WHAT IS THE MENTORING AND TUTORING PROGRAM?

The Mentoring and Tutoring Program is a Deakin University initiative that sees Deakin students from a range of faculties act as mentors to secondary school students. The program is aimed at improving secondary school students' learning through mentoring and tutoring, and building their aspirations towards higher education. It has the added benefit of developing Deakin students' skills and enabling them to establish contacts with school communities.

WHAT DOES THE PROGRAM INVOLVE?

Deakin mentors meet regularly with the secondary school students in their schools, during school hours, over a two to three year period. The mentoring sessions are held in either one-on-one or small group environments. As well as having regular contact with Deakin staff, the mentors are supervised by a school-appointed coordinator and receive ongoing training. They are required to undertake a Working with Children Check prior to commencing the program.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF THE PROGRAM?

- Develops confidence, communication and social skills.
- Increases secondary school students' interest in learning and develops their skills for learning.
- Enables Deakin students to act as role models and gain experience in mentoring and tutoring.


WHAT DO SCHOOL COORDINATORS SAY ABOUT THE PROGRAM?
