Complete your degree faster

The Bachelor of Construction Management (Honours) may be taken as an accelerated program. By taking selected units in Trimester 3 the course can be completed in three years instead of four.

The Bachelor of Construction Management (Honours) consists of 32 credit points of study, including 28 core units (totalling 29 credit points), and three elective units (1 credit point each).


You will also have to complete two zero credit point units relating to safety and academic integrity.

Entry requirements

Entry for applicants with recent secondary education* will be based on their performance in the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) or its equivalent, with pre-requisite units 3 and 4; a study score of at least 25 in English EAL (English as an additional language) or 20 in English other than EAL.

Entry for applicants with previous Tertiary, VET, life or work experience will be based on their performance in:

- Senior Secondary Certificate of Education with ATAR of at least 50 or equivalent OR
- Certificate IV in a related discipline OR
- Diploma in any discipline or 50% completion of Diploma in a related discipline OR
- Successful completion of relevant study – equivalent to at least two Deakin University units – at an accredited higher education institution OR
- Evidence of academic capability judged to be equivalent, including Foundation program approved by Faculty Board, or relevant work or life experience

How to apply

Depending on your course, our flexible trimester system means you may be able to start in Trimester 1 (March), 2 (July) or 3 (November).

If you're currently enrolled in Year 12 or a recent secondary applicant (i.e. have completed Year 12 in the past two years) your application for Trimester 1 must be made through VTAC, www.vtac.edu.au. Note that when you apply via VTAC, you can't also apply directly to Deakin.

Conversely, if you have previous higher education, VET or work experience, you can apply directly to Deakin.

Applications for Trimester 2 or 3 should be made directly to Deakin via the applicant portal, deakin.edu.au/apply.
