The course offers flexible learning opportunities catering for school leavers, mature age students and full-time employees.

A capstone unit in your final year has you working in multi-disciplinary teams. It's a great opportunity to practise and develop professional skills such as teamwork, communication, negotiation, conflict resolution, decision-making, problem solving and leadership.

These practical, experiential learning opportunities help you integrate your knowledge, consolidate skills, tackle real problems, and reflect on the experience to develop your professional identity.

COURSE STRUCTURE

The Bachelor of Management is a 24 credit point degree consisting of 8 credit points of core foundation units, 4 credit points of core Personal Edge units, at least 1 credit point of work integrated learning and a 1 credit point capstone unit. Students also take 6 credit points from a major sequence, and four unspecified elective units that may be chosen from any faculty, including further specific work integrated learning units.

Construction Management
