



TEACHING AND LEARNING COMMITTEE

Terms of Reference

The role of the Teaching and Learning Committee is to:

1. To provide vision, leadership and support within the Faculty to advance learning in respect to student experience and staff engagement in teaching and the scholarship of teaching and learning.
2. To advise the Faculty Board on matters of University teaching and learning policy and monitor Faculty compliance with University policy and practice.
3. To recommend to the Faculty Board teaching and learning guidelines aligned with University policy and practice and to disseminate these across the Faculty.
To review and approve major course review reports.
4. To advise the Faculty Board on professional development activities for all Faculty academic staff in order to promote teaching and learning of the highest quality.
5. To provide leadership and support for staff in developing innovative applications for Faculty, University and national research grant and project opportunities in teaching and learning.
6. To co-ordinate the development and implementation of best practice in the use of information technology to positively impact on learning.
7. To foster cross-Faculty, department and discipline developments in teaching and learning, curricula and course delivery including assessment regimes and the discussion of innovations in teaching and learning and to communicate these initiatives across the Faculty and the University.
8. To research and evaluate Faculty teaching practices that are benchmarked against national and international best practice standards and aligned with University initiatives and to recommend a schedule of introduction to ensure continuous quality improvement.
