



These scholarships are developed specifically for people who might not otherwise have the opportunity to access higher education – students from disadvantaged financial backgrounds; students from regional and rural backgrounds; students with a disability; mature—age students; and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students.

Deakin's Scholarship Program is supported by a number of valued partners, in addition to the University, who see the importance of helping future Deakin graduates to achieve their best.

THE DIFFERENCE IS DEAKIN

In addition to our valuable industry partnerships, strong research focus, vibrant Campuses and state-of-the-art facilities, students tell us the thing they notice most about Deakin is that it is a supportive and friendly place to study.

Study where you want

- Deakin has four Campuses − in Melbourne at Burwood, Warrnambool on Victoria's southwest coast and two in Geelong, allowing you to choose between metro, regional or rural study environments. You can also study where you live and earn while you learn by taking advantage of our off-campus study options.
- Study around the world for up to 12 months through our overseas study programs.
- Combine your degree with real workplace experience through Deakin's industry placements and internships.

Study how you want

- At Deakin you can study professional awards such as law, accounting or engineering from day one, instead of completing a general degree first.
- Deakin offers flexible delivery through our off-campus study options and a choice of full-time or part-time study, or a combination of both.
- Deakin uses a range of technology to deliver its courses including online resources like podcasts and MP3s.
- Deakin's trimester system allows you to graduate sooner and get a head start on your career. You can commence your degree early, fast-track your degree or complete a three-year bachelors degree in two calendar years. Alternatively, you have the option of studying a part-time load over three trimesters and still graduate with your peers (subject to unit

Study what you want

➡ We have more than 550 undergraduate and 150 postgraduate courses to choose from in a diverse range of fields. We offer traditional courses, such as arts, science and commerce. We have exciting new disciplines such as sport, environment, and nutrition; and professional fields such as architecture, medicine, law, engineering, information technology, nursing, teaching, psychology, business and management.

Study when you want

- You can structure your study to suit your life – choose between full-time, part-time, on or off-campus study.
- ⇒ If you are thinking about deferring, Deakin offers up to 24 months deferral. Our gap year program allows you to network with fellow Deakin students and access student support services. You can also study one or two subjects (on or off campus), allowing you to gain credit and get a head start on your degree.



HOW DO LAPPLY FOR A DEAKIN SCHOLARSHIP?

Scholarships can help offset the costs of university tuition fees while allowing you to focus on your studies. In addition, depending on the course, eligible Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP) students and fee-paying students may obtain a loan via the Higher Education Contribution Scheme-Higher Education Loan Program (HECS-HELP) or respectively through Fee-Higher Education Loan Program (FEE-HELP).

Future undergraduate students

If you apply for your undergraduate course through the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) you will be automatically considered for a range of academic excellence scholarships, provided your application is submitted by the following application closing dates:

VTAC timely applications close: 30 September 2010
 VTAC late applications close: 12 November 2010
 VTAC very late applications close: 10 December 2010.

If you are applying for an access and equity or accommodation scholarship via VTAC you must submit your application using either the online SEAS application form or Scholarship Application via MyInfo on the VTAC web site at www.vtac.edu.au. You may also be required to submit supporting documentation online by the following dates:

- » VTAC SEAS applications close: 8 October 2010
- » VTAC scholarship applications close: 29 October 2010.

Applicants who wish to apply for **Deakin at Your Doorstep Learning and Development Scholarships** need to complete and submit a separate application form to Deakin University's Scholarships Office, visit www.deakin.edu.au/future-students/scholarships.

Future medical school students

Future medical school students will either need to apply directly to Deakin University via the Deakin Applicant Portal available at www.deakin.edu.au/apply or contact the School of Medicine for application details www.deakin.edu.au/hmnbs/medicine/scholarships. Please read each scholarship listing in this guide carefully for instructions on how to apply and relevant closing dates.

Postgraduate and deferred students

Postgraduate students and students who deferred their course offer until 2011 should apply directly to Deakin University via the Deakin Applicant Portal available at www.deakin.edu.au/apply.

Deferrals

While most Deakin courses can be deferred for up to two years, scholarship offers cannot be deferred. You must be enrolled in your Deakin University course in Trimester 1 of the year of offer to be eligible to receive a scholarship.

When do I apply?

Scholarships applications (via VTAC and direct to Deakin) open on **Monday 2 August 2010**.

When do applications close?

There are a number of different closing dates, depending on the type of scholarship you are applying for. Applicants should carefully review the 'Closing Date' section for each scholarship listed in this brochure or visit the Deakin University Scholarships web site for further information at www.deakin.edu.au/future-students/scholarships.

Direct applications to Deakin

If you have applied **directly to Deakin University** for a scholarship, all supporting documentation must be provided by **5 pm**, **Monday 20 December 2010** to:

If supporting documentation is not received, applications cannot be considered.

Please note that scholarships that are paid in cash, apart from Commonwealth scholarships, may not be regarded as exempt income by Centrelink. Applicants should seek further advice from Centrelink (www. centrelink.gov.au) or Department of Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs (www.facsia.gov.au).

Academic excellence scholarships

Deakin University offers a range of prestigious scholarships that recognise and reward students with outstanding academic abilities.

Alfred Deakin Scholarships in Law

The Alfred Deakin Scholarships in Law were introduced in 2001, the centenary of Australian Federation. Alfred Deakin, after whom the University is named, was Australia's second Prime Minister and our first Attorney General. These scholarships are awarded to high-achieving students admitted to the Bachelor of Laws, as a single degree or law component when combined with another degree.

Value

Cash payment of up to \$2800 per year and academic mentor support, subject to academic performance.

Duration

Three to five years (pro-rata).

Number per year Seven

Eligibility

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a future student enrolled in a Bachelor of Laws or a combined Law course in a Commonwealth Supported Place at the Melbourne Campus at Burwood, Geelong Campus at Waurn Ponds or the Warrnambool Campus.

Selection criteria

Academic excellence based on the ATAR achieved.

How to apply

VTAC course applicants are automatically considered for this scholarship. A separate scholarship application form is not required.

Closing date

VTAC timely applications close, 30 September 2010.

Barwon Water Civil Engineering Scholarships

This scholarship, which assists students financially and also offers paid work experience with Barwon Water, is available to Year 12 students entering the Bachelor of Engineering or related combined degree, majoring in the civil engineering stream.

Value

Cash payment or student contributions of up to \$5000 per year.

Duration

Normal duration of the course, four years for a single degree or five years for a related combined degree, subject to satisfactory academic performance.

Number per year

Two

Eligibility

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- an Australian citizen or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a future student (current Year 12 in 2010 in Australia) enrolled full time in the Bachelor of Engineering or related combined degree, majoring in civil engineering in a Commonwealth Supported Place
- » completed secondary school within the Barwon Water catchment area.

Selection criteria

Selection will be based on ATAR (minimum 80) plus an interview.

Special conditions

The successful applicant must also be available to complete paid work experience at Barwon Water during University break(s).

How to apply

Applicants will be required to submit a separate application direct to Deakin's School of Engineering within the Faculty of Science and Technology, in addition to their VTAC course application.

Closing date

31 January 2011.

Academic excellence scholarships

CPG Australia Pty Ltd Civil Engineering Scholarships

This scholarship, which assists students financially and may include paid work experience with CPG Consulting, is available to Year 12 students entering the Bachelor of Engineering or related combined degree, majoring in the civil engineering stream.

Value

Cash payment or student contributions of up to \$5000 per year (single degree) or \$4000 per year (combined degree).

Duration

Normal duration of the course, four years for a single degree or five years for a related combined degree, subject to satisfactory academic performance.

Number per year Four

- » Two scholarships will be awarded to students from the Albury/Wodonga and Shepparton region.
- » Two scholarships will be awarded to students from the Barwon region.

Eligibility

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a future student (current Year 12 in 2010 in Australia) enrolled full time in a majority of on-campus units, in the Bachelor of Engineering or related combined degree, majoring in civil engineering in a Commonwealth Supported Place
- » either a student from the Albury/Wodonga and Shepparton region or the Barwon region.

Selection criteria

Selection will be based on ATAR (minimum 80) plus an interview.

Special conditions

The successful applicant may be provided with the opportunity to complete paid work at CPG Consulting during University break(s).

How to apply

Applicants will be required to submit a separate application directly to Deakin's School of Engineering within the Faculty of Science and Technology, in addition to their VTAC course application.

Closing date 31 January 2011

Deakin Academic Scholarships

If you are a high-achieving student consider applying for one of our academic scholarships to cover your student contribution fees, allowing you to focus on your university studies.

Value

Payment of all student contributions.

Duration

Normal duration of the course, subject to satisfactory academic performance.

Number per year

Three

Eligibility

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- an Australian citizen or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a future student enrolled full time in undergraduate course of study in a Commonwealth Supported Place.

Selection criteria

You must be a top VCE student enrolling full time in an undergraduate degree course at Deakin University in a Commonwealth Supported Place.

Special conditions

You must remain on the same Campus for the duration of the course.

How to apply

VTAC course applicants are automatically considered for this scholarship. A separate scholarship application form is not required.

Closing date

VTAC timely applications close, 30 September 2010.

Deakin at Your Doorstep Learning and Development Scholarships

The Deakin at Your Doorstep Learning and Development Scholarships aim to assist students studying the Associate Degree of Arts, Business and Sciences with the financial costs of further education.

Value

Cash payment of \$1000 per year.

Duration

Two years subject to satisfactory academic performance.

Number per year

One at each Deakin at Your Doorstep delivery site. Please visit www.deakin.edu.au/doorstep for a list of delivery sites.

Eligibility

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- an Australian citizen or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a future student enrolled full time in the Associate Degree of Arts, Business and Sciences in a Commonwealth Supported Place.

Selection criteria

Selection will be based on the following criteria:

- » motivation and commitment to study
- » career aspirations
- » academic achievement and/or related work and community experience.

Special conditions

Payment of this scholarship in the second year will be subject to satisfactory academic progress in the first year.

How to apply

Students will be required to submit a separate application form direct to Deakin's Scholarships Office. Application forms are available from the Deakin University Scholarships web site at www.deakin.edu.au/future-students/scholarships.

Closing date

11 March 2011.

Deakin Four Points by Sheraton Geelong Nursing Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded on the basis of academic excellence to a student entering the Bachelor of Nursing at the Geelong Waterfront Campus.

Value

Payment of student contributions of up to the value of \$3500 per year.

Duration

Three years

Number per year One

Eligibility

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- an Australian citizen or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a future full-time student undertaking the Bachelor of Nursing at the Geelong Waterfront Campus in a Commonwealth Supported Place.

Selection criteria

Academic excellence

How to apply

VTAC course applicants are automatically considered for this scholarship. A separate scholarship application form is not required.

Closing date

VTAC timely applications close, 30 September 2010.

Deakin University International Baccalaureate (IB) Excellence Scholarship

If you are a high-achieving IB graduate in 2010, consider applying for the Deakin University International Baccalaureate (IB) Excellence Scholarship. This scholarship demonstrates Deakin's commitment to continuing education and the recognition of academic excellence.

Value

Cash payment of \$3000 per year.

Duration

Normal duration of the course.

Number per year One

Eligibility

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a future student student enrolled in an undergraduate course at Deakin University, who completed an IB diploma in 2010.

Selection Criteria

Awarded to the student with the highest IB diploma score from 2010.

How to apply

VTAC course applicants will automatically be considered for this scholarship. A separate application form is not required.

Closing Date

VTAC timely applications close, 30 September 2010.

Studying Bachelor of Engineering (Engineering Scholars Program), Geelong Campus at Waurn Ponds

Recipient of Barwon Water Civil Engineering Scholarship

Karl was awarded a Barwon Water Civil Engineering Scholarship after achieving an ATAR of 89.70 in his final year at Christian College in Geelong. He receives an annual scholarship of \$5000 for the duration of his course and the opportunity to undertake paid work experience at Barwon Water over the summer break.

Wanting to stay in the area and enjoy a coastal lifestyle, Deakin was a logical



choice for Karl who liked the friendly, semi-rural feel of the Campus and the fact that civil engineering is offered.

'Work experience at Barwon Water will build on the knowledge and experience that I already have. I'm really looking forward to it. It will definitely be worthwhile and rewarding,' he says.

Academic excellence scholarships

Dean's Scholars Program – Commerce

The Dean's Scholars Program provides prestigious scholarships in the Bachelor of Commerce at the Melbourne Campus at Burwood. This flexible, broadly-based business degree provides career opportunities in virtually every area of business and government. As a Dean's Scholar you are provided with an academic mentor and have the opportunity to accelerate your program and prepare for advanced/honours work.

Value

Cash payment of up to \$2800 per year and academic mentor support, subject to academic performance.

Duration

Three years (pro-rata). As a Dean's Scholar you may extend your scholarship if enrolling in the Bachelor of Commerce (Honours).

Number per year Up to seven

Eligibility

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a future student (current Year 12) enrolled in a Bachelor of Commerce degree in a Commonwealth Supported Place at the Melbourne Campus at Burwood.

Selection criteria

Academic excellence based on the ATAR achieved.

How to apply

Students who list the Deakin Commerce (Dean's Scholars Program) on their VTAC course application will automatically be considered for this scholarship.

Closing date

VTAC timely applications close, 30 September 2010.

Dean's Scholarships in Commerce

The Dean's Scholarships in Commerce are offered in the Bachelor of Commerce at the Geelong Campus at Waurn Ponds and the Warrnambool Campus, and provide a prestigious scholarship and an academic mentor or three years.

Value

Cash payment of up to \$2800 per year and academic mentor support, subject to academic performance.

Duration

Three years (pro-rata).

Number per year Up to four

Eligibility

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- an Australian citizen or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a future student (current Year 12) enrolled in a Bachelor of Commerce degree in a Commonwealth Supported Place at the Geelong Campus at Waurn Ponds or the Warrnambool Campus.

Selection criteria

Academic excellence based on the ATAR achieved.

How to apply

VTAC course applicants are automatically considered for this scholarship. A separate scholarship application form is not required.

Closing date

VTAC timely applications close, 30 September 2010.

Dean's Scholars Program – Science and Technology Academic Scholarships for High Achievers

The Dean's Scholars Program aims to recognise, reward and nurture high-achieving students. Up to five scholarships will be awarded annually across the Faculty of Science and Technology in Architecture and Construction Management, Environmental Science, Engineering, Information Technology, Science, Biomedical Science, Biological Science, and Forensic Science.



Other scholarships available for future Deakin students

In addition to the scholarships listed in this guide, there are a number of other scholarships available for future Deakin students including Commonwealth scholarships and external scholarships.

Commonwealth scholarships

New scholarships for students from April 2010

The Australian Government is changing student income support – Youth Allowance, Austudy and ABSTUDY – to create a fairer system for more students and to ensure increased support for those who need it most. The changes will particularly benefit students from low socio-economic backgrounds and students who have to move away from home to study, including rural and regional students.

From April 2010, Centrelink will pay two new scholarships to students in higher education to assist with the costs of studying and living away from home. You don't need to apply for these scholarships. They will be paid automatically to eligible students.

The new Student Start-up Scholarship available through Centrelink

The new Student Start-Up Scholarship will be paid to eligible Youth Allowance, ABSTUDY (Living Allowance) or Austudy students undertaking a qualifying higher education course, not already in receipt of a Commonwealth Education Costs Scholarship or National Priority Scholarship.

The Student Start-up Scholarship pays \$650 (in 2010) for each six months of eligible study. This amount will increase to \$1064 (indexed) for each six months of eligible study from 2011. Payments are made through Centrelink at the beginning of each semester (Trimesters 1 and 2 at Deakin) to help with the up-front costs of studying, such as textbooks and specialised equipment. Eligible students will still receive the full amount of the Student Start-up Scholarship, even if they are not on the maximum payment rate from Centrelink.

The new Relocation Scholarship available through Centrelink

The new Relocation Scholarship will be paid to eligible dependent Youth Allowance (living away from home rate) and ABSTUDY (Living Allowance) students undertaking a qualifying higher education course, not already in receipt of a Commonwealth Accommodation Scholarship or National Accommodation Scholarship, who need to live away from home to undertake full-time higher education. Some independent students may also be eligible.

The Relocation Scholarship provides students with a lump-sum payment of \$4000 (indexed) when they first move away from home to commence study and another \$1000 (indexed) in each year of study after that. These payments will help with the costs of setting up a new place to live.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Can I defer my course offer and keep my scholarship offer?

No, your scholarship offer is conditional on you being actively enrolled. You are not able to defer your course offer and retain your scholarship offer

Can I defer my scholarship when I intermit my course?

The rules governing each of the scholarships offered by the Deakin Scholarships Office are different and not all scholarships can be deferred. We recommend that you contact the Scholarships Office (scholarships@deakin.edu.au) to confirm your circumstances. For more information please refer to www.deakin.edu.au/current-students/study-information/scholarships/deferring-scholarships.

How many scholarships can I apply for?

You can apply for as many scholarships as you like. All scholarships have their own eligibility conditions. You should ensure you read the conditions for each scholarship before making an application. We encourage you to apply for as many scholarships as you can. Each of your scholarship applications will be reviewed separately and confirmed for any incompatibility prior to making an offer.

Can I hold more than one scholarship?

Whether you will be awarded more than one scholarship depends on varying factors. Some scholarships cannot be held concurrently. Your scholarship applications will be reviewed separately and confirmed for any incompatibility prior to making an offer.

How are scholarships selected?

Each scholarship has its own selection criteria. Deakin aims for transparency in this selection process by detailing the selection criteria for each scholarship in both this Scholarships Guide and on our web site. The applicant(s) that best meet the criteria will be offered the scholarship, provided there are no incompatibilities with other scholarship(s) currently held.



I've submitted a scholarship application, what documentation do I need to supply?

When applying directly for a scholarship via the Deakin Applicant Portal (www.deakin.edu.au/apply) you will be asked to provide specific documentation to the Deakin University Scholarships Office in support of your application.

For access and equity scholarships you will generally be asked to confirm your financial circumstances either through a current Centrelink statement (Family Tax Benefit statements are not accepted) or a current Tax Assessment Notice issued by the Australia Tax Office (ATO) once you have submitted a tax return.

I am thinking about changing my course enrolment, will this affect my scholarship?

Some scholarships are offered based on the course you are enrolled in. If you change your course this may affect your scholarship. You should discuss your intentions with the Scholarships Office (scholarships@deakin.edu.au) to confirm your circumstances and to ensure that you are still eligible to receive your scholarship.

Are there any scholarships that help pay for my accommodation costs at a Deakin residence?

Yes, Deakin University offers several scholarships which help with the costs associated with living in a Deakin residence. For further information please refer to www.deakin.edu.au/future-students/ scholarships/accommodation-scholarships.

Can I transfer my scholarship if I enrol at another university?

No, all scholarships offered by Deakin University are subject to you being enrolled with Deakin University.

Is my scholarship taxable?

Do I need to tell Centrelink about my scholarship?

KEY TERMS

Associate Degree

As part of the Deakin at Your Doorstep initiative the Associate Degree of Arts Business and Sciences is a two-year, full-time (or part-time equivalent) program designed for students who would benefit from a supported entry to tertiary study. The degree course structure provides flexible pathways into tertiary education, and can be used as a guaranteed pathway into a range of Deakin bachelors degrees.

Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR)

The comparative percentile ranking for students in their final year of secondary school in Australia.

Bachelors degree

An undergraduate award. Normally the first university degree undertaken.

Clearly-in ATAR

The ATAR most school-leaver applicants need to achieve to be offered a Commonwealth Supported Place in a particular course.

Combined course

An approved combination of courses, undertaken simultaneously, which leads to the conferral of two awards e.g. Bachelor of Arts/Bachelor of Laws. This means students can complete two degrees in less time than it would normally take to complete the degrees separately.

Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP)

A university place for which the Australian Government makes a contribution towards the cost of a student's education.

Credit point

Students must complete a specified number of credit points before being eligible to obtain their degree. The number of credit points required varies from course to course. One credit point represents one-quarter of a full-time student's normal workload during a trimester.

Current student

Any student who has enrolled and started their undergraduate, honours, medical or postgraduate degree.

Deferment

The approved postponement of study for a specified period, prior to the first enrolment in a course.

Faculty

An organisational division within a university; for example, the Faculty of Arts and Education is one of four Faculties at Deakin University. Within each Faculty are several schools, i.e. the School of Law is within the Faculty of Business and Law.

Fee-Higher Education Loan Program (FEE-HELP)

A loan scheme for Fee-Paying Place (FPP) students, repayable through the Australian taxation system once your annual income exceeds the minimum threshold for repayment.

Future student

Any student entering the first year of an undergraduate, honours, medical or postgraduate degree.

Graduate entry

A course that requires completion of a prior undergraduate degree for entry. Deakin's Bachelor of Medicine Bachelor of Surgery is a graduate-entry course.

Higher Education Contribution Scheme-Higher Education Loan Program (HECS-HELP)

A loan scheme that helps eligible Commonwealth supported students pay for tuition costs.

Postgraduate degree

Courses of study beyond bachelors level, including graduate certificates, graduate diplomas, masters and research degrees. Eligibility for entry to a postgraduate course normally requires a completed undergraduate degree.

Prerequisite

Subject(s) which must be successfully completed, to be considered for selection into a course.

Student contributions

The amount Commonwealth supported students contribute for each unit of study.

Trimester

A method of organising the academic year into three 12-week teaching periods. Trimester 3 is offered as an optional additional trimester between November and February each year.

Undergraduate

An undergraduate student is someone studying for their first degree.

Init

A university subject or unit is normally one or two trimesters long and may have a value ranging from 1 to 4 credit points.


Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC)

Centralised admissions centre for most undergraduate university and TAFE or equivalent courses in Victoria.

Weighted Average Mark (WAM)

The Weighted Average Mark (WAM) is calculated by multiplying the mark obtained for each relevant result, by the units of credit of the particular course, adding up the products and dividing by the total number of units of credit for the relevant courses.
