

Scholarships at Deakin

Scholarship application tips

Whether it's by helping them overcome disadvantage or by recognising their academic merit, our scholarships could transform your students' lives and futures.

As the deadline for some scholarships approaches, it is important for students to set aside time to thoroughly organise their scholarship applications to ensure they are high-quality and ready to submit on time.

Students must:

- ensure they understand the scholarship eligibility and application process
- be aware of the supporting documentation required to support their scholarship.

Where to apply

Applicants can apply for selected scholarships through the VTAC system and are also encouraged to complete a separate application through the [Deakin University Course and Scholarship Applicant Portal](#). The closing dates for scholarships through Deakin University and VTAC are different; applicants should check the information on both websites.

New scholarship opportunities will open regularly until the start of Trimester 1. Students are encouraged to routinely check for new opportunities on the Deakin University Scholarships website:

Warrnambool and Geelong VCE Exam Revision Lectures

Deakin University is proud to bring the 2018 Access Education VCE Exam Revision Lectures to our Warrnambool and Geelong Campuses.

The VCE Revision Lecture program allows students studying a VCE Unit 3 or 4 to revise the unit content in a supported structured environment, to help prepare them for their end-of-year exam. The lectures are facilitated by VCE professionals, who are subject experts in their fields.

Students will access:

- extensive and detailed exam revision lectures of up to three hours

Upcoming information sessions:

► CASPer: non-academic selection tool for initial teacher courses

If students are applying for the Bachelor of Education (Early Years), Bachelor of Education (Primary), Bachelor of Health and Physical Education, Master of Applied Learning and Teaching or Master of Teaching, they will need to sit the CASPer test on one of the following dates:

Date and times

- Tuesday 25 September 2018 8pm (AEST)
- Sunday 14 October 2018 1pm (AEDT)
- Thursday 29 November 2018 6pm (AEDT)
- Sunday 9 December 2018 1pm (AEDT)
- Friday 4 January 2019 10am (AEDT)
- Tuesday 22 January 2019 6pm (AEDT)
- Thursday 7 February 2019 6pm (AEDT)

The CASPer test is not a pre-requisite for the Bachelor of Arts/Master of Teaching (Secondary), Bachelor of Science/Master of Teaching (Secondary) or Associate Degree of Education. In both secondary teaching courses, students will need to sit the CASPer test towards the end of their Bachelor Degree before beginning the Master of Teaching component. When transitioning from the Associate Degree of Education to a target bachelor's course, students will need to undertake CASPer during the application process.

**Please note times are listed in Australian Eastern Standard Time (AEST) and Australian Eastern Daylight Time (AEDT) as specified. Ensure you are aware of any time zone differences before the test.*

If your student requires additional support or modified testing conditions, a formal request and supporting documentation must be provided at least three weeks in advance of the applicant taking the test, to allow sufficient time for document review and a decision on support required.

Congratulations to 'Flower Power' from Yarra Valley Grammar for winning the Nextgen illuminate challenge! Deakin Business School (DBS) partners with Illuminate Education to deliver the *NextGen challenge*. This week-long program allows secondary students to experience first-hand what it takes to be an entrepreneur and small business champion. The program is developed by Adam Mostogl (Top 30 Under 30 Australian Entrepreneurs 2017, Tasmanian Young Australian of the Year 2015), and is facilitated by DBS Academic staff and student ambassadors, with the support of the local business community.

In August 2018 the program was delivered at Koonung Secondary College where 40 students in years 9 and 10 from Koonung Secondary College, Whitefriars College and Yarra Valley Grammar came together. The students were given the skills and support to develop a social enterprise and complete several tasks and presentations. On the last day, Deakin hosted an awards ceremony where family and friends were invited and the students were given the opportunity to showcase their businesses.

► Global Science and Technology Program

This scholarship program is open to all courses offered by the Faculty of Science, Engineering and Built Environment, and aims to recognise, reward and support high achieving students interested in conducting part of their studies overseas, in order to develop new skills and a broader worldview. Successful applicants will receive a \$3000 scholarship to assist with travel costs and will participate in the Deakin Global Citizenship Program.
