This colloquium will be co-facilitated by Toija Cinque and David Marshall. This event is organized around the issues of the growth of personal data collection, data sharing as well as increased self-tracking practices using social media (such as tablets and smart phones) linked to wearable devices (such as Fitbits) and the various implications/advantages for children. Developing a greater understanding of children's growing interaction with wearable options is a research focus for a number in the group, given that technological devices are increasingly embedded in childhood development and can be found in the social, educational and familial settings.
