What is EchoSystem?



Echosystem is an audio/video service which provides:

- a) Classroom Capture (the ability to capture and record lectures in Echo-enabled teaching spaces), and
- b) Personal Capture (the ability to record lectures on a PC or Mac workstation).

Classroom Capture lectures are automatically stored on the EchoSystem server, and can be linked to your CloudDeakin site for your students to view or download. This can be particularly useful for students who are not located on campus.

To create *Personal Capture* video material you will need to download the *Installer for Personal Capture* software. (Log into www.echosystem.deakin.edu.au and click the Download tab to access the software.)

The CloudDeakin Echo guide¹ contains step-by-step instructions on how to use EchoSystem.

Editing Echo files


Echo allows basic editing of your recording within the system, including editing the title, adding or removing additional presenters, or adding a description. See the *Manage Recordings* tab in the CloudDeakin Echo guide¹.

If you want make further edits such as trimming irrelevant material, and adding images, music or additional features; then you will need to download the recording and edit it in another program.

In this fact sheet we will provide an overview and additional links related to using iMovie for audio/video editing. iMovie is an Apple product and can only be used with a Mac computer or an iPad.

Using iMovie for audio/video editing involves four main steps:

Download your recording from the EchoSystem server.
 Go to the Echo log in page, log in with your Deakin details, and then hover your mouse over the recording you want to edit. A list of options should pop-up. Select 'Download' and save the Zip file.



- 2. Copy your file into iMovie.
- 3. Edit your recording within iMovie and then save the video file on your computer.
- 4. Restore the edited file to the EchoSystem server (See uploading media Echo CloudDeakin guide² for details).

iMovie



To use iMovie you will need an Apple device such as an Apple Mac or an iPad. iMovie is available from the iTunes App Store. The Mac version³ of the app is \$15.99, and the iPad version⁴ is \$5.49. (Note that the iPad version is free if you purchased your iPad after 1 September 2013).

Loading your file into iMovie

Mac: To import a saved Echo recording: Open iMovie for Mac, then go to File > Import > and select Movies. Access this video guide for importing video to iMovie⁵ for further details.

iPad: To import an Echo recording file from Mac or PC to your iPad: Plug your iPad into your computer and open iTunes. Select your iPad's name, then click Photos > Sync Photos (includes video) > Browse to... [the saved Echo recording] > then Sync. You can also move a recording from your iPad back to your computer using this method. See the Apple support site⁶ for detailed instructions.
