DEAKIN REGIONAL ACCESS SCHEME

The Deakin Regional Access Scheme is a pathway to undergraduate study. It allows your students to secure a spot at university long before ATARs are released by looking at their skills, experience and achievements.

Who's it for?

The scheme is open to current and recent Year 12 students (2021, 2020 and 2019 cohorts) looking to study at our Geelong Waterfront, Geelong Waurn Ponds or Warrnambool campuses – but students don't have to live in a regional area to be eligible. It's perfect for students who want to achieve their best, free from the expectations of exams.

What's the benefit?

We look beyond their ATAR to recognise all the skills, experience and achievements that make your students unique. If their application is successful, they will receive an early offer to Deakin (as soon as late August).

How does it work?

Student will apply directly to Deakin – giving them the opportunity to tell us how their skills and experience will set them up for success at uni. They will also need to preference the scheme via VTAC. Courses participating in the Deakin Regional Access Scheme will have a unique VTAC code for those applying for the scheme.

The Indigenous Access Scheme is a pathway into undergraduate study for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. We want to recognise their achievements and help them succeed, so when they apply, we'll look at a range of factors to help find the course that's right for them.

As well as academic achievements, applicants can demonstrate their readiness for study through previous life or work experience, education, community involvement, and anything else that is relevant.

Deakin Achieving Potential Scholarships

A Deakin Achieving Potential Scholarship offers financial support to students who display passion, perseverance and commitment to study, and experience financial or personal hardship.

This scholarship program is supported by a community of generous donors who are committed to increasing educational pathways and building a brighter future for students who chose to study at Deakin.

To be eligible students must be:

- an Australian citizen, New Zealand citizen, Australian permanent resident or hold an Australian permanent humanitarian visa
- enrolled in an associate, bachelor or honours degree in a Commonwealth supported place (CSP) or postgraduate by coursework degree (CSP or full fee)
- enrolled at Deakin University in Trimester 1 2022
- enrolled full time unless there are circumstances preventing full-time study
- experiencing financial hardship, personal hardship or a long-term medical condition.

Various options for support are available:

- \$10,000 per year for the normal duration of your course (\$1250 per credit point) or
- \$7500 per year for the normal duration of your course (\$937.50 per credit point) or
- \$5000 per year for the normal duration of your course (\$625 per credit point)

\$1000 Deakin Residential Experience Grants – apply by 3 December

In light of the challenges facing many students considering university study, Deakin Res is thrilled to announce the availability of our Residential Experience Grants. These grants provide a \$1000 rental subsidy for 10 incoming students towards accommodation costs. Any new student who applies by the deadline, and accepts a place by 11 February 2022, at one of our Deakin Res campuses for Trimester 1 and 2 2022 is eligible for this opportunity.
