## **Developments 2009**

### **Webpac**

Went live with new website in March 2009. – see [www.catalog.slsa.sa.gov.au](http://www.catalog.slsa.sa.gov.au)  
Site built with extensive use of tabs in the bibliographic record display..  
Reason is that our catalogue is now integrated with non traditional library records for example archival records – many of these contain extensive information making a single display extremely long – these records can be accommodated by hiding the text within specialised tabs.

### **Web Bridge**

Web Bridge is useful supplement to the bibliographic information display of a record in Webpac. It is accessed in the bib record display via a “more information on your topic” button. At the present time we are only offering publicly available sites such Libraries Australia, Picture Australia, Music Australia Google books, Encyclopaedia Britannica and other library catalogues as targets.  
We are currently reviewing the targets within Web Bridge with the aim of making more available.

### **Scoping software**

This was implemented when the new site went live following the integration of our reference databases (South Australiana and Archival) into the main database. Scopes include newspapers and periodicals, images (access to the 60,000 images loaded from the South Australiana database), maps, ephemera and archival records as well as the material readily available on open access.

### **Archiving of order records**

Order records are now archived using the export function in creates list. The record details are exported within a comma delimited ASCII file and are stored onto the corporate archiving server. The advantages of this new method are numerous – eg no intervention by our IT staff, no problem of accessing the material on media staff are not familiar with and ready access to this information by the key staff stake holders

### **III hosting**

Consideration is being given to having our Millennium database hosted remotely e.g. by Innovative, in order to overcome some security and access issues. The III hosting is planned for testing early in 2010

### **Marc Edit.**

Exploring the use of MarcEdit's delimited file import utility to create MARC records. This would allow creation of records from data entered onto an Excel spreadsheet. These are then loaded into the main database using the Data exchange program and a locally written load table.

Would be useful for staff who work from home and do not have Internet access or for our volunteer staff when we may choose not to give them direct access the database via a Millennium client
