The Graduation Ceremony

'Kim barne barre Wadawurrung Dja' Welcome to Wadawurrung Country

Deakin University would like to acknowledge the Wadawurrung People, the traditional custodians of the land and the Wathaurong community where this graduation ceremony is taking place. We pay our respects for their continued care of the land and further extend that respect to elders past and present.

Order of Ceremony

Processional music heralds the arrival of the Academic Procession for the graduation ceremony.

At the commencement of this music, graduands and guests are asked to stand and remain standing for the National Anthem.

The Master of Ceremonies will open proceedings and the Chancellor (or representative) will deliver the opening address. The Vice-Chancellor (or representative) will then introduce the guest speaker who will deliver the occasional address.

The Chancellor (or representative) will then make a formal declaration conferring the awards of the University on the graduates, both present and in absentia, and will invite graduates to proceed to the stage according to the order published in the program.

A Faculty Executive Dean (or representative) will read out the names of graduates being presented to the Chancellor (or representative).

At the conclusion of the presentation of the graduates, a representative of the graduating students will deliver a brief response.

The Vice-Chancellor (or representative) will deliver the closing address. Following the closing address, there will be a musical performance.

At the conclusion of the ceremony guests are requested to stand while the stage party and graduates leave the hall.

Refreshments will then be served in the marquee in the John Hay Courtyard.





The University Mace

Maces were originally medieval weapons carried by bodyguards to kings and sergeants-at-arms. Much later, the mace became of ceremonial rather than practical significance and organisations such as civic corporations and universities adopted the mace as a symbol of the rule of legal authority.

The University's mace is displayed at meetings of the University Council and on such ceremonial occasions as conferring ceremonies. The bearer of the mace, in academic processions, 'guards' the Chancellor. Deakin's mace was presented to the University by Mr Donald Thomson, Sir Wilfred Brookes and Mr Norman Stephen (Alcoa Australia).



The Academic Procession

In academic processions, the order of precedence on entry is from junior to most senior. The Chancellor, therefore, is the last member of the procession, followed by the mace-bearer. The Deakin Academic Procession and stage party usually consists of:

Academic Dress

Academic dress is an important reminder of the long history of universities in western civilisation. The three main elements of academic dress are the gown, the hood and the head-dress, which were all once articles of everyday outer dress. Both gowns and hoods, when in common use, were often lined and this lining was decorative, as well as practical. In medieval times, the higher the rank of the wearer, the more sumptuous the gown.

In universities there is still a difference in the apparel of scholars of various ranks reflecting the origins of the academic dress. Today's academic head-dress evolved from various hats and bonnets of earlier times. Deakin University's academic dress, like that of most Australian universities, derives from dress worn at the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge.

Deakin University Ceremonial Dress

Chancellor – a navy blue gown trimmed with gold bullion braid, sleeves trimmed with four gold ornaments and gold bullion braid around the bottom hem, a navy blue bonnet lined with gold satin, with gold braid and two gold metallic tassels.

Vice-Chancellor and President – a navy blue gown with five bars of gold bullion braid on the sleeves and a navy blue tudor bonnet identical to that of the Chancellor.

Alfred Deakin Professor

Academic staff who have been awarded the title Alfred Deakin Professor will wear academic regalia befitting their highest qualification as well as an Alfred Deakin Professor stole which will be worn over the top of the gown.

Deakin University Academic Dress

Higher Doctorate – a red gown with gold silk front facings finishing at the front yoke line, sleeves fully lined with gold silk and turned back at the front seam, together with a red hood lined with gold silk and a red bonnet with gold tassels.

Doctor of Philosophy – a royal blue gown with red silk front facings finishing at the front yoke line, sleeves fully lined with red silk and turned back at the front seam, together with a royal blue hood lined with red silk and a royal blue bonnet with red tassels.

Professional Doctorate – a royal blue gown with the relevant discipline colour silk front facings finishing at the front yoke line, sleeves fully lined with the relevant discipline colour silk and turned back at the front seam, together with a royal blue hood lined with silk of the relevant discipline colour, and a royal blue bonnet with blue tassels.

Master by Research – a navy blue master gown, Cambridge hood lined with silk of the relevant award colour and trimmed with two white pipes, colour is shown on both shoulders, and a navy blue trencher trimmed with white binding and white tassels.

Master by Coursework with Honours – a navy blue master gown, Cambridge hood lined with the appropriate coloured silk and trimmed with two white pipes, colour is shown on both shoulders, and a navy blue trencher with navy blue tassels.

Master by Coursework – a navy blue master gown, Cambridge hood lined with the appropriate coloured silk and trimmed with one white pipe, colour is shown on both shoulders, and a navy blue trencher with navy blue tassels.

Graduate Diploma – a navy blue bachelor gown, Oxford hood lined with the appropriate coloured silk and trimmed with one white pipe, colour is shown on the left shoulder only, and a navy blue trencher with navy blue tassels.

Graduate Certificate – a navy blue bachelor gown, Oxford hood lined with the appropriate coloured silk and trimmed with the same colour pipe, colour is shown on the left shoulder only, and a navy blue trencher with navy blue tassels.

Bachelor Degree with Honours – a navy blue bachelor gown, Oxford hood lined with the appropriate coloured silk and trimmed with two white pipes, colour is shown on the left shoulder only, and a navy blue trencher with navy blue tassels.

Bachelor Degree – a navy blue bachelor gown, Oxford hood lined with the appropriate coloured silk, colour is shown on the left shoulder only, and a navy blue trencher with navy blue tassels.

Associate Degree – a navy blue bachelor gown, Oxford hood lined with the appropriate coloured silk, colour is shown on the left shoulder only, and no trencher.

Diploma or Advanced Diploma – a navy blue bachelor gown, stole of the appropriate colour and no trencher.

Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait
Islander Stole — a silk stole in the colours
of the relevant Indigenous flag may be worn
under the hood or stole of the relevant award.

Michael Cristiano

Michael Cristiano is one of Australia's most highly acclaimed performers, composers and record producers. As a producer, his name can be found on numerous multi-platinum selling albums by such artists as The Seekers, Judith Durham, Silverchair, Andre Rieu, Mirusia and Gene Pitney amongst many other big names. As a performer, he is renowned for his on-stage presence, unique, soulful voice and virtuoso guitar skills that continue to wow audiences

worldwide. He is one of the country's most respected musicians and composers and has taken home many prestigious music awards. In 2019, The Seekers founding members Athol Guy, Keith Potger and Bruce Woodley joined Michael at his Soundplant recording studio to revisit songs they'd sung in earlier years, and a few they wish they'd sung. The resulting album "Back To Our Roots" was released to rave reviews and "The Original Seekers" (as they were now known) embarked on a sell-out national tour. With a string of ARIA Number one albums to his production portfolio and a new solo album in the works, he continues to be one of the brightest and dynamic stars on the Australian music scene, dedicating his time and unique skills to both his own projects and those of emerging artists and established veterans alike.



Ron Murray

Ron Murray is a Wamba Wamba man (Swan Hill area) living at Yapeen, near Castlemaine in central Victoria on Jaara country. He has performed as a didgeridoo soloist widely in Australia and also in New York, Jordan, Canada and New Zealand. Ron has performed for Queen Elizabeth II, Yusuf Islam (Cat Stevens), Sir Bob Geldoff and Muhammed Ali. Musical highlights include performing at the world premiere of American composer Phillip Glass' Voices for Didgeridoo,

Organ and Narrator (2001) with Mark Atkin, Calvin Bowman and Joy Murphy-Wandin at the Lincoln Center Festival, New York. Ron regularly performs as a foundation member of the Deep Listening band, a collaboration of Indigenous and non-Indigenous musicians and artists based on the Indigenous philosophy of Dadirri.



Mary Catanchin

Singer-Guitarist Mary Catanchin is well known throughout Melbourne for her soaring voice and solo acoustic shows. Throughout the past ten years she has forged a solid career performing for corporate clients in venues such as Crown Palladium, The Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre, Federation Square, Etihad Stadium and the Melbourne Cricket Ground. The 2020 and 2021 lockdowns found Mary experimenting with vocal

and percussion looping to create lush harmonies and beats on the fly, resulting in a unique layered sound which she now incorporates into her shows. You can find Mary playing weekly at some of Melbourne's busiest public venues in the CBD such as Crown Casino as well as fronting Radio Star, a popular Cover Band playing at Lamby's Geelong and many other Melbourne venues.



Jessica Markovski

The University

Alfred Deakin

Deakin University was named in honour of Alfred Deakin (1856–1919), a remarkable Australian statesman, leading figure of the federation movement and three-time Prime Minister of Australia.

Alfred Deakin was a man of broad vision. Praised as a political leader, he was an outstanding orator, accomplished lawyer, a journalist, poet, an intellectual and an idealist motivated by a sense of duty to his country.

The son of English migrants, Alfred Deakin was born and educated in Melbourne, studying law at the University of Melbourne. He embarked upon a career in journalism with The Age and was a prolific reader of literature, philosophy, law and science, earning most of his income as a writer of social and political commentaries.

In 1879, Alfred Deakin launched his political career and became a successful Liberal candidate for the Victorian Parliament.

A believer in democratic social reform, he became the acknowledged leader of the Australian Federation movement in Victoria. He was an active campaigner, a delegate at the federal conventions, member of the constitutional drafting committee and colonial representative in London.

Alfred Deakin was Deputy Prime Minister and Attorney-General in Australia's first government and, in 1903, he became Prime Minister. His many achievements include the establishment of the High Court of Australia, the introduction of labour and social reforms, the promulgation of new technologies such as irrigation and wireless telegraphy, support for the exploration of Antarctica and the introduction of financial support for Australian writers.

1974-1984

Deakin was established by the Victorian Parliament in 1974 as a 'university in the Geelong area'. Deakin began teaching on 1 April 1977.

Deakin University was named after Alfred Deakin, who served as Prime Minister three times between 1903 and 1910 and was a significant figure in the achievement of Australian Federation.

When it was established, Deakin incorporated two existing Geelong-based institutions – the Geelong State College and the Gordon Institute of Technology.

Deakin had approximately 2500 students in its first year (1977), rising to 4800 in 1980.

By 1984, Deakin had consolidated its operations at the Geelong Waurn Ponds Campus.

1990-1991

Deakin's growth outside Geelong began in 1990 when it amalgamated with the Warrnambool Institute of Advanced Education. This continued in 1991 when it amalgamated with Victoria College, which operated from Burwood, Toorak and Clayton.

1993

Deakin was one of the first Australian universities to embrace professional and continuing education to corporate clients, establishing Deakin Australia (now DeakinCo.) in 1993.

1996

In the mid-1970s, the woolstores on the waterfront in central Geelong was one site considered and rejected for the proposed university that was to become Deakin. In 1996, this idea came to fruition with the opening of the Geelong Waterfront Campus.

2008

In 2008, the Deakin University School of Medicine opened, becoming Victoria's first rural and regional medical school.

2012

February 2012 saw the first intake of students in the new Bachelor of Vision Science/Master of Optometry degree.



2013-2019

During a period of rapid growth between 2013 and 2019, new buildings and major improvements included:

- the iconic gateway building at the Melbourne Burwood Campus
- Centre for Advanced Design Engineering Training at the Geelong Waurn Ponds Campus
- expansion of student accommodation across all campuses.

2014

In March 2014, the University declared it would be a smoke-free environment.

In May, the \$34 million globally unique cutting-edge carbon fibre research and innovation facility, Carbon Nexus, officially opened at the Geelong Waurn Ponds Campus.

In December, Deakin celebrated its 200,000th graduate.

2016

In January 2016, John Stanhope AM assumed the position of Deakin's Chancellor, taking over from David Morgan who served as Chancellor for 10 years.

In April, the Deakin Business School received accreditation by The Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business International, the longest serving global accrediting body for business schools in the world.

In August, the Deakin University
Community Bank® initiative with Bendigo
Bank was launched – the first collaboration
of its kind between a university and a
financial institution.

Deakin partnered with FutureLearn to offer full degrees online and short free courses through FutureLearn's global platform.

The Deakin Story continued

2017

In 2017 Deakin ranked 213 globally by the prestigious Academic Ranking of World universities.

Also in this year, the expanded TERI-Deakin Nanobiotech Centre was opened by the Prime Minister.

In 2017 Deakin University and LeMond Composites joined forces in a \$58m deal to revolutionise the use of carbon fibre across the world.

Soon after, in 2019, Deakin opened two new institutes: the Institute for Health Transformation and the Deakin Applied Artificial Intelligence Institute.

2018

In 2018 Deakin officially launched its Innovation Hub ManuFutures.

Deakin partnered with AusNet Services to establish a 7.25 MW smart microgrid at its Geelong Waurn Ponds campus.

The 2018 Excellence in Research for Australia rankings saw Deakin performing at or above world standard in 100% of its research (up from 90% in 2015).



2019

In March 2019, Deakin celebrated 25 years of engagement in India. Deakin was the first international university to establish an office in India.

In July, Deakin's seventh Vice-Chancellor, Professor Iain Martin begins in the role, taking over from Professor Jane den Hollander AO who served for nine years.

Also in this year, Deakin appointed its inaugural Pro Vice-Chancellor Indigenous Strategy, Professor Mark Rose.

Deakin was awarded an Athena SWAN Bronze Institution Award in recognition of the its commitment to advancing the careers of women, trans and gender diverse individuals in STEMM disciplines; in the same year, Deakin received the 'Employer of Choice for Gender Equality' citation for the 13th consecutive year.

2020

In December 2020, the University launched its new ten-year strategic plan, *Deakin 2030: Ideas to Impact*.

The Hydrogen Training Testbed at the Hycel Technology Hub in Warrnambool was launched.

In March, Deakin launched NIKERI – the National Indigenous Knowledges Education Research Innovation Institute. The following year, the Vice-Chancellor's Indigenous Advisory Council was established.

2021

In 2021, Deakin established ten platforms for discovery and innovation, funded by the Victorian Higher Education State Investment Fund, the Commonwealth Government, Deakin and its partners.

In April, Deakin launched the Renewable Energy Microgrid at the Waurn Ponds Campus, the largest ever solar farm on an Australian university, which will help to achieve Deakin's goal of being carbon neutral by 2025 and carbon negative by 2030.

Between 2019 and 2021, significant infrastructure developments included:

- Nyaal at Waurn Ponds, an immersive teaching facility, and
- the new Law Building at Burwood.

The Campuses

Deakin is a large university with all the accompanying resources and infrastructure, but its campuses are small enough to retain their own character and sense of community. Each of our campuses offers a unique atmosphere – from the inspiring architecture and bayside appeal of our Geelong Waterfront Campus, to the cafe culture of our Melbourne Burwood Campus, the spectacular coastal location at our Warrnambool Campus or the mix of activity and open space at our Geelong Waurn Ponds Campus.

Melbourne Burwood Campus

This thriving campus is Deakin's largest. Located 15km from the Melbourne CBD, it boasts open and inviting spaces for socialising and studying, innovative architecture and wireless locations. An ambitious building program has resulted in a new complex of spacious modern buildings, including the gateway building situated on Burwood Highway and the state-of-the-art Indoor Exercise and Sport Science Teaching Building, completed in 2019. Refurbishment of older buildings, a library extension, expansion of residential accommodation, a 250-seat lecture theatre and a large landscaped central courtyard have all created a campus that is well-resourced and well-designed. The campus is home to the Deakin University Art Gallery and the Deakin Motion.Lab, a state-of-the-art motion capture facility that produces 3D animation and special effects, similar to those used in films such as Avatar and The Lord of the Rings.

Geelong Waurn Ponds Campus

Deakin's Geelong Waurn Ponds Campus is located 8km from the centre of the historic port city of Geelong, which is 72km south-west of Melbourne. Geelong is Victoria's largest regional city with a population close to 225,000.

Set among extensive landscaped grounds, the Geelong Waurn Ponds Campus boasts hectares of native trees, grassy lawns, lakes and avenues. There are many specialist facilities at this campus, including an outstandingly resourced library, audiovisual production studios, research laboratories and an extensive computer centre. The Waurn Ponds Estate provides first-class conference and convention facilities.

Also located at the Geelong Waurn Ponds Campus is the Geelong Future Economy Precinct. The Precinct draws on over 15 years of investment in developing the research expertise and facilities in areas such as carbon and ultra-fine fibre, nanotechnology and composite materials, as well as robotics, pattern recognition and data analytics. Some of Australia's, and the world's, leading advanced manufacturers now call the Precinct home.

Geelong Waterfront Campus

The Geelong Waterfront Campus is Deakin's newest campus, located on the beautiful foreshore of Corio Bay in the central business district of Geelong. Originally built in 1893, the historic woolstore building has undergone extensive redevelopment to create a modern and impressive campus centre.

The centrepiece of the campus is Costa Hall, a concert hall of international standard, where a number of university ceremonies, cultural performances and community functions take place, including Deakin's graduation ceremonies.

Also located at this campus is the refurbished Sally Walker Building, which houses the Alfred Deakin Prime Ministerial Library and the Alfred Deakin Research Institute. The Alfred Deakin Research Institute is an interdisciplinary teaching and research centre covering political science, public policy and governance, international relations, globalisation, journalism and communications.

Warrnambool Campus

Warrnambool is the commercial, cultural and educational heart of south-west Victoria. A premier tourist destination, it boasts stunning coastlines, renowned surf beaches and is the state's foremost site for whale watching.

Located 262km from Melbourne, the campus is set on 114 sprawling hectares on the banks of the picturesque Hopkins River. Our lecturers, students and staff at the Warrnambool Campus form a real community, where communication is open and informal.

Campus facilities include a comprehensive library, excellent teaching and learning spaces, a cafe, gymnasium, bookshop and golf course. Located just 5km from the centre of Warrnambool, the campus ensures that Deakin contributes to the vitality of the local community in the tradition of many university cities.

Ms Megan Gilmour

The Occasional Address will be delivered by Ms Megan Gilmour.

Megan Gilmour is a social innovator, global changemaker, tech entrepreneur and champion for human-centred solutions to complex social problems.

In 2010, after a 25-year career in government, publishing, and international aid and development, Megan's path took an abrupt turn when her son was diagnosed with a life-threatening illness.

Given her extensive experience in addressing system-wide change and global social issues, she thought she was prepared for what lay ahead, but living in the hospital system as a parent proved to be a confronting and disempowering experience.

Megan quickly saw that creating real social impact required human connection over bureaucracy, programs and dollars. In 2012, with her son in recovery, she completed her Master's Degree at Deakin University and resolved to tackle one of the glaring inequities her son faced over the two years he fought his illness – isolation due to time away from school. She co-founded Missing School, a now internationally-known not-forprofit.

Following that, she authored publications on matters of Australian national interest and coauthored an Australian-first report on school connection for kids with complex medical or mental health conditions. The report received a Prime Minister's statement of support in 2015 and generated over 160 media articles. This led to Megan initiating the first Australian government report on the issue and guiding its governance methodology. When government asked "what's the solution?", she set her mind to designing a world-first education innovation that connects absent students to their classrooms through telepresence robots.

The seeds for Megan's unique ability to implement human-centred solutions to system-wide problems were planted at an early age. A fiery redhead with a rebellious spirit, Megan was born and raised in Sydney's multicultural heartland. With daily exposure to different cultures, ideas and influences, she forged a strong sense of social justice that lead her to leave school at 15, attend business school and begin a career in government that saw her rise through the ranks to become the NSW Finance Minister's youngest staff member.

Within just a few years Megan was working in international development, and later spearheaded multi-million dollar initiatives to address complex social and development issues across 24 countries.

Megan teaches and mentors changemakers to build enterprises for social good, and has co-founded tech startups in the global development and assistive robot sector to support aged care, disability, education, health, and industry. She has just launched Seen&Heard, an initiative to focus a decade of success on scaling-up connective technology (from robots to far-reaching teleconference tools) with the ultimate goal of solving school isolation for some of Australia's most vulnerable students by 2025.

Megan's work has been recognised nationally and internationally. In 2018, she was a finalist for the ACT Australian of the Year Awards. She has also been recognised as one of AFR's 100 Women of Influence, and was awarded the Telstra ACT Business Woman of the Year for Purpose and Social Enterprise in 2019. She is also a Churchill Fellow (with studies in six countries) and a 2020 Deakin University Alumna of Year.

A leader in governance and systems, research and capacity building for students missing school because of serious illness, in 2021 Megan released a policy impact paper written for Policy Futures: A Reform Agenda, University of Queensland and the Winston Churchill Memorial Trust, then activated a national policy result.

As a keynote speaker and media spokesperson, Megan's inspirational and unconventional journey is powerfully motivating. Her big picture perspective and ability to cause lasting social change at scale through the power of human connection and innovation uniquely places her to shift audiences beyond passive observers to active changemakers.

The honorary degree of Deakin Honorary Doctorate will be conferred upon Ms Elaine Carbines AM for distinguished service to Geelong and the Barwon Region, especially in the areas of regional development, support of Deakin University and protection of the environment.



Ms Elaine Carbines AM

The Occasional Address will be delivered by Ms Elaine Carbines AM.

Elaine Carbines was born in Manchester, England. She completed her primary schooling there before her family migrated to Australia in the late 1960s.

The family initially lived on a migrant hostel before settling in the eastern suburbs of Melbourne where Elaine attended Mitcham High School. She commenced her tertiary education, the first in her family to do so, at Monash University, completing an Arts degree and later a Diploma of Education.

Elaine began her teaching career at Banyule High School in 1979 where she taught English, History and French. She taught there for ten years before leaving to have her children, Hannah and Scott.

In 1993, Elaine, husband Shane and their young children, moved to Geelong. She established herself as a valued community member taking on various leadership roles and recommenced her teaching career at local Geelong state secondary schools before being preselected to run in the 1996 state election as the ALP candidate for the seat of Bellarine. Although unsuccessful at that election, she was elected as the Member for Geelong Province in 1999.

Elaine thoroughly enjoyed representing the Geelong region community in state parliament. She was promoted to the position of Parliamentary Secretary for Education and later, Parliamentary Secretary for Environment.

Her time as an MP taught Elaine much about the political process and she oversaw the development of several key government strategies including the Great Ocean Rd Region Strategy, Coastal Spaces Project, the Live Music Taskforce, and the Cutting Red Tape in Planning Project.

Losing her seat in 2006, Elaine then worked for three years as the Manager of Parks and Marine Relations at Parks Victoria where she led stakeholder relations plus multiple community engagement projects across the state.

In 2010, Elaine was appointed CEO of G21 – Geelong Region Alliance, an alliance of the five local government areas in the wider Geelong region. For ten years she led the development and implementation of strongly supported regional strategic plans including land use, growth, infrastructure, public transport, health and wellbeing. She also advocated strongly for investment in the region working closely with other key stakeholders including Deakin University.

Under her leadership, G21 actively pursued and secured Victoria's only City Deal - the \$500m Geelong and Great Ocean Road City Deal focusing on the visitor economy. Having a deep commitment to social justice, Elaine led the development of the award-winning public policy initiative, GROW (G21 Region Opportunities for Work), in conjunction with the Give Where You Live Foundation to address disadvantage in the G21 region.

Leaving G21 at the end of 2020, Elaine holds several directorships including being Deputy Chair of both Ports Victoria and Barwon Water.

Elaine's contribution throughout her career has been recognised through several awards including:

- Member of the Order of Australia 2020 (for significant contribution to conservation and the environment)
- Committee for Geelong Leader of the Year 2020 (for outstanding leadership to the Geelong Community)
- IPAA National Fellow 2022 (for outstanding contribution to the practice of public administration in Australia)





- Jangan beranjak dari lokasi berkumpul, dan laporkan jika ada orang atau barang pribadi yang tertinggal.

Jangan kembali ke dalam gedung sebelum tim pemadam kebakaran memastikan kondisi sudah aman.
