

MASTER OF CLINICAL LEADERSHIP RESIDENTIALS

Master of Clinical Leadership Residentials

A key feature of the Master of Clinical Leadership are the three residential programs.

Each 5 day program has a different theme – each of vital importance to the effectiveness of the clinical leader.

- HME701 deals with clinical leadership in the context of the Health System and the broader health system's strategy
- HME702 deals with clinical leadership in the context of the structural unit of healthcare, the health care organisation
- HME703 deals with clinical leadership in the context of the functional unit of healthcare, the care delivery system, with a particular emphasis on leadership for care improvement.

Students undertaking the residential programs will spend 5 days with fellow students and a high calibre faculty drawn from across the Australian and where possible, international health systems.

Faculty will be working at the cutting edge of health system design, delivery and research, and will have a particular interest in or emphasis on clinical leadership for change.

The residentials will provide a unique opportunity for students to engage with colleagues and with faculty in an informal environment with an emphasis on individual and group based learning.

A group based task will be set during the residential and student groups will present to colleagues at the end of the week. The task will emphasise a clinical leadership issue which students will be expected to understand through research and prior experience.

The draft program for the residentials will be released at the commencement of the trimester.

Programs will remain in draft until close to the time of the residential (reflecting the requirement to have an adaptable program given faculty needs).

Costings for the residential programs will include tuition, meals and accommodation when residentials are held at the Deakin Management Centre and tuition and some meals when held elsewhere.
