2. Changes in 2010

2.1 Upgraded training and production databases to Release 2009B

1.1. New features implemented, such as linking of multiple resource records to one licence record, new print template capabilities. New fund code lengths postponed until testing can be done on output for Oracle Financials.

2.2 LibraryThing for Libraries integrated into the catalogue. Tag clouds of user-added content enhance the catalogue record, plus reviews and links to similar items and other editions.

2.3 Requesting via the catalogue went live on October 27. Online requesting replaces old carbon paper stack-request slips for most monographic material and introduces circulation to individual clients. A major library project in conjunction with a requesting implementation service from Innovative. Implementation of new circulation workflows required new ITYPES and location codes, new loan rules and requesting rules, changes to web forms, graphics and options. The training database was refreshed to match production for better testing. New “limit to available” feature and book cart / library bag feature. This is expected to be a huge improvement in client service.

2.4 Purchase order printing transformed using print templates from old non-standard paper using a form printer to a customisable letter to suppliers on plain A4 paper. The template can be changed to suit the supplier and is flexible enough to add in the Library’s corporate identity without ordering new stationery.

2.5 Web Access Management. A number of new databases including JSTOR, Library PressDisplay, OECD iLibrary and the Illustrated London News Historical Archive were added to the list of databases available via [remote access](#) for NSW residents.

2.6 Eighteenth Century Collections Online (ECCO and ECCOII). MARC records for online full text loaded – 128,316 ECCO and 46,577 ECCOII records. This enables title-level access to works published in the eighteenth century and encourages clients to gain access electronically rather than trawling through microfilm.

2.7 Relocation of over 200,000 more items to offsite storage.

2.8 **Catalogue rebranded with new corporate identity** in conjunction with website and all online and physical services.

3. Forthcoming events

In progress 2010:

- Loading of British House of Commons Parliamentary Papers (HCPP) MARC records from ProQuest has commenced.
- Upgrade of Airpac to Airpac for Smartphones. Upgraded SSL certificate to multi domain SAN certificate in preparation for upgrade.
- Investigating adding more ebooks to the collection and additional methods of authentication
- Migration of catalogue and other databases from WebFeat federated search to new 360 federated search
- Investigating options for display and finding of eresources

Planned or investigating for 2011:

- Evaluating circulation tracking, revision of circulation statistics
- Preparation for RDA implementation, including MARC21 changes in mid 2011.
- Investigation of virtualising Millennium and changing backup methods
- Investigation of resource discovery tools

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
