Learning package one: Risk factors influencing neonatal health

In order to prepare nurses to work in a special care nursery the learning package aims to provide assessment techniques and nursing management strategies essential for assessing and caring for neonates who require admission to a special care nursery and for their families.

The content of this learning package includes:

- Pre existing maternal disease states and possible impact on the fetus/neonate
- Maternal health factors that impact upon perinatal/neonatal health
- Health assessment of the neonate
- Congenital and chromosomal abnormalities of the neonate
- Gestational age assessment of the neonate
- Challenges of feeding the ill neonate
- Professional practice in neonatal care
- Ethics in neonatal practice

Learning package two: Assessment and care of neonates

This learning package aims to explore common neonatal disorders, therapeutic interventions, resuscitation and transfer to a tertiary health care centre; understand health assessment of the neonate in the special care nursery, their developmental needs and care of the family.

The content of this learning package includes:

- Family centered and development nursing care
- Care of the newborn with
 - o a respiratory illness, including oxygen therapy and apnoea
 - o jaundice and haemolytic disease of the newborn including phototherapy management
 - hypoglycaemia including blood glucose monitoring: infant of a diabetic mother and hyperglycaemia
 - Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS) and neonatal drug exposure
 - o infection including IV therapy and antibiotic administration
- Resuscitation of the neonate
- Stabilisation and preparation of a neonate for transfer to a tertiary health care centre

Assessment: Assignment: 2500 words (100%)

Admission requirements

- Registered nurses with hospital certificate or undergraduate diploma or degree
- Other health professionals will be assessed on an individual basis
