Regulation 5.2(4) – Revocation of Academic Awards



This regulation is made pursuant to Statute 5.2 – Academic Awards

- 1. Council may revoke an academic award conferred or granted by (or granted with the authority of) the Council, if it is satisfied that the award was improperly obtained by a person as a result of fraud or error.
- 2. Any application for the revocation of an academic award must be directed to the Vice-President Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic).
- 3. The Vice-President Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) will advise the Vice-Chancellor that the application has been received.
- 4. The Vice-Chancellor will then establish a committee to investigate the matter in accordance with the policies and procedures of the University.
- 5. The committee must:
 - (a) inform the holder of the academic award of its findings;
 - (b) report the findings to the Council; and
 - (c) recommend to Council that the award should be revoked, if that is its finding.
- 6. Council's decision whether to revoke the award or not is final.
