You may also be required to submit supporting documentation online.

VTAC applicants who wish to apply for Deakin Academic Scholarships and The George Alexander Foundation Scholarships must apply directly to Deakin University using the online form located at www.deakin.edu.au/future-students/scholarships/how-to-apply.

Commencing medical students and students who deferred their course offer until 2010 should also apply using the online form located at www.deakin.edu.au/future-students/scholarships/how-to-apply.


Continuing Deakin students and deferrals

Deakin University has a number of prestigious scholarships that recognise and reward students with outstanding academic abilities. These generous scholarships pay some or all student contributions associated with a course.

Commencing students

The following scholarships are available for students beginning their studies at Deakin University in 2010.

ALFRED DEAKIN SCHOLARSHIPS IN LAW

The Alfred Deakin Scholarships in Law were introduced in 2001, the centenary of Australian Federation. Alfred Deakin, after whom the University is named, was Australia's second Prime Minister and our first Attorney General. A small number of these elite scholarships are awarded to high achieving students admitted to the Bachelor of Laws, as a single degree or law component when combined with another degree.

VALUE
Cash payment of up to \$2000 per year and academic mentor support, subject to academic performance.

DURATION
Three to five years (pro-rata).

ELIGIBILITY
To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a commencing student enrolled in Bachelor of Laws or a combined law course in a Commonwealth Supported Place at the Melbourne Campus at Burwood, Geelong Campus at Warrnambool or the Warrnambool Campus.

SELECTION CRITERIA
Academic excellence based on the ENTER achieved.

Normal VTAC entry. No separate application form required. For details please see the Deakin University Scholarships web site at www.deakin.edu.au/future-students/scholarships.

DEAKIN ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIPS

Outstanding results are highly valued at Deakin – if this is you, apply for one of our academic scholarships.

Normal duration of the course subject to satisfactory academic performance.

Three

ELIGIBILITY
To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » undertaking an undergraduate course of study in a Commonwealth Supported Place.

SELECTION CRITERIA
You must be a top VCE student enrolling full time in an undergraduate degree course at Deakin in a Commonwealth Supported Place.

RETENTION
You must remain on the same Campus for the duration of the course.

DEAN'S SCHOLARS PROGRAM – COMMERCE

The Dean's Scholars Program provides prestigious scholarships in the Bachelor of Commerce, a flexible, broadly based business degree which provides career opportunities in virtually every area of business and government. The Dean's Scholars are provided with an academic mentor and have the opportunity to accelerate their program and prepare for advanced/honours work. The Dean's Scholars may extend their scholarship if enrolling in the Bachelor of Commerce (Honours).

VALUE
Cash payment of up to \$2800 per year and academic mentor support, subject to academic performance.

DURATION
Three years (pro-rata).

ELIGIBILITY
To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a commencing student (current Year 12) enrolled in commerce in a Commonwealth Supported Place at the Melbourne Campus at Burwood.

SELECTION CRITERIA
Academic excellence based on the ENTER achieved.

DEAN'S SCHOLARSHIPS IN COMMERCE

Similar to the Dean's Scholars Program offered in Melbourne, the Dean's Scholarships are offered in the Bachelor of Commerce at the Geelong Campus at Warrnambool and the Warrnambool Campus, and provide a prestigious scholarship and an academic mentor to guide you for three years.

VALUE
Cash payment of up to \$2800 per year, and academic mentor support, subject to academic performance.

DURATION
Three years (pro-rata).

ELIGIBILITY
To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian citizen or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a commencing student (current Year 12) enrolled in commerce in a Commonwealth Supported Place at the Geelong Campus at Warrnambool or the Warrnambool Campus.

SELECTION CRITERIA
Academic excellence based on the ENTER achieved.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIPS

DEAN'S SCHOLARS PROGRAM – SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS FOR HIGH ACHIEVERS

The Dean's Scholars Program aims to recognise, reward and nurture high achieving students. Up to five scholarships will be awarded annually across the Faculty of Science and Technology in architecture and construction management, property and real estate, environmental science, engineering, information technology, science, biomedical science, biological science, and forensic science.

VALUE

Cash payment of up to \$5000 per year and academic mentor support.

DURATION

Three years

NUMBER PER YEAR

Up to five

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian or New Zealand citizen or holder of an Australian permanent resident visa
- » recently completed Year 12 in Australia.

SELECTION CRITERIA

- » be enrolling in one of the undergraduate courses offered by the Faculty of Science and Technology at Deakin University
- » achieve a minimum ENTER of 90.00 or interstate equivalent
- » students will be ineligible for the Dean's Scholars Program if they have been awarded a Deakin Academic Scholarship.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this scholarship you must be:

- » an Australian or New Zealand citizen or holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- » a commencing student (current Year 12 in 2009 in Australia) enrolled full time in the Bachelor of Engineering or related combined degree, majoring in civil engineering
- » completed secondary school within the Barwon Water catchment area.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Academic excellence and interview.

Now that I have completed my honours year, I have decided to continue studying and complete a PhD in one of the areas identified from my honours research. This has all been possible because of the generosity of Lindsay Fox.

Aaron grew up in the small country town of Enfield, before moving to Ross Creek, about 20 minutes south-west of Ballarat. He knew he wanted to study law and was prepared to go anywhere, but wasn't in the best financial situation. He credits his school careers counsellor for helping him apply for equity and access entry, which secured him an accommodation scholarship at Deakin.

'Deakin stood out amongst other universities because, although I was prepared to move to Melbourne if necessary, the Geelong Campus was more within my comfort zone in terms of its regional location and size,' says Aaron.

'From my personal experience, one of the main issues I faced in looking for a place to study and live was affordability. University can become quite expensive with the cost of accommodation, books and day-to-day living expenses. Consequently, it is important to find a location where accommodation is affordable, in terms of being inclusive of utilities and also being in close proximity to the University, to minimise travel expenses.'

'Scholarships make university affordable, especially for those who are financially independent of their parents,' he says. 'Furthermore, as one of my scholarships pays all student contributions, I will not have a HECS debt at the end of my course, and can thus consider options such as postgraduate study or overseas travel without worrying about the financial implications down the track.'

INDIGENOUS SCHOLARSHIPS

There are a number of scholarships and bursaries available to assist Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students with their student contribution costs.

KEY TERMS

BACHELORS DEGREE

An undergraduate award. Normally the first university degree undertaken.

CLEARLY-IN ENTER

The ENTER most school-leaver applicants need to achieve to be offered a Commonwealth Supported Place in a particular course.

COMBINED COURSES

An approved combination of courses, undertaken simultaneously, which leads to the conferral of two awards e.g. Bachelor of Arts/Bachelor of Laws. This means students can complete two degrees in less time than it would normally take to complete the degrees separately.

COMMONWEALTH SUPPORTED PLACE (CSP)

A university place for which the Australian Government makes a contribution towards the cost of a student's education.

CREDIT POINT

Students must complete a specified number of credit points before being eligible to obtain their degree. The number of credit points required varies from course to course. One credit point represents one-quarter of a full-time student's normal workload during a trimester.

DEFERMENT

The approved postponement of study for a specified period, prior to the first enrolment in a course.

EQUIVALENT NATIONAL TERTIARY ENTRANCE RANK (ENTER)

The comparative percentile ranking for students in their final year of secondary school in Australia.

FACULTY

An organisational division within a university; for example, the Faculty of Arts and Education is one of four Faculties at Deakin University. Within each Faculty are several schools, i.e. the School of Law is within the Faculty of Business and Law.

GRADUATE ENTRY

A course that requires completion of a prior undergraduate degree for entry. Deakin's Bachelor of Medicine Bachelor of Surgery is a graduate entry course.

HIGHER EDUCATION CONTRIBUTION SCHEME-HIGHER EDUCATION LOAN PROGRAM (HECS-HELP)

A loan scheme that helps eligible Commonwealth supported students pay for tuition costs.

MAJOR

An approved group of at least 6 credit points of related units that are taken in sequence at each level of a course. In some cases, students can enrol in more than one major sequence.

POSTGRADUATE DEGREE

Courses of study beyond bachelors level, including graduate certificates, graduate diplomas and higher degrees. Eligibility for entry to a postgraduate course normally requires a completed undergraduate degree.

PREREQUISITE

Subject(s) which must be successfully completed, to be considered for selection into a course.

SPECIALISM

A specialised subject stream within a degree, for example, Bachelor of Environmental Science (Marine Biology) indicates a marine biology specialism within a broader environmental science degree.

STUDENT CONTRIBUTIONS

The amount Commonwealth supported students contribute for each unit of study.

STUDENT FEES

If relevant legislation is enacted by the Australian Government, Deakin University is likely to charge a student fee for services. Scholarships involving contribution payments will not cover this fee, however if a scholarship involves a cash payment, students may choose to put it towards the new student fee.

TRIMESTER

A method of organising the academic year into three 12-week teaching periods. Deakin introduced the trimester system in 2009, with Trimester 3 to be offered as an optional additional trimester between November and February each year.

UNDERGRADUATE

An undergraduate student is someone studying for their first degree.

UNIT

A university subject or unit is normally one or two trimesters long and may have a value ranging from 1 to 4 credit points.

VICTORIAN TERTIARY ADMISSIONS CENTRE (VTAC)

Centralised admissions centre for most undergraduate university and TAFE or equivalent courses in Victoria.

WEIGHTED AVERAGE MARK (WAM)

The weighted average mark (WAM) is calculated by multiplying the mark obtained for each relevant result, by the units of credit of the particular course, adding up the products and dividing by the total number of units of credit for the relevant courses.
