or family taxable income below the HECS repayment threshold, depending on independence status.

DEAKIN WARRNAMBOOL CITY COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIP

If you live in the City of Warrnambool please consider applying for this scholarship and reduce your overall study expenses.

VALUE

Payment of your student contributions up to \$7500 per year.

DURATION

Up to four years

NUMBER PER YEAR

One

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen or holding an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a commencing student enrolled full-time in an undergraduate course of study at the Warrnambool Campus as a Commonwealth Supported student
- » a resident of the City of Warrnambool.

SELECTION CRITERIA

You are a full-time student who is a recipient of a Centrelink benefit, or can demonstrate that you have a personal or family taxable income below the HECS repayment threshold, depending on independence status.





COMMONWEALTH SCHOLARSHIPS

Commonwealth Education Costs Scholarships (CECS) and Commonwealth Accommodation Scholarships (CAS) are available to commencing and continuing full-time students. Scholarship holders must maintain their eligibility to retain the scholarship. If you are successful, you may hold CECS, CAS and other scholarships concurrently. An exception is the Commonwealth Accommodation Scholarship, which cannot be held with a Deakin Accommodation Scholarship.

VALUE

THE MOORE FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

John Moore arrived in the Warrnambool district from Ireland in the 1840s, followed in the 1850s by his brother James. The brothers acquired land on the Merri River close to Russell's Creek. Seven of their sister Mary's children followed them to Warrnambool in the 1860s.

Most members of the Moore family did well in their new home and have contributed considerably to the development of the community of Warrnambool and the Western District in the subsequent 150 years.

This scholarship has been funded from the estates of three of James' grandchildren – Mary Isabella (Isabelle) Moore, Eileen Marjorie O'Brien (nee Moore) and John (Jack) Moore. The former two family members both undertook some or all of their nursing training at Warrnambool Base Hospital pre and post Second World War.

Despite the fact that all three eventually left Victoria for other states, this scholarship has been established because Isabelle, Marjorie and Jack were supported by and prospered in the Warrnambool community.
