The successful applicant will be based at the Burwood Campus.

Research Topic

Open to several fields: Evaluation, Psychometrics, Epidemiology, Health Services Research and Public Health and Health Promotion more broadly.

Aim of the Project

The PhD research project is linked to a large national and international research initiative with the following vision:

To use the full potential of health literacy (HL) approaches to reduce health inequalities and disease burden. The aims of this initiative include, but are not limited to the:

- 1. Design and application of HL interventions for the improvement of health outcomes.
- 2. Development of new, and refine current, approaches to the assessment and monitoring of HL in the community and hospital sectors in Australia and internationally.
- 3. Development and testing of new methods for generating HL interventions within health services such that they become fully implemented (i.e., locally owned, fit for purpose, embedded, cost effective) and fully integrated into service structures and policy.
- 4. Development, testing and implementation of interventions that recognise the HL needs of vulnerable members of society to improve health equity and health outcomes.

Value and benefits

A stipend of \$26,288 per annum tax exempt for 3 years.

Eligibility criteria

• Applicants must meet Deakin's PhD entry requirements, be enrolling full-time and hold an Honours degree (First Class) or a Master's degree with a substantial research component in a
