Deakin University

Regulation 3.1(4) - The Vice-Presidents



This regulation is made pursuant to Statute 3.1 – Officers and Staff of the University.

- 1. Council may appoint one or more persons to the office of Vice-President.
- 2. The A Vice-President shall:
 - (a) have such powers, functions and duties as are conferred or imposed by the university statutes and university regulations of the University and as are delegated by notice in writing to him or her by the Council or the Vice-Chancellor;
 - (b) be responsible for the good governance of the academic related administrative, professional and academic support services of the University, subject to the general superintendence of the Vice-Chancellor; and
 - be assisted by such other persons as Council or the Vice-Chancellor may determine. Such persons shall be responsible to the Vice-President Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) and shall perform such duties as may be determined from time to time; and
 - resign from such other positions and relinquish such other responsibilities as directed by the Vice-Chancellor upon taking up the duties of office.
- 3. The A Vice-President may:
 - (a) by notice in writing, delegate any or all of the powers, functions and duties conferred or imposed on him or her by any <u>university</u> Sstatute or <u>university</u> regulation (other than this power of delegation) to any person or committee of persons as he or she may think fit, and that notice shall be sufficient authority for that person or that committee of persons to exercise the powers, functions and duties so delegated; and
 - (b) at any time, and from time to time, by notice in writing, vary or revoke a delegation made by him or her under this section.
- 4. If the a Vice-President proposes to be absent from the University for a period:
 - (a) of less than or equal to <u>3three</u> months, the Vice-Chancellor may, by notice in writing, nominate an <u>Acting-Interim</u> Vice-President to act in his or her place during that absence; or
 - (b) of more than <u>3three</u> months, Council may, on the advice of the Vice-Chancellor, appoint an <u>Acting-Interim</u> Vice-President to act in his or her place during that absence.
- 5. The Vice-Chancellor may appoint an Acting Interim Vice-President to act:
 - (a) during any vacancy in the office of a Vice-President; or
 - (b) during any inability of a Vice-President to act, other than as described in section 4.
- 6. A person nominated or appointed pursuant to sections 4 or 5 shall, during the absence of the that Vice-President referred to therein, exercise all powers, carry out all the functions and be subject to the duties of the office of that Vice-President.
