BONUS+

UMELB is enthusiastically continuing its participation in the BONUS+ consortium.

In the second year of our membership (Oct 08 – Sept 09), our patrons made 17,811 requests in BONUS+, which resulted in 16,283 loans to us. This makes us the biggest borrower in the group. This represented an 88% increase on the previous year (Oct 07 – Sept 08).

We lent 7,896 items to BONUS+ partners, making us the third highest lender in the group.

ERM

In 2007, a policy decision was made not to populate our catalogue with records for electronic journals, on the assumption that patrons would identify such resources through our federated search tool Metalib / SFX. A variety of factors (including user expectation) have now lead us to add our e-journals back into the catalogue. This has been made possible by using

- the Saksript tool to extract e-journal holdings from SFX
- the MARCIt tool in SFX, which provides CONSER records for many of our e-journals
- ERM

We have begun a streamlined monthly process for maintaining approx. 70,000 e-journal holdings in Millennium. Testing will commence soon to explore strategies for adding e-monograph data into Millennium.

Program Registration

Program Registration has just been installed on our system and we are coming to grips with configuration of this product. It will be available for Semester One 2010.

Server Replacement & Software Plus

Implementation has begun for new hardware for our Millennium production server, which will go live in mid-January 2010. The new system will be maintained under a Software Plus agreement with III who will maintain the operating system as well as the Millennium application.

Circulation Parameters Review

A project has begun to review many of our circulation parameters, which contain much 'historical' data.

Automatic clearing of in transit status

In 2009 we switched on automatic clearing of the in transit item status. This has reduced large amounts of staff handling of material.

Branch refurbishment

Branch refurbishment continues, with significant moving, weeding and temporary closure of collections.
