

The Graduation Ceremony

'Kim barne barre Wadawurrung Dja' Welcome to Wadawurrung Country

Deakin University would like to acknowledge the Wadawurrung People, the traditional custodians of the land and the Wathaurong community where this graduation ceremony is taking place. We pay our respects for their continued care of the land and further extend that respect to elders past and present.

Order of Ceremony

Processional music heralds the arrival of the Academic Procession for the graduation ceremony.

At the commencement of this music, graduands and guests are asked to stand and remain standing for the National Anthem.

The Master of Ceremonies will open proceedings and the Chancellor (or representative) will deliver the opening address. The Vice-Chancellor (or representative) will then introduce the guest speaker who will deliver the occasional address.

The Chancellor (or representative) will then make a formal declaration conferring the awards of the University on the graduates, both present and in absentia, and will invite graduates to proceed to the stage according to the order published in the program.

A Faculty Executive Dean (or representative) will read out the names of graduates being presented to the Chancellor (or representative).

At the conclusion of the presentation of the graduates, a representative of the graduating students will deliver a brief response.

The Vice-Chancellor (or representative) will deliver the closing address. Following the closing address, there will be a musical performance.

At the conclusion of the ceremony guests are requested to stand while the stage party and graduates leave the hall.

Refreshments will then be served in the marquee in the John Hay Courtyard.





The University Mace

Maces were originally medieval weapons carried by bodyguards to kings and sergeants-at-arms. Much later, the mace became of ceremonial rather than practical significance and organisations such as civic corporations and universities adopted the mace as a symbol of the rule of legal authority.

The University's mace is displayed at meetings of the University Council and on such ceremonial occasions as conferring ceremonies. The bearer of the mace, in academic processions, 'guards' the Chancellor. Deakin's mace was presented to the University by Mr Donald Thomson, Sir Wilfred Brookes and Mr Norman Stephen (Alcoa Australia).



The Academic Procession

In academic processions, the order of precedence on entry is from junior to most senior. The Chancellor, therefore, is the last member of the procession, followed by the mace-bearer. The Deakin Academic Procession and stage party usually consists of:

Academic Dress

Academic dress is an important reminder of the long history of universities in western civilisation. The three main elements of academic dress are the gown, the hood and the head-dress, which were all once articles of everyday outer dress. Both gowns and hoods, when in common use, were often lined and this lining was decorative, as well as practical. In medieval times, the higher the rank of the wearer, the more sumptuous the gown.

In universities there is still a difference in the apparel of scholars of various ranks reflecting the origins of the academic dress. Today's academic head-dress evolved from various hats and bonnets of earlier times. Deakin University's academic dress, like that of most Australian universities, derives from dress worn at the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge.

Deakin University Ceremonial Dress

Chancellor – a navy blue gown trimmed with gold bullion braid, sleeves trimmed with four gold ornaments and gold bullion braid around the bottom hem, a navy blue bonnet lined with gold satin, with gold braid and two gold metallic tassels.

Vice-Chancellor and President – a navy blue gown with five bars of gold bullion braid on the sleeves and a navy blue tudor bonnet identical to that of the Chancellor.

Alfred Deakin Professor

Academic staff who have been awarded the title Alfred Deakin Professor will wear academic regalia befitting their highest qualification as well as an Alfred Deakin Professor stole which will be worn over the top of the gown.

Deakin University Academic Dress

Higher Doctorate – a red gown with gold silk front facings finishing at the front yoke line, sleeves fully lined with gold silk and turned back at the front seam, together with a red hood lined with gold silk and a red bonnet with gold tassels.

Doctor of Philosophy – a royal blue gown with red silk front facings finishing at the front yoke line, sleeves fully lined with red silk and turned back at the front seam, together with a royal blue hood lined with red silk and a royal blue bonnet with red tassels.

Professional Doctorate – a royal blue gown with the relevant discipline colour silk front facings finishing at the front yoke line, sleeves fully lined with the relevant discipline colour silk and turned back at the front seam, together with a royal blue hood lined with silk of the relevant discipline colour, and a royal blue bonnet with blue tassels.

Master by Research – a navy blue master gown, Cambridge hood lined with silk of the relevant award colour and trimmed with two white pipes, colour is shown on both shoulders, and a navy blue trencher trimmed with white binding and white tassels.

Master by Coursework with Honours – a navy blue master gown, Cambridge hood lined with the appropriate coloured silk and trimmed with two white pipes, colour is shown on both shoulders, and a navy blue trencher with navy blue tassels.

Master by Coursework – a navy blue master gown, Cambridge hood lined with the appropriate coloured silk and trimmed with one white pipe, colour is shown on both shoulders, and a navy blue trencher with navy blue tassels.

Graduate Diploma – a navy blue bachelor gown, Oxford hood lined with the appropriate coloured silk and trimmed with one white pipe, colour is shown on the left shoulder only, and a navy blue trencher with navy blue tassels.

Graduate Certificate – a navy blue bachelor gown, Oxford hood lined with the appropriate coloured silk and trimmed with the same colour pipe, colour is shown on the left shoulder only, and a navy blue trencher with navy blue tassels.

Bachelor Degree with Honours – a navy blue bachelor gown, Oxford hood lined with the appropriate coloured silk and trimmed with two white pipes, colour is shown on the left shoulder only, and a navy blue trencher with navy blue tassels.

Bachelor Degree – a navy blue bachelor gown, Oxford hood lined with the appropriate coloured silk, colour is shown on the left shoulder only, and a navy blue trencher with navy blue tassels.

Associate Degree – a navy blue bachelor gown, Oxford hood lined with the appropriate coloured silk, colour is shown on the left shoulder only, and no trencher.

Diploma or Advanced Diploma – a navy blue bachelor gown, stole of the appropriate colour and no trencher.

Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Stole – a silk stole in the colours of the relevant Indigenous flag may be worn under the hood or stole of the relevant award.

Michael Cristiano is one of Australia's most highly acclaimed performers, composers and record producers. As a producer, his name can be found on numerous multi-platinum selling albums by such artists as The Seekers, Judith Durham, Silverchair, Andre Rieu, Mirusia and Gene Pitney amongst many other big names. He has performed as a didgeridoo soloist widely in Australia and also in New York, Jordan, Canada and New Zealand. Ron has performed for Queen Elizabeth II, Yusuf Islam (Cat Stevens), Sir Bob Geldoff and Muhammed Ali. Musical highlights include performing at the world premiere of American composer Phillip Glass' Voices for Didgeridoo,



The University

Alfred Deakin


Deakin University was named in honour of Alfred Deakin (1856–1919), a remarkable Australian statesman, leading figure of the federation movement and three-time Prime Minister of Australia.

Alfred Deakin was a man of broad vision. Praised as a political leader, he was an outstanding orator, accomplished lawyer, a journalist, poet, an intellectual and an idealist motivated by a sense of duty to his country.

The son of English migrants, Alfred Deakin was born and educated in Melbourne, studying law at the University of Melbourne. He embarked upon a career in journalism with *The Age* and was a prolific reader of literature, philosophy, law and science, earning most of his income as a writer of social and political commentaries.

In 1879, Alfred Deakin launched his political career and became a successful Liberal candidate for the Victorian Parliament. A believer in democratic social reform, he became the acknowledged leader of the Australian Federation movement in Victoria. He was an active campaigner, a delegate at the federal conventions, member of the constitutional drafting committee and colonial representative in London.

Alfred Deakin was Deputy Prime Minister and Attorney-General in Australia's first government and, in 1903, he became Prime Minister. His many achievements include the establishment of the High Court of Australia, the introduction of labour and social reforms, the promulgation of new technologies such as irrigation and wireless telegraphy, support for the exploration of Antarctica and the introduction of financial support for Australian writers.

The Deakin Story



1974–1984

Deakin was established by the Victorian Parliament in 1974 as a 'university in the Geelong area'. Deakin began teaching on 1 April 1977.

Deakin University was named after Alfred Deakin, who served as Prime Minister three times between 1903 and 1910 and was a significant figure in the achievement of Australian Federation.

When it was established, Deakin incorporated two existing Geelong-based institutions – the Geelong State College and the Gordon Institute of Technology.

Deakin had approximately 2500 students in its first year (1977), rising to 4800 in 1980.

By 1984, Deakin had consolidated its operations at the Geelong Wairn Ponds Campus.

1990–1991

Deakin's growth outside Geelong began in 1990 when it amalgamated with the Warrnambool Institute of Advanced Education. This continued in 1991 when it amalgamated with Victoria College, which operated from Burwood, Toorak and Clayton.

1993

Deakin was one of the first Australian universities to embrace professional and continuing education to corporate clients, establishing Deakin Australia (now DeakinCo.) in 1993.

1996

In the mid-1970s, the disused woolstores on the waterfront in central Geelong was one site considered and rejected for the proposed university that was to become Deakin. In 1996, this idea came to fruition with the opening of the Geelong Waterfront Campus.

2008

In 2008, the Deakin University School of Medicine opened, becoming Victoria's first rural and regional medical school.

2012

February 2012 saw the first intake of students in the new Bachelor of Vision Science/Master of Optometry degree.



2013–2019

During a period of rapid growth between 2013 and 2019, new buildings and major improvements included:

- the iconic gateway building at the Melbourne Burwood Campus
- Centre for Advanced Design Engineering Training at the Geelong Waurin Ponds Campus
- expansion of student accommodation across all campuses.

2014

In March 2014, the University declared it would be a smoke-free environment.

In May, the \$34 million globally unique cutting-edge carbon fibre research and innovation facility, Carbon Nexus, officially opened at the Geelong Waurin Ponds Campus.

In December, Deakin celebrated its 200,000th graduate.

2016

In January 2016, John Stanhope AM assumed the position of Deakin's Chancellor, taking over from David Morgan who served as Chancellor for 10 years.

In April, the Deakin Business School received accreditation by The Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business International, the longest serving global accrediting body for business schools in the world.

In August, the Deakin University Community Bank® initiative with Bendigo Bank was launched – the first collaboration of its kind between a university and a financial institution.

Deakin partnered with FutureLearn to offer full degrees online and short free courses through FutureLearn's global platform.

The Deakin Story *continued*

2017

In 2017 Deakin University and LeMond Composites joined forces in a \$58m deal to revolutionise the use of carbon fibre across the world.

Deakin opened two new Institutes: the Institute for Health Transformation and the Deakin Applied Artificial Intelligence Institute.

Also in this year, the expanded TERI-Deakin Nanobiotech Centre was opened by the Prime Minister.

In 2017 Deakin ranked 213 globally by the prestigious Academic Ranking of World universities.

2018

In 2018 Deakin officially launched its Innovation Hub ManuFutures.

Deakin partnered with AusNet Services to establish a 7.25 MW smart microgrid at its Geelong Wauran Ponds campus.

The 2018 Excellence in Research for Australia rankings saw Deakin performing at or above world standard in 100% of its research (up from 90% in 2015).

2019

In March 2019, Deakin celebrated 25 years of engagement in India. Deakin was the first international university to establish an office in India.

In July, Deakin's seventh Vice-Chancellor, Professor Iain Martin begins in the role, taking over from Professor Jane den Hollander AO who served for nine years.

Also in this year, Deakin appointed its inaugural Pro Vice-Chancellor Indigenous Strategy, Professor Mark Rose.

Deakin was awarded an Athena SWAN Bronze Institution Award in recognition of its commitment to advancing the careers of women, trans and gender diverse individuals in STEMM disciplines; in the same year, Deakin received the 'Employer of Choice for Gender Equality' citation for the 13th consecutive year.

2020

In December 2020, the University launched its new ten-year strategic plan, *Deakin 2030: Ideas to Impact*.

The Hydrogen Training Testbed at the Hycel Technology Hub in Warrnambool was launched.

In March, Deakin launched NIKERI – the National Indigenous Knowledges Education Research Innovation Institute. The following year, the Vice-Chancellor's Indigenous Advisory Council was established.

2021

In 2021, Deakin established ten platforms for discovery and innovation, funded by the Victorian Higher Education State Investment Fund, the Commonwealth Government, Deakin and its partners.

In April, Deakin launched the Renewable Energy Microgrid at the Waurn Ponds Campus, the largest ever solar farm on an Australian university, which will help to achieve Deakin's goal of being carbon neutral by 2025 and carbon negative by 2030.

Between 2019 and 2021, significant infrastructure developments included:

- Nyaal at Waurn Ponds, an immersive teaching facility, and
- the new Law Building at Burwood.

The Campuses

Deakin is a large university with all the accompanying resources and infrastructure, but its campuses are small enough to retain their own character and sense of community. Each of our campuses offers a unique atmosphere – from the inspiring architecture and bayside appeal of our Geelong Waterfront Campus, to the cafe culture of our Melbourne Burwood Campus, the spectacular coastal location at our Warrnambool Campus or the mix of activity and open space at our Geelong Waurin Ponds Campus.

Melbourne Burwood Campus

This thriving campus is Deakin's largest. Located 15km from the Melbourne CBD, it boasts open and inviting spaces for socialising and studying, innovative architecture and wireless locations. An ambitious building program has resulted in a new complex of spacious modern buildings, including the gateway building situated on Burwood Highway and the state-of-the-art Indoor Exercise and Sport Science Teaching Building, completed in 2019. Refurbishment of older buildings, a library extension, expansion of residential accommodation, a 250-seat lecture theatre and a large landscaped central courtyard have all created a campus that is well-resourced and well-designed. The campus is home to the Deakin University Art Gallery and the Deakin *Motion.Lab*, a state-of-the-art motion capture facility that produces 3D animation and special effects, similar to those used in films such as *Avatar* and *The Lord of the Rings*.

Geelong Waurin Ponds Campus

Deakin's Geelong Waurin Ponds Campus is located 8km from the centre of the historic port city of Geelong, which is 72km south-west of Melbourne. Geelong is Victoria's largest regional city with a population close to 225,000.

Set among extensive landscaped grounds, the Geelong Waurin Ponds Campus boasts hectares of native trees, grassy lawns, lakes and avenues. There are many specialist facilities at this campus, including an outstandingly resourced library, audiovisual production studios, research laboratories and an extensive computer centre. The Waurin Ponds Estate provides first-class conference and convention facilities.

Also located at the Geelong Waurin Ponds Campus is the Geelong Future Economy Precinct. The Precinct draws on over 15 years of investment in developing the research expertise and facilities in areas such as carbon and ultra-fine fibre, nanotechnology and composite materials, as well as robotics, pattern recognition and data analytics. Some of Australia's, and the world's, leading advanced manufacturers now call the Precinct home.

Geelong Waterfront Campus

The Geelong Waterfront Campus is Deakin's newest campus, located on the beautiful foreshore of Corio Bay in the central business district of Geelong. Originally built in 1893, the historic woolstore building has undergone extensive redevelopment to create a modern and impressive campus centre.

The centrepiece of the campus is Costa Hall, a concert hall of international standard, where a number of university ceremonies, cultural performances and community functions take place, including Deakin's graduation ceremonies.

Also located at this campus is the refurbished Sally Walker Building, which houses the Alfred Deakin Prime Ministerial Library and the Alfred Deakin Research Institute. The Alfred Deakin Research Institute is an interdisciplinary teaching and research centre covering political science, public policy and governance, international relations, globalisation, journalism and communications.

Warrnambool Campus

Warrnambool is the commercial, cultural and educational heart of south-west Victoria. A premier tourist destination, it boasts stunning coastlines, renowned surf beaches and is the state's foremost site for whale watching.

Located 262km from Melbourne, the campus is set on 114 sprawling hectares on the banks of the picturesque Hopkins River. Our lecturers, students and staff at the Warrnambool Campus form a real community, where communication is open and informal.

Campus facilities include a comprehensive library, excellent teaching and learning spaces, a cafe, gymnasium, bookshop and golf course. Located just 5km from the centre of Warrnambool, the campus ensures that Deakin contributes to the vitality of the local community in the tradition of many university cities.



NIKERI Institute

Deakin University is proud to have the largest number of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students of any Victorian university.

The National Indigenous Knowledges Education Research and Innovation (NIKERI) Institute commenced in 1991 and offers programs that are structured around off-campus community-based delivery, supported by on-campus intensive study blocks and complemented by local tutors in their home communities.

This approach to course delivery promotes access and equity for Indigenous Australian students. Students from all areas of the country – rural, remote and metropolitan, and across all age ranges, particularly mature age – are able to undertake studies without compromising their family and community obligations.

In November 2019, the Institute won the prestigious Dreamtime Education Award for ‘Education Institute of the Year’.

Prizes and Awards

Alfred Deakin Professor

Council established the title of Alfred Deakin Professor to recognise members of Deakin University professoriate who have made a sustained, high level contribution to research at Deakin. The title is the highest honour the University can bestow on a member of academic staff.

The title of Alfred Deakin Professor will be conferred upon Professor Liz Johnson in recognition of her leadership in education and her very significant and sustained contribution to the success of the University.



Professor Liz Johnson, Deputy Vice-Chancellor Academic

Professor Liz Johnson leads Deakin's ambitious Education and Employability strategy, including the drive to premium digital learning and outstanding student experience. Professor Johnson's portfolio includes Indigenous Strategy, Academic Governance and Standards, Graduate Employment, Faculty Services, Student Services, the Deakin Library, Deakin Learning Futures, the Dean of Students, and the Centre for Research in Assessment and Digital Learning (CRADLE).

As Deputy Vice-Chancellor Education from 2019-2021, Professor Johnson steered teaching and learning at Deakin through the disruption of the COVID pandemic, building from extensive projects on Deakin's online learning environment, teaching innovation and course development and staff capability for learning and teaching. During this period, she sponsored re-imagining and restructure of Deakin's professional services for students and Faculties, substantive renewal of teaching and learning design and an institution-wide transformation to online assessment.

Professor Johnson has led whole-of-institution curriculum reform projects at Deakin University as Pro-Vice-Chancellor Teaching and Learning (2014–2018) and previously at La Trobe University.

She has led nationally funded projects, including *Successful WIL in Science*, on work-integrated learning in science faculties, funded by the Office of the Chief Scientist of Australia and the Department of Education and Training.

She was awarded an OLT National Teaching Fellowship in 2012 and worked with the Australian Council of Deans of Science to establish the ACDS Teaching and Learning Centre and as its inaugural Director.

Professor Johnson trained as a plant biochemist and taught university biochemistry for over 30 years. In 2006 she was awarded citations for outstanding contributions to teaching and learning from La Trobe University and from the Carrick Institute.

In recognition of her ongoing contributions to biochemistry education, in 2007 she received the prestigious Invitrogen Education award from the Australian Society for Biochemistry and Molecular Biology (ASBMB), and the 2007 Vice-Chancellor's award for teaching from La Trobe University.

She now researches and publishes in areas associated with curriculum renewal, work-integrated learning and digital credentialing.



Professor Alexander Newman

Alex Newman is one of Australia's leading researchers in management and is presently Head of the Department of Management at Deakin Business School. Since obtaining his PhD in 2010 Alex has published over 100 refereed articles in leading international journals. His work has attracted over 12,000 citations with an h-index of over 60.

In recognition of his distinguished publishing record Alex was highlighted by Stanford researchers as being in the top 1% of management scholars in the years 2020 and 2021.

He was also recognised by the Australian Research Magazine as the field leader in the human resources and organizations discipline in 2021, and one of only 40 rising stars across the whole of Australian academia in 2019 and 2021.

His works spans the fields of organizational psychology, vocational psychology, human resource management, leadership, entrepreneurship and business ethics. He has published in top management journals including The Leadership Quarterly, Journal of Applied Psychology, Journal of Organizational Behavior, Journal of Vocational Behavior, Entrepreneurship Theory & Practice and Human Resource Management.

Alex's work has had significant social impact. In 2019 he established the Deakin Centre for Refugee Employment, Advocacy, Training and Education (CREATE). CREATE is a research centre that undertakes research to improve understanding of how to support people from a refugee background to access education and training, and obtain employment. Through his work at CREATE, Alex has been part of a team that designed career clinics for people from a refugee background which support over 200 people per year to seek employment.

His work is supported by philanthropic grants, industry funding and research funding from other sources such as the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade, the National Careers Institute and the Australian Research Council.

Over the last 18 months, Alex's work at CREATE has resulted in eight major national and international awards. These include an Australian Financial Review Higher Education Award in the equity and opportunity category, an AACSB Innovations that Inspire Award, a PIEOneer International Education Award for Championing Diversity, an Australian Business Dean's Council Research Excellence Award, an Emerald Real Impact Award, a Green Gown Award in the benefitting society category and a Victorian Multicultural Award for Excellence in the community innovation category.

Alex has a strong track of service to the academic community. He was elected as Representative at Large of the Careers Division of the Academy of Management in 2021 for a three year period, and was Chair of the Global Committee of the Organizational Behavior Division from 2018 to 2021. He was also Chair of the International Network of the Australian Business Deans Council from 2018–2021. He has also been appointed to editorial roles at several leading journals. In recognition of his academic leadership, in 2020 Alex was shortlisted as a finalist in the Australian Financial Review Higher Education Award 'emerging leader' category.

Council established the title of Alfred Deakin Professor to recognise members of Deakin University professoriate who have made a sustained, high level contribution to research at Deakin. The title is the highest honour the University can bestow on a member of academic staff.

The title of Alfred Deakin Professor will be conferred upon Professor Kon Mouzakis for an outstanding and sustained contribution to furthering the University's research and scholarship in the field of artificial intelligence and digital technology.



Professor Kon Mouzakis

Professor Kon Mouzakis is a Professor of Software and Technology Innovation at Deakin University. He is a Decision Support and Software Development expert with over 30 years of experience and currently holds the position of Inaugural Co-Director of the Applied Artificial Intelligence Institute (A²I²). In 2018, Kon was appointed as the Director, Australian Research Council, Industrial Transformation Research Hub for Digital Enhanced Living, which is funded jointly by the Australian government and Industry Partners.

Over the last 5 years, Kon has attracted over \$15 million in contract R&D and consulting activities. He has developed software solutions and concept demonstrators for a wide range of organisations, including the Alfred Hospital, Dementia Australia, Transport Accident Commission, Cancer Council Australia and The Department of Defence. In collaboration with the Alfred Hospital's Trauma Centre, he developed the Trauma Reception and Resuscitation Decision Support tool. This was a world first development that reduced the number of errors that clinicians made in the first 30 minutes of patient arrival at the Trauma Centre at the Alfred Hospital. Kon is an advisor to the Trauma Centre of the Alfred Hospital in Information Technology Decision Support.

Kon is a tenured senior academic at Deakin University and, prior to this, at Swinburne University of Technology where he taught and researched in the areas of mobile technology, usability of complex systems and interface design. Kon is also acknowledged as the founder of the Industry Based Learning (IBL) Program for IT students at Swinburne University of Technology. During this time, he placed more than 3,000 students in industry to complete an IBL or Internship placement.

The Occasional Address will be delivered by Ms Carmel Guerra OAM.

Carmina (Carmel) Guerra OAM is the founding Chief Executive Officer of the Centre for Multicultural Youth (CMY), the first and largest organisation in Australia to work exclusively with migrant and refugee young people. Carmel also led the development of the Multicultural Youth Advocacy Network Australia, the national peak body representing the rights and interests of young people from refugee and migrant backgrounds, which she now chairs.

Carmel trained as a youth worker and has qualifications in Public Administration and Human Resources Management. Over a career of 30 years, Carmel has been a committed agent for social change and policy reform, with her work resulting in a national support system for the multicultural young people and families who seek to build a life in Australia.

Carmel has a deep passion for social justice and is highly regarded for her knowledge, expertise and fearless advocacy on multicultural youth issues.

Under Carmel's leadership, CMY grew from a group of youth workers who, through their own lived-experiences growing up in the 70s and 80s, envisioned a society where a person's name, language, colour of skin, or religious beliefs did not determine the course of their life. Today, CMY is recognised both within Australia and internationally as an industry leader on multicultural youth and family issues, which are now at the forefront of national social policy agendas after years of tireless advocacy.

Carmel sits on numerous advisory committees and is currently a member of the Victorian Youth Parole Board. Carmel's services to multicultural youth and their families has been recognised through numerous accolades including: the Medal of the Order of Australia (2016), the Victorian Premier's Award for Community Harmony (2015), the Harvard Non-Profit Fellowship (2015), the Victorian Women's Honour Roll (2005), and the Centenary Medal (2005). Carmel has spoken on multicultural youth issues at international forums such as the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees in Geneva and the Commonwealth Youth Minister's Conference.

Prizes and Awards

Alfred Deakin Professor

Council established the title of Alfred Deakin Professor to recognise members of Deakin University professoriate who have made a sustained, high level contribution to research at Deakin. The title is the highest honour the University can bestow on a member of academic staff.

The title of Alfred Deakin Professor will be conferred upon Professor Andrea Witcomb for an outstanding and sustained contribution to furthering the University's research and scholarship in the field of cultural heritage and museum studies.



Professor Andrea Witcomb

Professor Witcomb has made a distinguished and sustained contribution to the education, research and impact ambitions of Deakin. An outstanding scholar of international renown, her research capability and leadership has consistently developed capacity in others, and in service of society locally and globally.

Professor Witcomb has been a Professor of Cultural Heritage and Museum Studies since 2014. She brings an interdisciplinary approach to her research, locating her work at the intersection of history, museology and cultural studies, enabling

our understanding of the role objects and exhibitions in contributing to positive change within society. Professor Witcomb has authored more than 50 peer reviewed articles and book chapters alongside two monographs and three edited books, delivered more than 40 invited keynotes and presentations, most recently in the United Kingdom, China, Estonia, Germany and Qatar.

In 2016 she was invited as a keynote speaker for the 50th anniversary conference of the Museum Studies program at the University of Leicester in the UK, which is the oldest and most recognised program in the World. In 2018, her contribution to her field was recognised by naming the annual conference of the International Council of Museums International Committee for Museums and Collections of Ethnography (ICME) after her first book, *Reimagining Museums*. The conference, held at the National Museum of Estonia in Tartu was opened by a keynote address given by Professor Witcomb. Her esteem and impact in her field is evidenced by having been awarded six successful Australian Research Council grants on which she was Chief Investigator. This distinguished track record is further evidenced by her appointment to the ARC College of Experts in 2020, a role in which she provides leadership for organising the peer review of grant submissions and collaborates with her peers in making the final recommendations for awards in multiple ARC schemes across the humanities and social sciences.

Throughout her career, Professor Witcomb has developed and sustained strong partnerships with government and industry organisations, through which she extends the impact of her research. Between 2011 and 2021, she served on the Cultural Heritage Committee of the National Trust of Australia. She has also served on several Museum committees including Museums Australia and the Western Australian Maritime Museum. Through these appointments, Professor Witcomb has informed and influenced policy and the strategic direction of cultural heritage collections and collecting nationally. She has just been appointed to the Heritage Collections Committee at the National Trust of Australia (Victoria) and is an Honorary Research Fellow with Museums Victoria.

Known for her collaborative and enabling approach, Professor Witcomb has made an outstanding contribution to research training and capability at Deakin. She has supervised 15 PhD candidates to completion spanning cultural heritage and museum studies and is currently supervising another 5 students. Her approach to supervision is always collaborative, intent on providing a rich intellectual environment for her students and opportunities for supervision to more junior colleagues. She has also made an outstanding contribution to teaching and learning. Deakin's cultural heritage and museum studies program is the second longest running of its kind in Australia and has developed a global reputation for excellence. Professor Witcomb has been a key leader in the continued impact and excellence of these education programs, and Deakin's global reputation in cultural heritage and museum studies. Professor Witcomb has taught postgraduate cultural heritage and museum studies for more than fifteen years, during which time she has led teaching and learning innovation, and provided academic leadership in the discipline.

These achievements have taken place alongside significant service roles for the University. From 2010 until 2015, Professor Witcomb served as the Director, Cultural Heritage Centre for Asia and the Pacific,

Deakin's flagship research centre building upon and extending the University's global reputation for education and research excellence in the field. She was elected by her peers to the Faculty of Arts and Education Board from 2017–2020. From 2012 until 2020, Professor Witcomb served as the Deputy Director of the Alfred Deakin Institute (formerly the Alfred Deakin Research Institute) with responsibilities spanning governance and research and researcher development. As Deputy Director Research in the Alfred Deakin Institute, Professor Witcomb established and implemented best-practice mentoring and researcher development programs with a focus on enabling early career researchers to successfully apply for ARC DECRA Fellowships. In 2018 she received the Faculty of Arts and Education Research Mentoring Award in recognition of this work.

Continuing her distinguished contribution to the University, Professor Witcomb was appointed Associate Dean Research, Faculty of Arts and Education in 2020. In this capacity, she has overseen significant advancements in Faculty research strategy, with a focus on the growth of quality, participation and impact. She is also an elected member of Deakin's Academic Board as well as the Deputy Chair of the University's Research and Research Training Committee.

‘Comparison of Shoulder Arthroplasty Outcomes between Private and Public Settings.’

Summary

This thesis explored the influence of healthcare setting on shoulder arthroplasty outcomes between private and public patients. The primary outcome was surgical revision rate. Secondary outcomes were assessed through multiple functional measures. The findings demonstrated no difference in surgical revision rate, but significantly better pre and post-operative functional measures in private patients.

Prizes and Awards

Alfred Deakin Professor

Council established the title of Alfred Deakin Professor to recognise members of Deakin University professoriate who have made a sustained, high level contribution to research at Deakin. The title is the highest honour the University can bestow on a member of academic staff.

The title of Alfred Deakin Professor will be conferred upon Professor Rachel Huxley in recognition of her leadership of the Faculty of Health and her significant and sustained contribution to the success of the University.



Professor Rachel Huxley

Professor Rachel Huxley is an internationally renowned cardiovascular epidemiologist who has made, and continues to make, significant contributions to our understanding of how risk factors impact on disease risk at both the population and individual level. After obtaining her DPhil in Epidemiology and Public Health from St John's College, Oxford in 2001 she relocated to Sydney as a Senior Research Fellow at the George Institute for Global Health during which time she established several major consortia of cohort studies designed to better understand the role of major and modifiable risk factors on health.

From there, she moved to take up a position within the Division of Epidemiology and Community Health at the University of Minnesota in 2009. After surviving several sub-zero winters Rachel moved back to Australia with her young family to the University of Queensland where she held the Chair in Epidemiology. In 2019, Professor Huxley moved to Deakin where she became the Executive Dean for the Faculty of Health.

Professor Huxley's has spent two decades quantifying the impacts of major risk factors on disease outcomes and in particular in furthering our understanding of how sex and ethnicity modify these risks.

Her major contributions to epidemiology include three seminal papers published in the preeminent medical journal, *The Lancet*. The first in 2001 was a robust refutation of the fetal-origins hypothesis – a novel popular theory about the early life origins of chronic disease that dominated the epidemiological literature in the 1990s and 2000s.

The second paper was published a decade later, which convincingly demonstrated that cigarette smoking posed a far greater health hazard to women than men – even though women smoke fewer and at less intensity than men. In a related editorial, *The Lancet* acknowledged the imperative for researchers to power studies sufficiently to be able to conduct sex and gender analyses as well as the need for publishers to require authors to provide disaggregated results.

The third paper, published in 2015, for the first time articulated how women with type 1 diabetes have a much greater risk of dying prematurely compared with similarly affected men, at all ages and all other risk factors being equal.

Since then, Rachel has led a team which aims to understand what the physiological, behavioural and social determinants are underpinning these sex differences and how they can be mitigated. In particular, her work has led to a growing awareness that structural biases in the Australian healthcare system contributes significantly to a woman's greater propensity to worse vascular outcomes compared with men. Her most recent research builds on these previous studies and in 2020 she was awarded highly competitive funding from the NHMRC to lead a study that examines through using linked data how and when sex and gender disparities in access to healthcare contributes to a woman's excess risk of having a heart attack compared with men.

Professor Huxley has published more than 220 research articles in her career, has been cited more than 33,000 times and has a Scopus h-index of 70. She has been the recipient of several personal fellowships including from the International Society for Hypertension and the Heart Foundation of Australia and has received competitive funding from the NHMRC, Diabetes Australia and the Heart Foundation of Australia to support her research. Professor Huxley is passionate about academic leadership, mentorship and in fostering the next generation of researchers. She has supervised numerous Postdoctoral, Doctoral and Masters' students over the past two decades, many of whom have gone on to become independently successful academics around the world.

Professor Catherine Bennett

The Occasional Address will be delivered by Professor Catherine Bennett.

Professor Bennett's career in epidemiology, applied biostatistics and physical anthropology cuts across health, university and government sectors, including working on outbreak preparedness and response with NSW Health and the Australian Government. After working as Olympic Public Health Coordinator for Northern Sydney in 2000, Catherine returned to academia and was Associate Professor in Epidemiology and Director of Population Health Practice with the Melbourne School of Population and Global Health before taking up the inaugural Chair in Epidemiology at Deakin in late 2009.

Soon after joining Deakin she was appointed Head of the School of Health and Social Development, a role she maintained for three 3-year terms. Under her leadership, the School grew from a cluster of discipline teams thrown together as part of a faculty restructure into a strong, research-intensive, cohesive and confident school with a powerful sense of identity and purpose. By the end of headship, HSD was ranked in the top 100 Public Health schools in the world.

Catherine is now the elected staff member on Deakin University Council, and the incoming Director of the Determinants of Health Domain in the Institute for Health Transformation. Her own research focuses on community transmission of infectious diseases, and Catherine is involved in a range of COVID-19 projects, including global analyses of excess deaths, public health risk communication, contact tracing methods and COVID-safe protocols.

Catherine has been a leading public analyst during the COVID-19 response, keynote speaker, and advisor to industry, governments, and institutions globally. She is now recognised globally for her COVID-19 work as an influential leader in pandemic analyses and debate.

Alfred Deakin Professor

Council established the title of Alfred Deakin Professor to recognise members of Deakin University professoriate who have made a sustained, high level contribution to research at Deakin. The title is the highest honour the University can bestow on a member of academic staff.

The title of Alfred Deakin Professor will be conferred upon Professor Catherine Bennett for an outstanding and sustained contribution to furthering the University's research and scholarship in the field of public health, in particular, epidemiology.



Professor Catherine Bennett

Professor Bennett's career in epidemiology, applied biostatistics and physical anthropology cuts across health, university and government sectors, including working on outbreak preparedness and response with NSW Health and the Australian Government.

After working as Olympic Public Health Coordinator for Northern Sydney in 2000, Catherine returned to academia and was Associate Professor in Epidemiology and Director of Population Health Practice with the Melbourne School of Population and Global Health before taking up the inaugural Chair in Epidemiology at Deakin in late 2009.

Soon after joining Deakin she was appointed Head of the School of Health and Social Development, a role she maintained for three 3-year terms. Under her leadership, the School grew from a cluster of discipline teams thrown together as part of a faculty restructure into a strong, research-intensive, cohesive and confident school with a powerful sense of identity and purpose. By the end of headship, HSD was ranked in the top 100 Public Health schools in the world.

Catherine is now the elected staff member on Deakin University Council, and the incoming Director of the Determinants of Health Domain in the Institute for Health Transformation. Her own research focuses on community transmission of infectious diseases, and Catherine is involved in a range of COVID-19 projects, including global analyses of excess deaths, public health risk communication, contact tracing methods and COVID-safe protocols.

Catherine has been a leading public analyst during the COVID-19 response, keynote speaker, and advisor to industry, governments, and institutions globally. She is now recognised globally for her COVID-19 work as an influential leader in pandemic analyses and debate.

Alfred Deakin Professor

The title of Alfred Deakin Professor will be conferred upon Professor Sarah McNaughton for an outstanding and sustained contribution to furthering the University's research and scholarship in the field of nutrition and dietetics.



Professor Sarah McNaughton

Alfred Deakin Professor Sarah McNaughton is a public health nutritionist in the Institute for Physical Activity and Nutrition (IPAN) and has made significant and sustained contributions to Deakin University and the discipline of nutrition and dietetics over the last 20 years. She joined Deakin University in 2005 after completing her PhD at the University of Queensland in 2003, and a postdoctoral position at the MRC Centre for Human Nutrition Research (Cambridge, UK).

She has received funding from National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC), Australian Research Council (ARC), Heart Foundation, Diabetes Australia Research Trust and World Cancer Research Fund including 4 nationally competitive research fellowships.

Professor McNaughton leads an internationally recognised research program that focuses on the role of foods, eating patterns and dietary patterns in health and wellbeing and the translation of dietary patterns research into practice and policy, underpinned by innovative methodologies creating a paradigm shift in the way population diets are assessed. Her research on diet quality and dietary patterns has informed national and international dietary guidelines, position statements and local, national and international policy documents.

She also led the development of national research infrastructure for the field of nutrition and dietetics across Australia (ASA24-Australia), partnering with the US National Cancer Institute resulting in enhanced research capacity and facilitating national and international collaborations, and cross-disciplinary and multisite studies.

Her work has resulted in multiple awards and distinctions including the 2020 Nutrition Society of Australia (NSA) Medal, 2016 Nutrition Society of Australia Mid-Career Travel Award, the 2009 Nutrition Society of Australia Research Award and in 2018 she was made a fellow of Dietitians Australia. She was also awarded the 2017 Deakin University Vice-Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Research Supervision and the 2010 Deakin University's Vice-Chancellor's Award for Outstanding Contribution to Research (Early Career Researcher).

She has made significant contributions to Deakin University as a member of Academic Board (2018–21), Deputy Director of Institute for Physical Activity and Nutrition (2020–21), School of Exercise and Nutrition Sciences Executive Group (2016–21), Discipline Leader for Dietetics (2015–20) and Higher Degrees by Research Coordinator on two occasions. She has served on numerous other committees including the Science and Society Network, IPAN Executive Committee, Faculty Research and Research Training Committee, and Faculty Board.

She is committed to building research capacity and the next generation of health researchers. She is currently Head of Early and Mid-career Researcher Development for IPAN, and is a mentor for IPAN, the School of Exercise and Nutrition Sciences, Dietitians Australia and the Nutrition Society of Australia. She has mentored over 20 academics and supervised 13 PhD students, 9 Honours students and 5 Masters students and all have transitioned to successful careers in research, health or government positions including multiple research fellowships.

She has served on over 25 national and international committees and advisory groups including for the World Health Organization, NHMRC, Australian Chronic Disease Prevention Alliance, Australian Academy of Science, Oceanic Nutrition Leadership Program, Council of Deans of Nutrition & Dietetics (Australia and New Zealand), Heart Foundation and Nutrition Australia. Her expertise and leadership in nutrition and dietetics was acknowledged in September 2021, when she was appointed Chair of the NHMRC Australian Dietary Guidelines Expert Committee.


