Bachelor of International Studies

A great course for students seeking an international orientation, name of course has changed for next year to reflect slight change in structure of course.

Students **must** make a commitment to a period of study at an overseas university, internship at an international organisation or participation in an in-country language program.

- develop a systematic understanding of other countries and societies, as well as cross-cultural competencies, through an internationally oriented curriculum
- Combine studies with travel and still gain credits towards your degree
- Internships with international organisations, non-government organisations, charities and international media agencies
- Major sequence options **now** include: Arabic; Chinese; History; Indonesian; Italian; International Relations; Middle Eastern Studies; Politics and Policy.



Bachelor of Criminology*

- Practical, professional training which facilitates critical analysis in the fields of policing, security, corrections, crime prevention and community safety, and various paralegal fields.
- Graduates have the ability to engage in debates concerning crime and justice issues. They will also be able to contribute to ongoing learning and reform within the criminal justice system, and contribute to enhancing citizenship and improved quality of life.
- Internship program provides invaluable experience working with the local community.

- Intelligence agencies, such as Transport, Border Protection, National security, International relations, Defence, Private Security Services and Correction services.

Bachelor of Arts (Media and Communication)

- ❑ Core emphasis in new media; new skills, new tasks, visual literacy, critical and creative thinking
- ❑ enables students to graduate with a 'multi-skilled' qualification appropriate for a rapidly evolving area in which skills, careers and job markets are increasingly transient.
- ❑ Develop strong skills in: writing, critical thinking, visual literacy
- ❑ Students will learn about major research and policy debates concerning the various communication industries and integrate practical techniques in communication with a strategic overview of the industry. Major sequences include:
 - ❖ Journalism
 - ❖ Media and Communication
 - ❖ Public Relations
 - ❖ Visual Arts



Bachelor of Arts (Public Relations)

- ❑ Solid grounding in the principles and practice of public relations and communications theory, together with a broader general education in the social sciences and liberal arts.
- ❑ Exposure to a range of models, skills and techniques necessary for the management of public relations in a wide variety of private and public organisations.
- ❑ Students explore the social and behavioural sciences providing an understanding of human and societal behaviour.
- ❑ The course also examines communication research techniques, organisational planning, problem analysis, strategy development for effective communication within and between organisations and their associates, the counselling of management on trends in issues affecting communication policy, and the production of messages, their transmission and the evaluation of their effectiveness.
- ❑ Students have the opportunity to establish links with professionals in the industry through the Public Relations Institute of Australia Young Practitioners' program.
- ❑ The Bachelor of Arts (Public Relations) is accredited by the Public Relations Institute of Australia (PRIA).

Bachelor of Education (Primary)

available at Burwood Geelong and Warrnambool

- ❑ Deakin's Bachelor of Education (Primary) is a highly regarded undergraduate degree which fully prepares students for a career as a primary school teacher
- ❑ Graduates meet entry requirements of the teaching profession in Australia and qualify to gain employment as primary education teachers in all states and territories of Australia
- ❑ Students will complete a minimum of 80 days supervised school experience over the duration of the course, providing hands-on experience in a classroom setting



Bachelor of Early Childhood Education (BGW)

- ❑ Applicants must have completed a two-year diploma of children's services or equivalent, from a TAFE institution or other approved registered training organisation.
- ❑ In recognition of this prior study, students commence this two-year degree course at level three.
- ❑ Covers the education requirements of young children from birth to five year-olds and will qualify graduates as a teacher in childcare centres, kindergartens and early learning centres.
- ❑ Up to half of all the teaching and learning activities of this course are undertaken in the real context, giving the students the opportunity to meld theory and practice and to become a fully prepared early childhood educator.
- ❑ Level 3 students will complete a minimum of 45 days of supervised professional experience in a range of early childhood settings.
- ❑ Program offered in two experience-based pathways: a rural, community-based program offered through the Geelong Campus at Waurin Ponds and the Warrnambool Campus, and an on-campus, city-based program offered through the Melbourne Campus at Burwood.





Global Education Program

- ❑ Opportunity to travel while still studying
- ❑ Travel grants are available through the university
- ❑ Global Experience is a teaching practicum program for students enrolled in primary and secondary teaching courses. It offers students a diverse range of experiences in educational settings beyond Victoria and Australia.
- ❑ Challenges students to think about, deal with, and appreciate cultural and educational knowledge and/or practices and perspectives different to their own.
- ❑ Students who have the opportunity to participate in the program often claim the experience as the highlight of their pre-service course
- ❑ Recent global opportunities have included: Northern Territory, China, India, Switzerland, Malaysia, Thailand, USA (Texas) and Vanuatu

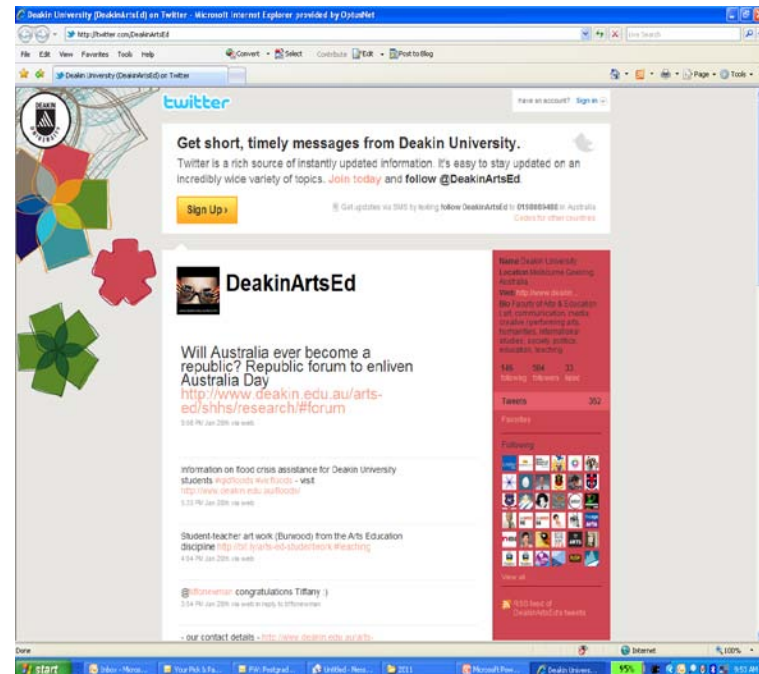
