



Advanced Clinical Nursing in the Adult Patient

The Professional Development Unit (PDU) at Deakin University offers high quality educational modules. These learning packages provide nurses with the opportunity to update their professional skills, support their current practice, take another career direction or seek an alternative entry pathway into higher education.

Learning packages are available in either full (with assessment) or audit (without assessment) form. Each full module is equivalent to 0.5 credit point, and multiples of 1 point may attract Credit for Prior Learning in a Graduate Diploma/Masters degree. Audit learning packages will suit those who wish to gain knowledge but not undertake assessments. Audit learning packages do not attract Credit for Prior Learning. Learning packages are delivered via distance education over a 12-week period in Trimesters 1, 2 and 3 (numbers permitting). Students are able to work at their own pace within this timeframe.

There are two (2) learning packages available in this suite. Participants are encouraged to reflect on their experiences, incorporating theoretical concepts while developing skills and strategies for application in practice.

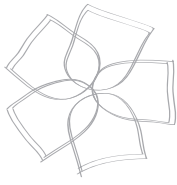
PDU292 Clinical Management

As the acuity of patient care increases and the length of stay decreases in hospitals, it is imperative that registered nurses ensure their level of practice and knowledge is current and of a high standard. These learning packages cover a wide variety of topics that will act as building blocks for further study to deliver safe and effective care of acutely ill patients in several settings.

Learning Package one: Patient assessment

The content of this learning package includes:

- patient assessment skills
- respiratory assessment
- cardiac assessment
- neurological assessment
- renal assessment
- fluid balance and electrolyte balance
- acid base balance
- basic ECG fundamentals



Assessment: Take home examination 100%.

Learning package two: Clinical management

The content of this learning package includes:

- acid base balance
- basic haemodynamic monitoring
- management of respiratory conditions
- management of chest pain
- pharmacology
- pain management

Assessment: Take home examination 100%.

Admission requirements

Registered and enrolled nurses with hospital certificate or undergraduate diploma or degree. Other health professionals will be assessed on an individual basis
