Abstract Submission

Prepare your abstract as a Microsoft Word document using Times New Roman font, 11 point. There is a template on the website.

Your presentation summary must include presentation title, name, organisation, suburb, state and email address (optional) for each presenter, a short biography (50–80 words) for each presenter and a description of the presentation (250–350 words).
