Education standards for Financial Advisers

The **Financial Adviser Standards** (FAS) has established education requirements for all new and existing financial advisers. All existing advisers will need to have completed further study by 2026, and a national examination by January 2022. While the extent of the study required will depend upon your qualifications and recognition of prior learning (RPL), as a minimum all existing advisers will need to complete further studies in Ethics for Financial Services (MAA769/MAI769). Professional recognition

FAS/FASEA approved Course

The Master and Graduate Diploma of Financial Planning are a FAS-approved courses. Graduates will satisfy the education standards prescribed by FAS to be able to provide financial advice in Australia, subject to meeting other registration requirements prescribed by FAS (including completion of a Professional Year for Provisional Relevant Providers and passing a National Adviser Exam).

Practitioners Board (TPB)

Completion of Principles of Income Tax Law and Business Law units approved by the Tax Practitioners Board (TPB), will meet the education requirements of the Tax Agent Services Act (TASA).

Professional Designation programs

Deakin University has entered into partnerships with a number of leading organisations to embed their professional designation program into the Master of Financial Planning course. Students may be eligible to enrol externally through the following professional designation programs as their elective unit into the Master of Financial Planning:

Financial Advice Association Australia (FAAA)

Students have the opportunity to complete the CFP® capstone unit (CFPC) as their elective unit and satisfy the education requirements to become a CFP®

Students have the opportunity to complete the SMSF Specialist Advisor (SSA $^{\rm M}$) program as their elective unit and satisfy the education requirements to be an Accredited SMSF Association Specialist Adviser.

Students have the opportunity to complete the Aged Care Professional[™] accreditation program through Aged Care Steps.

TAL Risk Academy

Students completing specified modules and assessment tasks through the TAL Risk Academy will be entitled to a credit within the Master or Graduate Diploma Financial Planning courses.
