The Global Citizenship Program

This program is specifically designed to help you develop the skills necessary to be a global citizen and to have those skills recognised in a formal way. To become a global citizen, you will need to participate in a number of internationally-related activities that assist you to develop key personal, academic and careers skills.

Each activity is given a point value based on its associated skills and the extent to which each skill is developed. The Global Citizenship Program is designed to be completed before you graduate. Once you have acquired a minimum of 100 points and your application has been approved, you will be awarded the Global Citizenship Program Certificate that will list the activities and the skills you have gained. This will assist you in communicating to future employers the additional skills you can offer in this increasingly globalised world.

If an activity is not listed but you believe the activity has contributed towards you becoming a global citizen, please complete the GCP Petition for Additional Points form on page 3.
