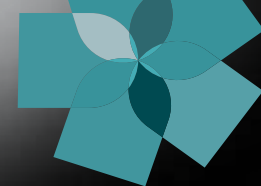

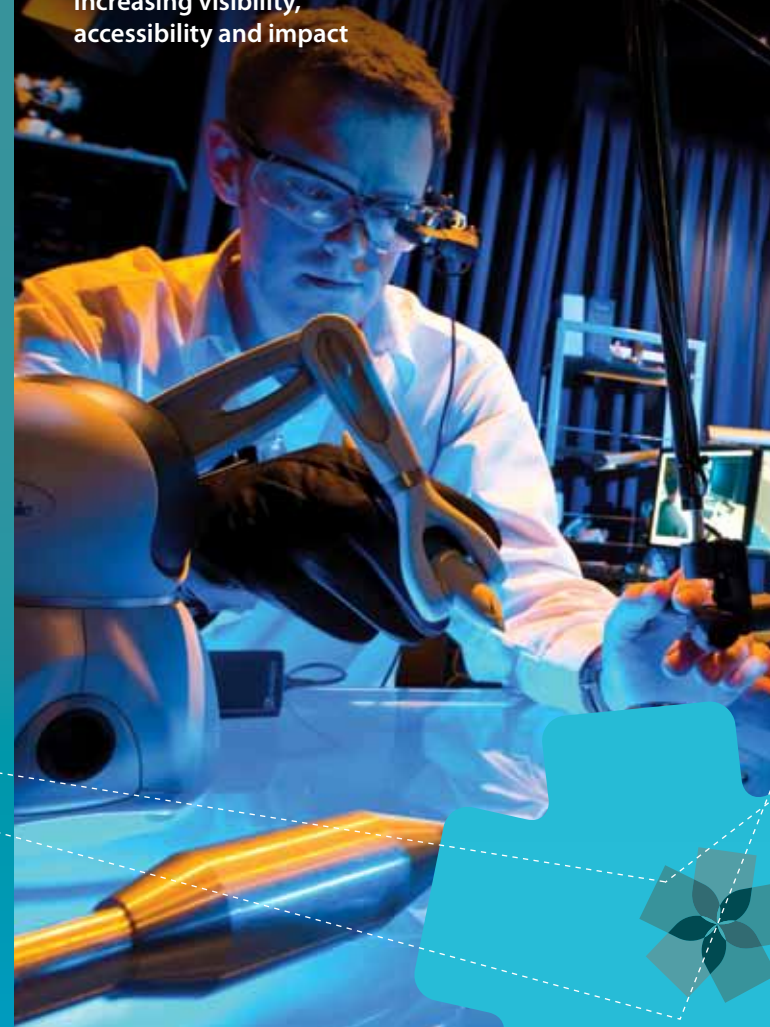

What is Deakin Research Online?

Deakin Research Online (DRO) is the University's online research repository, promoting research at Deakin. DRO currently aims to provide a record of all researchers' publications since 2001*, and it includes many other research outputs. Open access is provided wherever possible.

Top depositors have reported that DRO has increased citations to their work. Collaborative research opportunities are extended through the open access discovery of research provided by DRO.

What can I deposit?

Any outcome of research that can be captured and presented over the web can be deposited. The repository stores traditional outputs such as journal articles, book chapters and theses, as well as performances, images, small datasets, designs, patents, computer software and public lectures.

You may consider depositing materials that add value to your research output but may not be part of your publication, e.g. illustrations, surveys, and images.

You are required to deposit outputs to meet HERDC and other reporting requirements. Check your Faculty website regarding your responsibilities.

What is open access?

Open access is the idea that information should be freely available online for anyone to access. Most publishers allow some form of open access or self archiving.

Open access material in DRO is automatically protected by fair dealing provisions of the *Copyright Act 1968*. However, an author who still owns copyright may offer a Creative Commons licence, which can extend the usage of material, according to the type of licence chosen.

Copyright and open access

DRO staff will check all material added to the repository to ensure it meets publisher or copyright owner requirements. Publishers may only allow the final post-refereed manuscript accepted for publication to be made available.

DRO staff will advise on which version of your publication is allowed and will allow open access to the best permitted version.

To take advantage of this service:

- » sign a Deakin Research Online Licence Agreement (only one is needed) www.deakin.edu.au/dro/help/DRO-Repository-Licence-approved.pdf
- » obtain permission of all co-authors of a publication to deposit
- » send the final post-refereed manuscript of your publication to the DRO team.

You can choose to favour publishers who allow you to deposit in an institutional repository. You can also seek an addendum to your publisher agreement. Advice is provided at the Deakin University Copyright website. staff.deakin.edu.au/services/copyright/dealing-with/research.php

The benefits of Deakin Research Online

- » Provides your publication data to the annual HERDC.
- » Informs reporting for ERA.
- » Meets open access requirements of funding bodies such as NH&MRC.
- » Stores your research outputs securely in a database harvested by search engines.
- » Raises the visibility of your work, increasing citations and helping you connect with other researchers.
- » Provides statistics on the number of times your outputs are downloaded over time and by country.
- » Generates a publication list for your CV or web page.
- » Preserves your research outputs into the future.
- » Open access supports the dissemination of your research findings to the wider community.
