## Choose how you study

For most courses, you can:

- start your degree in any of our three study periods (trimesters) across the year
- complete your study in less time by taking advantage of our trimester system and studying extra units each year
- complete one unit at a time – taking it at your own pace.

## Fast-track your studies

You can use your previous qualifications and experience to shorten your postgraduate course and lower course costs, including reducing many masters degrees from two years full time to one year full time.

Some of our postgraduate 'pathway courses' don't require you to have an undergraduate degree for entry and will allow you to enter based on your work experience. Similarly, you may wish to start with a single unit (or two) to get a feel for postgraduate study before embarking on a masters degree.

### Enrolled in a masters program but want to exit early? You can!

Enrol in a masters degree, with the knowledge that you may have the option to exit after you have completed a graduate certificate or graduate diploma, if your circumstances change.

### Already an experienced professional, looking to further your skills with postgraduate study?

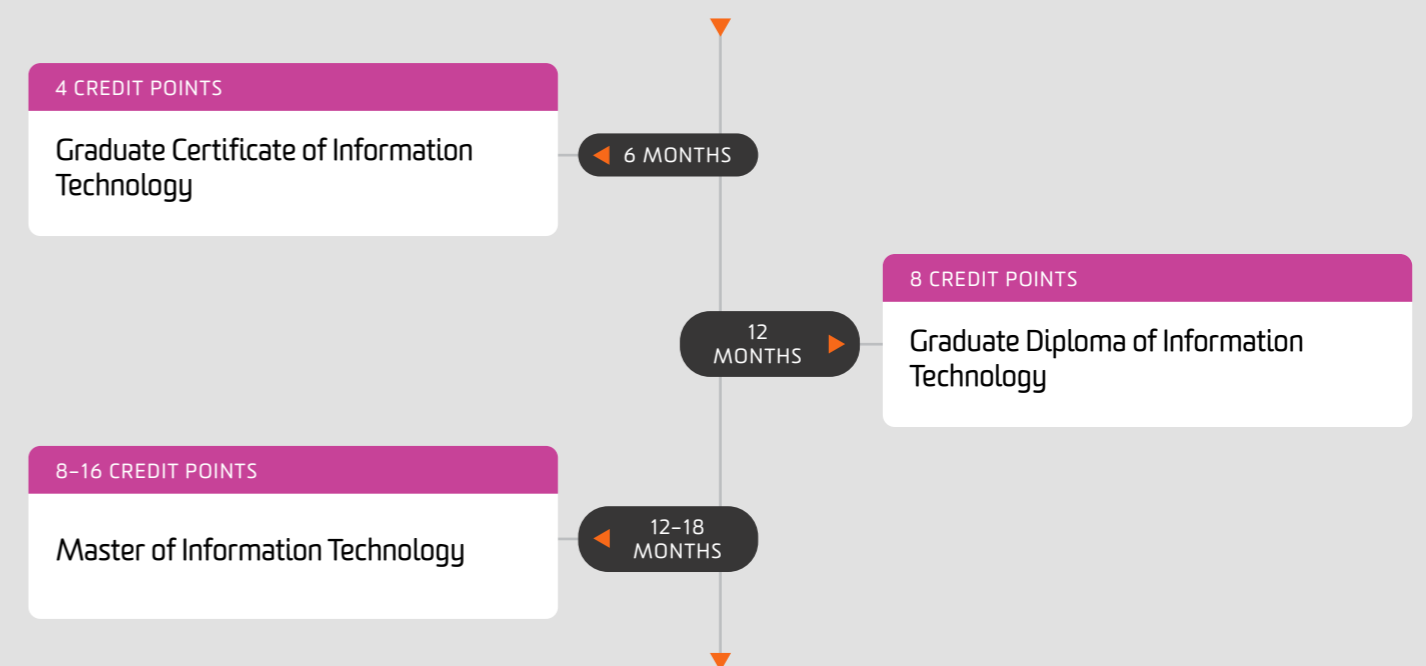

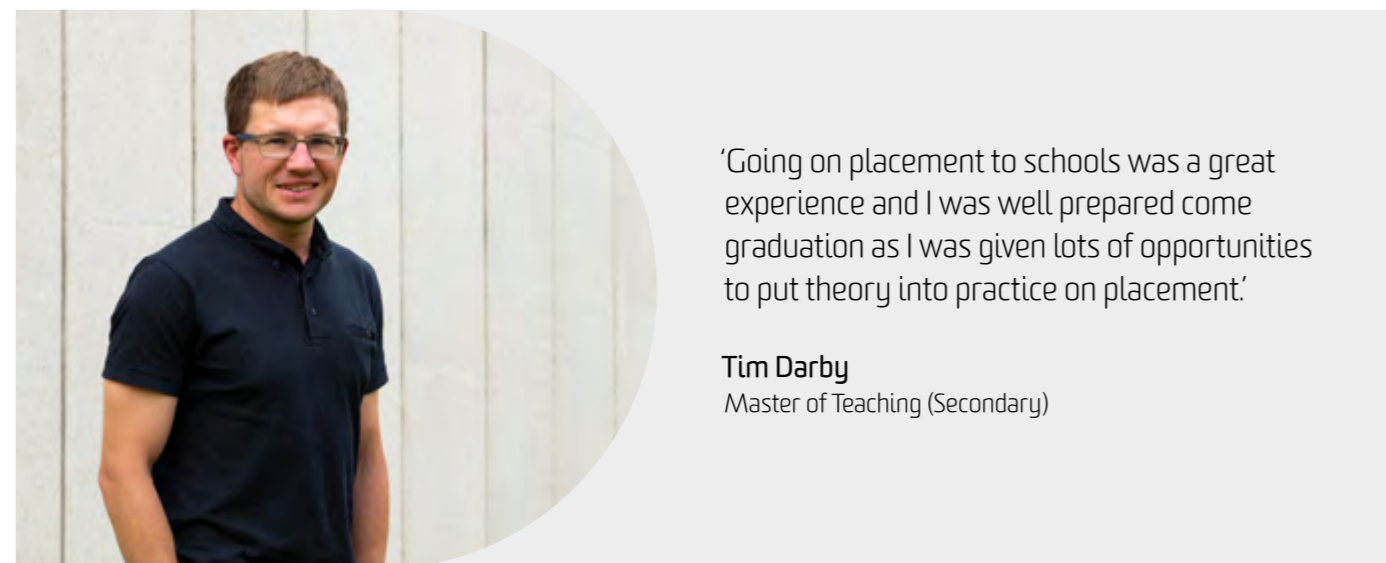

# Your key questions answered

## How many hours of study is recommended for each unit I enrol in?

On average, students are advised to complete about 10 hours of study per week, for each unit. Most campus-based units require three contact hours each week, plus up to seven hours of independent study time each week. Cloud Campus units consist of a 1 hour online lecture plus 8–9 hours of independent (or group) study each week. However, contact hours for a coursework degree can vary depending on the type of course and your mode of study. If you have a certain degree in mind you can see the specifics on the course page and within the unit details at [deakin.edu.au/courses/find-a-course](https://deakin.edu.au/courses/find-a-course).

## Can I change my study load?

Yes, we're known for our flexible study options. Life can change pretty fast. What suits you in March might not work so well in July. Some courses give you the option to switch between campus and online units of study (and back again) as your circumstances change. Likewise, you can switch between full-time and part-time study if you need to, provided your course is available in both study modes.

## I'll have to juggle study around work commitments – how can I keep up-to-date with classes?

We give you the flexibility to study what, when and how you want, so you can fit your studies into your busy life. You can take advantage of some online options even when you are enrolled for campus study, study entirely online at our Cloud Campus, or take a combination of campus and online subjects if it fits better with your timetable. ## Where are exams held?

Students enrolled in a campus-based unit are required to sit any end-of-trimester exams at the campus of unit enrolment. # Create a better world with a research degree

Bring your passion to a university that shares your ambition to create a better world. Our research partnerships, industry-active academics and placement options will equip you with practical and applied skills to develop your career.

Deakin University is home to world-class facilities, a network of academic supervisors who are leaders in their fields, and many globally-significant research projects.

Approximately 1800 Higher Degree by Research (HDR) students are taking advantage of our exceptional facilities, strategic partnerships, innovative research centres and excellent reputation.

All degrees, including research degrees at Deakin meet Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) standards to ensure national recognition and consistency, as well as a common understanding across Australia of what defines each qualification. Our research degrees are internationally recognised and regarded, and for domestic applicants (Australian and New Zealand Citizens and Australian permanent residents) fees are not applicable under the Federal Government's Research Training Program (RTP).

## Deakin offers two main types of higher degrees by research

### Doctor of Philosophy (PhD)

A PhD is awarded for a substantial original contribution to knowledge achieved in the expected completion time of three years, with a time limit of four years. The thesis may be presented in several formats and is usually limited to 100,000 words.

### Master by Research

A Master by Research degree is awarded for an original contribution to knowledge achieved in up to two years of full-time candidature (or two to four years of part-time candidature). Usually a written thesis of no more than 50,000 words is submitted, although the thesis may be presented in several formats.

### World-class research

Deakin is renowned for its research excellence:

- 95% of ERA-assessed broad research fields, and 100% of specific research sub-fields at Deakin have been rated at, above, or well above world standard (Excellence in Research for Australia 2019).
- Deakin is in the top 1% in global rankings (according to major international university ranking ARWU 2019).
- We were awarded a 5-star rating by QS in 2019, indicating that we're world-class in a broad range of areas, have cutting-edge facilities and are internationally-renowned for our research and teaching.
- Seven of our researchers were included in the 2019 Thomson Reuters annual listing of researchers most cited in academic journals, ranked in the top one per cent of researchers in their field.

### Join a research community from 50+ countries

Deakin offers access to a globally-recognised research network. Collaborate with research partners nationally and internationally and present at prestigious conferences where you can form lifelong relationships with colleagues around the world.

### Flexible study options

As a Deakin research degree student you can enjoy flexible study options, including the ability to work off-campus and/or undertake your research part time. Deakin has research degree students living in other states and overseas. We bring students together with peers and supervisors, regardless of location.

### Research degree eligibility and entry pathways

Students wanting to enrol in a research degree at Deakin must have a demonstrated ability to undertake significant research in a defined area of interest. Your prior studies will have included advanced coursework in a relevant field, initial training in appropriate research methods and submission of a significant research component in a written report or comparable output. # Applying to Deakin

## How do I apply for a coursework degree?

We provide step-by-step guidance online to make applying to Deakin easy. And, with two or three study periods a year, the next intake is never far away. ## How do I apply for a research degree?

Use Deakin's online higher degree by research application form to apply for a research degree at [deakin.edu.au/research/become-a-research-student/how-to-apply-research-degrees](https://deakin.edu.au/research/become-a-research-student/how-to-apply-research-degrees). You'll need to attach proof of citizenship, academic transcripts, a research proposal, referee reports and other certified documents.

## Do you provide credit for past experience?

You may be able to reduce your overall study time and tuition cost by getting your work and previous study experience recognised as recognition of prior learning (RPL).

RPL, formerly known as advanced standing or credit transfer, includes formal learning (accredited qualifications) and informal learning (non-accredited learning or work experience). # What will it cost?

## What is the postgraduate course fee?

Tuition fees are based on the course, fee place and number of units you enrol in. Most of our postgraduate courses are full fee-paying places, although a selection of our postgraduate courses offer Commonwealth supported places (CSP). You can find course, unit and fee information using the course search tool at [deakin.edu.au/courses/find-a-course/postgraduate](https://deakin.edu.au/courses/find-a-course/postgraduate). Deakin also has a handy fee estimator. ## Fee types

There are two types of fee-paying places: Full fee-paying place and Commonwealth supported place (CSP). Full fee-paying places are places that aren't subsidised by the Government, so you pay the full cost of the course. As a domestic fee-paying student you may be eligible to defer payment of your fees through the Australian taxation system's FEE-HELP<sup>1</sup> loan program, which is an Australian Government scheme. Your employer may also consider assisting with the cost of study if the course is related to your current position.

CSP is a higher education place available to eligible domestic students, for which the University receives some Government funding. If you're offered a CSP, you'll only need to contribute part of the cost of your course. This is referred to as the 'student contribution', and varies depending on the units you enrol in. ## Can I defer paying fees?

While most postgraduate coursework degrees are full-fee paying, that doesn't mean you have to pay it all upfront. If you studied your undergraduate degree as a domestic student, you probably already know about HECS-HELP. Did you know there's a HECS equivalent for postgraduate study? FEE-HELP works on the same premise as HECS – the Australian Government covers your tuition fees as a loan and you pay it back through tax once you reach a taxable income threshold. ## How do I calculate my fee repayments?

More than three in four postgraduate students use Australia's FEE-HELP loan system to earn a degree with no upfront tuition fees<sup>2</sup>. ## How can I reduce costs?

### Get recognition for prior learning or industry experience and shorten your course

Postgraduate course length and cost can be reduced based on your previous qualifications and experience, including reducing many masters degrees from two years full time to one year full time. Refer to page 12 for details about recognition of prior learning.

### Look at possible tax benefits

When you enrol in a postgraduate course you may be eligible for an income tax deduction for your course fees and study-related expenses, such as your computer, books, stationery etc., or some of your travel expenses between home or work and university. The ATO can offer advice on claiming study expenses, but broadly, if your intended course is upskilling and directly relates to your work, you might qualify.

### Share your costs with your employer

If you're already working in the field, approach your employer with a proposal for postgraduate study as professional development. It's not uncommon for postgraduate students to have a cost-sharing arrangement with their employer. Upskilling is a benefit to the workplace, so it's worth asking.

### Professional practice degrees
