Regulation 2.4(5) – Alfred Deakin Research Institute



This Regulation is made pursuant to Statute 2.4 – *University Institutes*.

- 1. There shall be an institute known as the Alfred Deakin Research Institute.
- 2. The objects of the Institute are to:
 - (a) generate and promote research that informs public debate and public policy, and that addresses problems of local, national and international importance stimulates public debate and informs public policy;
 - (b) act as a catalyst for the development and promotion of cross-disciplinary and problem oriented approaches to research founded in the humanities, social sciences, education, law and communication studies and education;
 - (c) <u>contribute to research that is regionally relevant and that has important social benefits,</u> particularly through the establishment of internal and external strategic partnershipscreate collaborative research relationships within Deakin University and with external partners, including government entities;
 - (d) build the University's research capacity and reputation by enabling and showcasing research academic teams, ideas and research initiatives outcomes relevant to the communities served by the University; and
 - (e) support the continued development of Deakin University's research profile and performance through leadership, <u>and</u> mentoring as well as through research<u>and</u> training of higher degree by research students..; and

contribute to research that is regionally relevant and that has important social benefits, particularly through the establishment of strategic partnership arrangements.

- 3. The Institute shall have an Advisory Board.
- 4. The composition and terms of reference of the Advisory Board shall be established by the Vice-Chancellor.
- 5. The Advisory Board shall:
 - (a) provide advice to the <u>Pprincipal OefficerDirector</u> in relation to the activities of the Institute as specified in section 2; and
 - (b) meet at least two times in each year.
- 6. The Vice-Chancellor shall appoint a <u>Pprincipal OefficerDirector</u> of the Institute on such terms and conditions as he or she sees fit.
- 7. The Council may grant to the <u>Pprincipal OofficerDirector</u> the rank and title of Professor.
- 8. The <u>Perincipal Oefficer</u>Director shall:
 - (a) report to the- Principal Officer of the Faculty of Arts and Education and the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research); and
 - (b) within three months after 31 December in each year, present to the Advisory Board annual

report of the activities of the Institute for the preceding 12 months, including a full report on the financial affairs of the Institute, together with any other statement or information required by the Advisory Board.

- 9. The Advisory Board shall consider the report of the <u>Pprincipal OofficerDirector</u> as specified in section 8(b), and shall:
 - (a) submit the report to the Vice-Chancellor as soon as practicable; and
 - (b) forward it to the Academic Board for noting;

together with any comments, as it sees fit.

- 10. The Vice-Chancellor shall instigate a review of the Institute three years from the date of its establishment and triennially thereafter, or upon such other occasions as may be determined by the Vice-Chancellor.
- 141.10. If the Vice-Chancellor concludes that the Institute is not fulfilling its objectives or ceases to be aligned to the strategic directions of the University, the Vice-Chancellor may recommend to Council that the Institute be discontinued or may recommend changes to this Regulation.
