Professor Andy Bennett

Prior to his eight years employment at Deakin, Andy worked at universities in Australia, United Kingdom and Europe, including Reader at University of Bristol. At Deakin, Andy has held the position of Head of School and has previously represented his School on the Academic Board; Deakin's representative on the Victorian Centre for Climate Change Adaptation Research; member of the University HDR working party, and has won significant external research funds (>\$4M) for Deakin from engagement with industry and ARC. Andy teaches to first, second and third year students, sits on various national expert panels, is President of the Australasian Society for the Study of Animal Behaviour, is a Fellow of the International Ornithological Union, and has been elected by his national peers to be Congress Convenor for hosting the quadrennial International Ornithological Congress in Melbourne.
