Costs:

Students are required to pay for the overseas component of the program in addition to relevant unit fees. The travel component has an estimated cost of \$7,500. **Students who apply before 7th September 2012 will be eligible for a \$500 Faculty grant.**

What's included:

Flights, rail tickets, transfers and accommodation (twin share, three star hotels (extra charges apply if a single room* is required), breakfasts, welcome and farewell dinners, travel and medical insurance (provided by Deakin University through its insurer AHI at no cost to individual students), selected tours in various cities, airport taxes and fuel surcharges, tips and a group windcheater.

*If you require a single room, please advise Reho immediately. A single room for the duration of the tour will cost up to \$1,600 extra)

Not included:

Visas costs (if required), daily personal costs such as meals (other than breakfasts and two dinners) and spending money.

Reho Study Tours reserves the right to adjust or increase costs in the event of a significant variation in currency exchange or increased fuel surcharges. However Reho Study Tours will do all possible to ensure that the cost does not change.

Health and Vaccinations:

Students should seek medical advice about health requirements and vaccinations for travel to Europe. The Campus Nurse is able to provide initial advice, or go to <http://traveldoctor.com.au/>. You should do this as soon as possible if you have any concerns, but generally travel to Europe does not require any special vaccinations. You might like to ensure you have the flu vaccination.

Visas:

Australian and Singaporean passport holders do not require a visa for any countries visited. If you hold a passport other than from Australia please contact Reho Study Tours for advice as soon as possible, as visa applications can take some time to process.

Safety:

International travel presents a number of challenges and great care is taken by the University to ensure all current issues are taken into account in planning and conducting the tour. The advice provided by the Australian Government on it's Smart Traveler website (<http://www.smartraveller.gov.au/>) is a primary source of information as well as the resources and experience of Deakin International.

Quotas:

- Whilst all currently enrolled students of any Australia University are welcome, the Faculty reserves the right to impose quotas on the total number of students accepted on the tour and the mix of students. Issues relating to the mix include; Deakin/non-Deakin, male/female, Australian/International, undergraduate/postgraduate, date of registration (payment of deposit), etc.
- Whilst not-for-credit students are welcome to apply, priority will be given to students enrolled in one of the study tour units.
- There will be a cap of 26 students in total. Additional places may be added at the Faculty's discretion.

Other issues:

- All student accommodation is on a twin-share or triple share basis. Single accommodation may be available but is subject to availability at time of check-in and would be at a higher rate paid directly to the hotel.
- Students making their own travel arrangements (ie. not departing with the main Study Tour Group from Melbourne) will be required to join the Tour Group at the nominated hotel in Frankfurt - details will be provided as required

Travel insurance:

Travel and medical insurance for the full duration of the tour is provided by Deakin University through its insurer Accident and Health International at no cost to individual students.

AHI Assist Service (+61 2 9202 8211) is included in this insurance and is available 24 hours from anywhere in the world for emergency assistance.
