

FUNDING ASSISTANCE

Domestic students may be eligible to apply for an OS-Help Loan up to \$6250 to help fund their study in the International Study Program. OS-HELP assists students with a range of expenses, such as airfares and accommodation.

IMPORTANT TO NOTE

- ISP is based on a minimum number of participating students
- A \$1000 deposit is required upon acceptance into the program
- We recommend applying for a visa immediately after acceptance. Visa application processes may vary in length and complexity. Further details will be provided once you are accepted into the program.
- Travel insurance is free during the length of the program. Students travelling beyond the program dates may need to pay for additional coverage.
- Students MUST meet all deposit and payment deadlines or they will be excluded from the program. A pending application for OS Help is not a relevant reason for not meeting a payment deadline. Students must ensure they have sufficient funds to meet the required deadlines.

HOW TO APPLY

Please visit study-abroad.deakin.edu.au. Select *Outbound > Faculty Study Tours > Programs*. Type in the name of the program and select *Request Info* for more information or *Apply Now* to apply.

Successful applicants will be notified on 5 September 2014 and must be ready to accept their place in the program by paying their \$1000 deposit by 19 September 2014.

Applications close 29 August 2014.

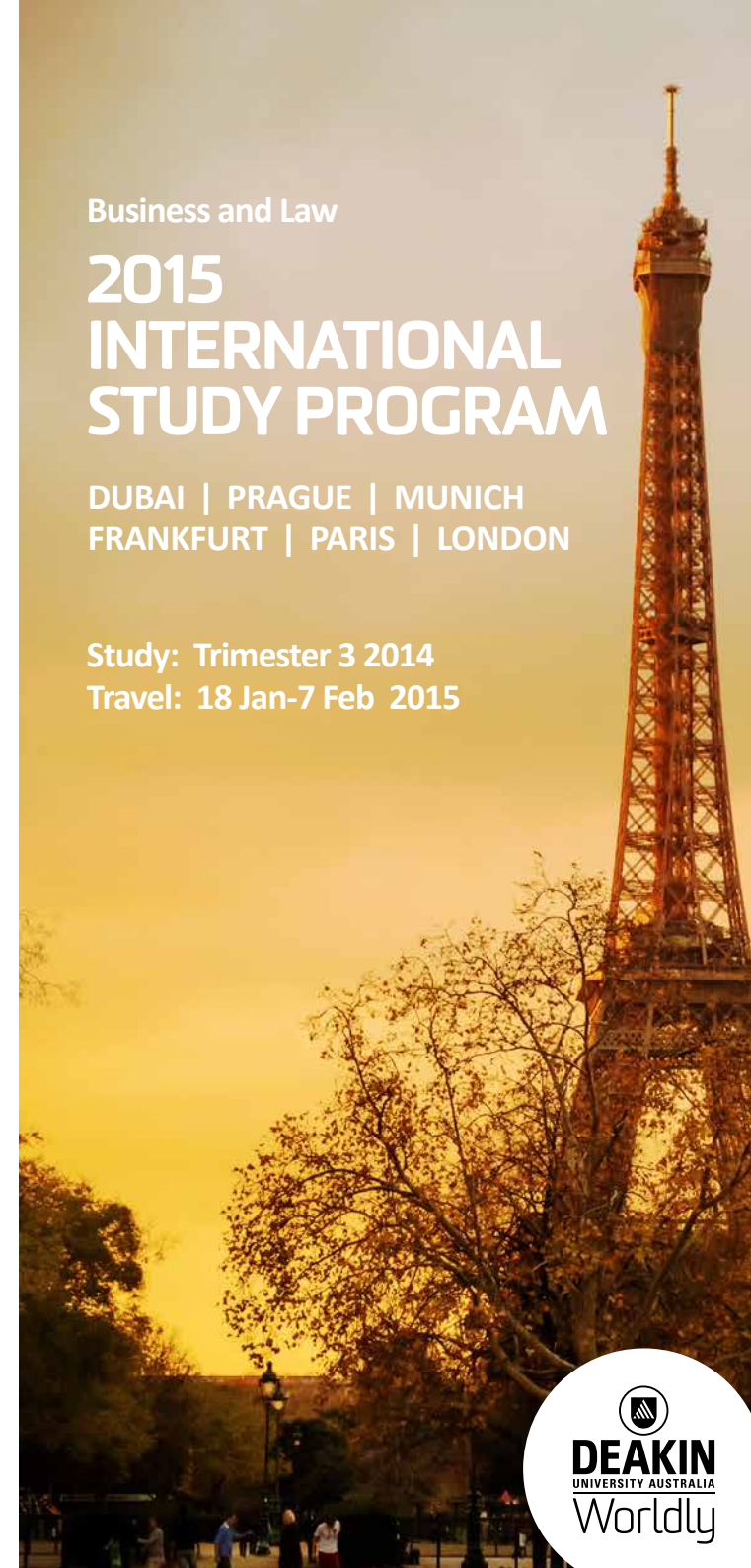

A DEAKIN WORLDLY PROGRAM

The International Study Program (ISP) offers a fantastic opportunity to visit some of the world's most influential financial institutions, while exploring the Middle East, UK and Europe. It combines traditional study with experiential learning and will run for three weeks between January and February 2015 (Trimester 3 2014).

The ISP is a condensed trimester of study at Melbourne Burwood Campus in November and December, followed by approximately three weeks of international travel between January 18 and February 7 2015.

Students will visit the following cities and institutions*:

- Dubai (UAE) – **Dubai Islamic Bank**
- Prague (Czech Republic) – **Czech National Bank**
- Munich (Germany) – TBA
- Frankfurt (Germany) – **European Central Bank, Frankfurt Stock Exchange, Deutsche Bank**
- Paris (France) – **OECD**
- London (UK) – **Standard & Poors, Reuters, ING.**

**This itinerary is subject to change. A revised itinerary, including further detail regarding the timing of activities will be made available closer to your departure date.*



PROGRAM STRUCTURE

The program provides students with a deeper understanding of the international aspects of trade, economic policy and finance through international organisation visits such as ECB, Duetsche Bank, OECD, S&P and industry visits. The program encourages teamwork and extends the educational and social experience of students by exposing them to different social and professional cultures. It also equips students to behave professionally during institutional visits and to communicate effectively.

UNITS OFFERED

- **MET303 International Trade**
- **MFT306 International Finance and Investment**
- **MFT760 International Finance**

Students cannot enrol themselves in the study program units via StudentConnect. Successful applicants will be advised of their acceptance and enrolled by the Faculty. Students should nominate their preferred unit of study when they submit their application.

ASSESSMENT

Each of these units initially involves an intensive three week teaching period in Trimester 3 concluding with a 2 hour exam in December with a 50% weighting.

The remaining assessment is based on the international travel component of the program and comprises the following:

- Assignment/Final report (group of 3) 2000-2500 words 20%
- Intelligence report (pre-tour) (group of 2 or 3) 15%
- Intelligence report presentation 5%
- Program participation 10%.

COST

The approximate cost of the 2015 program will be AUD\$7500. Study Program inclusions:

- return economy class airfares with Emirates

- hot/cold buffet breakfast daily
