



What is it?

We are providing lower upfront guaranteed ATARs for eligible students from under-represented cohorts at Deakin, across most undergraduate courses. This provides you with more certainty, reduces stress and gives you the best chance to get into the course you want.

Am I eligible?

The Deakin Guaranteed ATAR is open to Australian Year 12 students who meet one of the following criteria:

- attend a Deakin under-represented school
- live or study in a regional or remote home or school location
- are of Indigenous Australian descent

It is important to check that you also meet course entry requirements, including any specific course prerequisites.

How to apply

You can apply for a course with a Deakin Guaranteed ATAR in a few simple steps:

- 1. Apply for your preferred Deakin courses through VTAC.
- Remain opted-in for the 'personal information and location' category.
- 3. Review your application and submit.

The information captured in your VTAC application will be used to automatically check if you're eligible for the Deakin Guaranteed ATAR

The Deakin Guaranteed ATAR is based on the ATAR you receive before any adjustments are made. This makes getting into the course you want even easier!

Lucas brings real industry experience directly into the classroom. His philosophy of, 'persistence over perfection', helps students build skills, confidence, and storytelling skills from day one.

Lucas recently brought his signature claymation style to Magic Beach, the film adaptation of Alison Lester's much-loved book. The project featured 10 Australian animators, including Emma Kelly, another Deakin animation teacher, each reimagining a different page. Lucas's twilight smuggler scene showcases exactly the kind of creativity and craft he passes on to his students.

He encourages students to stay curious, keep creating, and never stop learning. Whether they dream of animation, directing, or digital art, Deakin gives them the tools to bring their stories to life.

Introducing our new Indigenous Knowledges minor

We're excited to launch a new Indigenous Knowledges minor as part of the Bachelor of Health Sciences and the Bachelor of Health Sciences/Bachelor of Arts, in collaboration with NIKERI.

At Deakin, we are deeply committed to supporting the improved health and wellbeing of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities, and this new minor is an important step in ensuring our graduates have the knowledge and skills to contribute meaningfully in their future careers. While Indigenous perspectives have always been embedded throughout our Health Sciences degree, this minor provides students with a dedicated opportunity to further explore Indigenous history, culture and diverse perspectives.

The health sector is increasingly focusing on cultural competency and awareness, and we want our students to be ready to meet these expectations. Local councils are now required to develop Reconciliation Action Plans, meaning many of our graduates will need a strong understanding of Indigenous perspectives to help create culturally safe workplaces and policies.

Rather than a full major, we've introduced this as a minor sequence (four units), making it more accessible to a wider range of students. This way, students can still complete essential units required for postgraduate study while gaining valuable Indigenous knowledge. We're also offering a choice between Caring for Country and Global Indigenous Knowledges and Philosophies, allowing students to tailor their learning to their interests, chosen majors and career goals.

For example, students specialising in our Health, Nature and Sustainability major/minor or our Environmental Health major might find Caring for Country more relevant while those focusing on our majors/minors in Health Promotion, Public Health or Family, Society and Health may benefit more from an understanding of Global Indigenous Knowledges and Philosophies.

This initiative has been developed in partnership between the Health Sciences course directors, NIKERI and Professor Lynn Riddell, Associate Dean (Teaching and Learning), and we're looking forward to seeing the impact it will have on our students and the communities they will serve.


