INFORMATION FOR EMPLOYERS



The Faculty of Science, Engineering and Built Environment Work Integrated Learning (WIL) Program aims to give students the opportunity to experience working in a work place environment to prepare them for their future careers.

As an organisation, you have the opportunity to offer or accept a placement and help students learn from professional in a graduate-level context helping develop their skills and knowledge in preparation for graduate employment.

At the conclusion of a WIL placement, you are able to retain the student in a part-time capacity through direct employment or a cadetship. You can also explore employing the student after they complete their studies in a graduate role.

WIL placements are an excellent and rewarding opportunity for your organisation. The Faculty offers the following placement opportunities:

All above placement options are offered in the three trimesters, as follows:

Trimester 1 (March to June), Trimester 2 (July to October), Trimester 3 (November to February)

There are <u>other placement options available</u> to students depending on their courses. These are called internships, professional practice and/or work experience. In most cases they are core units and are managed by the Schools.

Student selection

Admission to the WIL program is selective. The Faculty advertises the WIL roles to students enrolled in appropriate courses and shortlists the students who have submitted an application. An application consists of a resume, a cover letter and in some cases, selection criteria.

The selection process follows a typical graduate recruitment format with organisations being able to interview short-listed applicants before making a final decision.

Insurance

All students who undertake a WIL placement are covered by Deakin University's Personal Accident Insurance scheme. This includes any injuries that they may receive or occur. It also covers public liability and professional indemnity for any damage/injuries that they may cause.

Host organisation sponsorship

Whilst on placement, students are not considered to be on the organisation's payroll. Contributions are likely to be tax deductable. Please contact the Program Manager to discuss.

Hosts can also pay students directly by employing them.

Assessment

The WIL program aims to give students the opportunity to develop skills relevant to their discipline and receive broad exposure and understanding to available career outcomes.

WIL also aims to teach students to manage their own professional development through a cyclical process of self-assessment, goal setting, evaluation and reflection.

To meet these, students must complete a series of assessments before, during and after the placement. The student is solely responsible for this work.

All WIL students are assigned an academic supervisor by Deakin University. The academic supervisor will be available to assist the student with any issues that may arise.
