Deakin Accelerate is a distinctive VCE extension studies program offering high-achieving students university-level learning opportunities.

In this program, students will complete two units of a first-year university subject at the same time as their Year 12 studies.

Students will study one unit per trimester, alongside first-year university students, completing their units either on campus at one of Deakin's four vibrant locations, or at the Cloud Campus – our innovative online learning environment.

Students get the same benefits as studying a fifth or sixth VCE subject, while gaining university credit and reducing the cost of their future degree. If students are planning to complete an extra subject in Year 12, they should consider the additional experience, variety of subjects, and dynamic, exciting environment that comes with the Deakin Accelerate program.

Undergraduate scholarships

A Deakin scholarship is more than simply a financial boost. It's a remarkable opportunity that sets you on the pathway to success at university. It helps you to stand out from the crowd, be recognised by leading employers, and make a unique mark on the world.

We offer undergraduate scholarships in a number of study areas to support you on your journey at Deakin.

- **Vice-Chancellor's Academic Excellence Scholarship:** 100% tuition fees covered; plus \$5000 cash payment per year and a place in the Vice-Chancellor's Professional Excellence Program.
- **Deakin Scholarship for Excellence:** \$5000 per year, or a combination of both to the value of \$5000 per year with the option to be paid as cash or to tuition fees.
- **Deakin Student Support Scholarship:** financial support ranging from \$1000 one-off payment up to \$10 000 per year for students experiencing financial or personal hardship.

We are also very excited to announce a new scholarship that has been introduced for high-achieving students starting with Deakin in 2020.

Deakin Academic Performance Scholarship: This esteemed scholarship is awarded based on students exceptional academic achievements. If a student's ATAR is 98 or above, and they have Deakin as one of their preferences when ATARs are released, they will be automatically offered an \$8000 cash scholarship in the first year of study.

Deakin also offers a range of generous donor scholarships that support excellence, achievement, hardship, students enrolled in a particular course, or from a specific region or background.

Global Science and Technology Program

The SEBE Global Science and Technology Program (GSTP) gives students the opportunity to gain experience beyond the classroom and experience the world whilst studying. The program develops the skills needed to be successful in an increasingly global society.

Bachelor of Human Resource Management (Psychology) (New Course)

Campuses of study: Melbourne Burwood, Cloud, Geelong Waterfront, Geelong Waurn Ponds

Intakes: T1 (March), T2 (July)

Indicative ATAR: 70 (all campuses)

The Bachelor of Human Resource Management (Psychology) will develop your deep understanding of human behaviour, giving you a broader perspective of the challenges faced in HR, while at the same time preparing you for the realities of modern business. This course is particularly beneficial to students who are open to careers in both human resources and psychology. By exploring the human mind in a business context, you'll have a significant advantage when performing key functions in your role in human resources (HR), from recruitment and workplace negotiations, to creating high-performance environments. It comes with key professional accreditations from the Australian Human Resource Institute (AHRI) and is seeking accreditation from the Australian Psychology Accreditation Council (APAC) that will provide a recognised pathway towards becoming a registered psychologist.

Course requirements: The Bachelor of Human Resource Management (Psychology) is a 24 credit point degree – each unit (subject) is worth 1 credit point – consisting of 24 credit points of core units (including one Work Integrated Learning unit). The course duration will be 3 years full time or part-time equivalent.

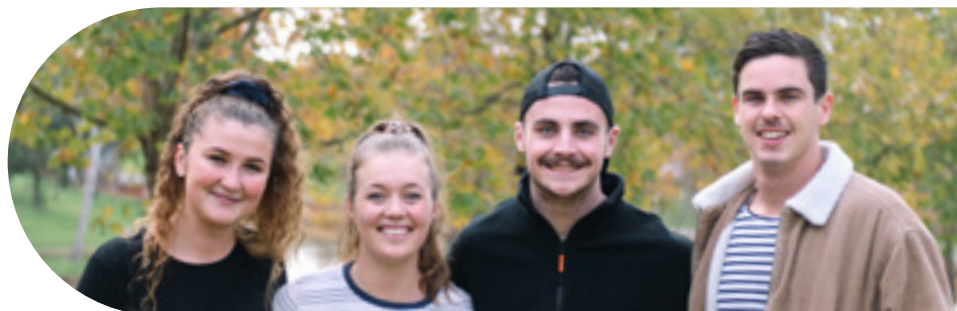
