Course structure

Students can choose elective units from any area across the University according to their own interests and aspirations, thus enhancing the distinctiveness of their degree.

Throughout the degree you will explore studies in property management, business law, sustainable construction, property investment, advanced property development, building safety, contract administration, project management, building appraisal and undertake a construction-related project.
