

How to preference courses with a regional and remote entry

In order to address workforce shortages in regional and remote areas, our established **Regional and Remote Entry Scheme** aims to attract more regional and rural students into courses at our Geelong and Warrnambool campuses by offering an alternative entry pathway.

The entry scheme is available to Year 12 students who are undertaking their schooling at a regional or remote secondary school (including schools in the City of Greater Geelong).

We are excited to announce the scheme has been extended to include the **Bachelor of Occupational Therapy**, which will be available at both Geelong Waterfront and Warrnambool from T1 2024.

Eligible applicants may receive up to a 10 aggregate point adjustment towards their entry score for admission to the courses listed below:

- Bachelor of Exercise and Sport Science
- Bachelor of Exercise and Sport Science/Bachelor of Business (Sport Management)
- Bachelor of Exercise and Sport Science/Bachelor of Nutrition Science
- Bachelor of Nutrition Science/Bachelor of Commerce
- Bachelor of Medical Imaging
- Bachelor of Occupational Therapy
- Bachelor of Vision Science/Master of Optometry
- Bachelor of Social Work

The courses available as part of the Regional and Remote Entry Scheme have two different VTAC codes (the main entry and the regional and remote entry). It is important for your students to understand how to preference the courses in the correct order.

Students should preference the main entry first and the regional and remote entry second. This assists in ensuring that if eligible students enter via the main entry they will leave spots available at a lower ATAR for further regional and remote students.

For example: a student wanting to apply for the Bachelor of Medical Imaging would preference as below;

- 1st preference Bachelor of Medical Imaging 1400310211
- 2nd preference Bachelor of Medical Imaging (Regional and Remote) 1400310481

Please note, the Regional and Remote Entry Scheme is separate to Deakin's Regional Access Scheme (which is for students from any location intending to study at Warrnambool or Geelong).

Faculty of Business and Law

New in 2024, Deakin's Bachelor of Laws/Bachelor of Politics, Philosophy and Economics

An exciting new course offered at Deakin from 2024 provides an opportunity for students to develop specialised knowledge of how law, business, government and consumers shape society. Studying this unique combination allows students to graduate with a practical skill set to enact change.

Students now have the opportunity to complement an industry-leading legal education with an in-depth understanding of how power, incentives and ethics influence real-world decisions. By studying Deakin's new combined Bachelor of Laws/Bachelor of Politics, Philosophy and Economics, students gain a unique opportunity to develop knowledge of political systems, economic ways of thinking and ethical and moral principles alongside a solid foundation of legal skills from Deakin's Law School.

With an emphasis on developing analytical thinking, this course allows space for deep and creative thinking while building tangible skills that enable graduates to make an impact on society. Real-world learning is embedded in the



course with opportunities for students to work on real cases at Deakin Law Clinic. Other options include a range of practical experiences, including internships, volunteer placements and study tours. Through both streams, there's the opportunity to collaborate on team-based industry and community projects, and to take part in our global experiential learning programs.

This course opens a range of unique career opportunities. Graduates will have a strong foundation across all major areas of law practice and may consider work in politics, policy analysis, diplomacy, international relations, business, economics, consulting, media and much more.

All new Bachelor of Criminology/Bachelor of Business double degree

Do your students want to understand the legal and ethical implications of business practices? They can analyse and address real-world problems where criminology and business intersect by studying Deakin's Bachelor of Criminology/Bachelor of Business.

Knowledge of business fundamentals, the Australian criminal justice system and a deep understanding of the causes and impacts of crime will present graduates with a range of unique career opportunities.

This four-year full-time course is offered at Burwood (Melbourne), Waurn Ponds (Geelong) and online. Your students will have the opportunity to study where and when it suits them. Deakin's criminology course is the most established in Australia. Our curriculum has been developed in conjunction with professional bodies including Victoria Police, the Department of Justice and Community Safety Victoria and the Australian Institute of Professional Intelligence Officers.

By combining criminology core units with a choice of electives and business majors, this course allows for flexibility and the opportunity to personalise the degree. Students will develop strong analytical skills to interpret trends relating to crime and business, learning how to examine policies that will impact institutions.

There are work integrated learning opportunities including internships, volunteering, mentoring and overseas study experiences.

With complementary business expertise, students will graduate with sought after skills tailored to their career goals. They'll develop an entrepreneurial mindset and career enhancing critical thinking skills, integral for decision making for organisations from government to private business. Career opportunities include; criminologist, business development manager, policy advisor, crime trends analyst and more.

We caught up with Callum to ask a few questions about his experiences so far:

How have you found the move from Portland to Melbourne, and why did you decide to live on Residence (Res)?
