Iraq and the Challenges for Human Rights One Day Symposium

The Symposium, organized by the Australian Iraqi Forum (AIF) and the Centre for Citizenship and Human Rights at Deakin University, seeks to expose the atrocities committed against the Iraqi people by the former regime and human rights issues facing Iraq today. The Conference will explore the mechanisms needed to guarantee human rights in the building of the new Iraq. It also seeks, through a panel discussion, to explore the situation of Iraqi refugees in Australia, including the current legal issues facing many refugees. Prominent speakers from Iraq, UK and Australia will present detailed analyses of various human rights issues, including a historical perspective, constitutional human rights guarantees in the building of the new Iraq, women's empowerment and the treatment of refugees.

Corporate Citizenship Research Unit

The CCRU is currently exploring the possibility of establishing an office at the Geelong campus in order to involve researchers, particularly in communication, public relations and journalism, in a more regional focus on business/society relations research from a social, communication and cultural perspective. Dr Nina Weerakoddy, the current Early Career Research Fellow in the CCRU, is co-ordinating this development, and, following an enthusiastic meeting at Geelong last week, it is hoped that an office with a dedicated research assistant and resources will soon be established.

INVITATION TO PARTICIPATE IN THE ICG

The Executive invites both expressions of interest in the work of the ICG and applications from staff for support with relevant research projects over the next 3 months.

Background

The ICG has two research fellows to enhance the Faculty's efforts on grants, consultancies and publications in the area of *Citizenship and Globalisation*. To facilitate staff requests for work to be done by the research fellows, the ICG executive has established the following procedures and criteria for approving projects.

Procedures

All project work by the Research Fellows is to be approved by the ICG Executive.

- ❖ All Academic members of the faculty staff would be eligible to apply.
- ❖ Each applicant to submit to the Chair of the ICG:
 - (a) one page project application form, and
 - (b) the applicant (s)'s CV (s),
- ❖ Project proposals would then be submitted to the Executive, which would, where necessary, rank them on merit, according to the following criteria.

Project Criteria

Proposals ought to be oriented towards a substantial project in the general area of Citizenship and Globalisation, that requires work on :

- ❖ Organising, preparing and writing applications for grants, tenders or consultancies, including preliminary research for this purpose.
- ❖ Publication activity, such as writing, editorial and indexing services in the production of books, book chapters or refereed articles.
- ❖ Conference or workshop organization leading to refereed publications or commercially published books.
- ❖ Where ongoing research projects require the service of a Research Fellow, and research finance (e.g. through an ARC grant) is already available, such projects would have to reimburse the ICG for the time allocated to the Research Fellow.

Proposals seeking only basic research assistance, such as for library searches and photocopying, will not be approved.

- ❖ *Prospective applicants are encouraged to consult with the Chair of the ICG about the relevance and suitability of the project before submitting a proposal.*
- ❖ *Applications should be submitted by Thursday 14th October 2004.*
