New Scholarships announced at Deakin Residential Services!

Deakin Residential Services is an inclusive, supportive and friendly place to live during your studies. You can enjoy the vibrancy and diversity of our residential community while taking advantage of our fantastic facilities.

We are delighted to be offering new scholarships for our beautiful Melbourne Burwood, Geelong Waurn Ponds and Geelong Waterfront campuses for the first time in a number of years.

These scholarships are offered to ensure that our oncampus accommodation is accessible to a wide range of people, and are made available by HEPPP funding (Higher Education Participation and Partnerships Program). They will cover up to \$12,000 of the cost of on-campus accommodation throughout the year.

While there are already a range of scholarships in place for our Warrnambool campus, we wanted to offer this opportunity for other students as well. These scholarships are open to domestic undergraduate students who satisfy one or more of the HEPPP eligibility criteria, including lowsocio-economic status, being from a remote or regional background and being an Indigenous or Torres Strait Islander person.

Sound like a great opportunity? Don't take our word for it, we asked Sheridan Finn, Residential Leader and Warrnambool resident what having a scholarship has meant for her. Here's what she had to say: "Having a scholarship to assist with accommodation costs was actually the deciding factor for me to move out of home for the first time.

Originally, I had planned on travelling (just over an hour) to uni each day that I had classes and hadn't seriously considered moving onto res until I received an email saying I had received a scholarship.

I'm so glad that when I received that email my parents encouraged me to take up the offer, as it has made living out of home affordable, taking away financial stress and allowing me to focus on my studies more than working to pay for my expenses.

By being able to concentrate and spend more time on my studies, I have had many academic achievements which have opened doors for me. I'm also able to spend more time socialising with my friends, which is important to me.

Now, I couldn't even imagine having to drive to uni each time I have a class or need to borrow a book from the library, as on res I have everything so close to me, which again is a huge time saver!

I would strongly encourage all students to apply for a scholarship for res, as it is a great first move away from home and with a scholarship, it is so much cheaper than renting, it's amazing and so convenient to live just a minute's walk from everything you need and it's a great place to meet new friends that become family!"

Faculty of Health Graduate job-ready with Deakin's Bachelor of Psychological Science

Deakin's Bachelor of Psychological Science covers many aspects of human behaviour and personality, preparing students for a range of careers in the fast-growing health sector. From T1 2023 we have embedded core employabilityorientated units to strengthen employment prospects ensuring students graduate work-ready.

From 2023, our course structure for both Bachelor of Psychological Science and Bachelor of Psychology (Honours) will fall into three core groupings: Foundations of Psychology, Psychology Essentials and Psychology in Practice. Focusing on work-ready skills, Psychology in Practice core units will be embedded in the first year, second year and third year ensuring students graduate ready to take on one of the diverse career opportunities that a psychology degree can lead to.

Bachelor of Design (Architecture)/Master of Architecture

Start on the path to professional registration and a rewarding career

Bachelor of Design (Architecture)/Master of Architecture students at Deakin discover architectural ideas through cutting-edge course content, develop their creativity and gain a practical understanding of the built environment through meaningful and sustainable design.

Hands-on experience in a studio environment develops students' impressive practical skills and their ability to communicate design ideas. Throughout their studies, students will explore innovative design in response to real-world scenarios and present their ideas to registered architects. This practical, applied and industry-connected approach to learning gives students invaluable experience and insights - culminating in the demonstration of advanced design work in the capstone unit as part of their final year of study.

This five-year course provides a packaged education pathway for those interested in pursuing professional registration. After successfully completing this combined degree, graduates will be required to complete an additional two years of work experience under the supervision of a registered architect in order to present for professional registration.

Graduates can then pursue exciting and varied careers in private architectural practice, government organisations, property development or other building and design fields.

Bachelor of Computer Science (Honours)

Graduate career ready with the Bachelor of Computer Science (Honours)

Throughout this specialised four-year course, students will develop the knowledge and practical skills required to design and develop innovative software solutions to multifaceted information and technology challenges.

Students will build advanced practical skills through handson experience in Deakin's specialised facilities, including dedicated robotics, cyber security and augmented and virtual reality laboratories, while supported by experienced, industry-connected staff.

This course explores fundamental concepts across computer systems and discrete mathematics as well as data science and analytics, before diving into more advanced topics in networking and communication, computational intelligence and distributed programming. Honours is built in to the fourth year of study and gives students the opportunity to hone their computer science and research skills in a specialised area of study they are passionate about.

The opportunity to undertake a professional placement, or work in teams with an industry partner as part of a capstone project, will see students graduate ahead of the pack with invaluable professional experience and advanced career-ready skills.

Following successful completion of the course, graduates will be ready to meet the ever-growing demand for skilled and innovative computer science professionals across a range of industries.

Bachelor of Artificial Intelligence (Honours)

Join the AI revolution with the Bachelor of Artificial Intelligence (Honours)

From self-driving cars to the proliferation of smart assistants, Al is a growing part of everyday life. This specialised fouryear course prepares students with the knowledge and skills required to design, develop and evolve software solutions that harness the latest advances in Al.

This course examines up-to-the-minute trends, insights and emerging topics to ensure students graduate with a highly relevant skill set that is sought-after by employers across the globe. Students will gain experience with a variety of AI tools and techniques and deep dive into advanced topics in machine learning, language and speech processing and robotics.

Students will gain invaluable industry-aligned experience by undertaking a professional placement and by working in teams with an industry partner as part of a capstone project. They will also develop key research skills and specialist knowledge through the completion of an honours research project in their final year.

Graduates will be ready to enter the ever-evolving field of artificial intelligence with a highly specialised skill set that employers value.





Bachelor of Cyber Security (Honours)

Graduate with in-demand cyber security skills

Deakin's Bachelor of Cyber Security (Honours) is a specialised four-year course that equips students with the essential skills to investigate and protect computer systems, networks and programs.

Students will assess cyber security systems in a working environment, and cover areas such as computer crime and digital forensics while gaining the skills to identify, diagnose and manage risk.

Students will have the opportunity to gain invaluable industry-aligned skills through a professional placement and by working in teams with an industry partner as part of a capstone project. A fourth year of specialised honours study will see students develop key research capabilities and in-depth knowledge of an area of study they are passionate about.

Graduates will be equipped with a highly specialised skill-set and ready to pursue an exciting career in the expanding field of cyber security.
