Gain a comprehensive understanding of the political forces that shape the world, and graduate with two degrees that prepare you for a global career.

Then, explore global governance, IR theory, international politics and security and strategy in the masters component of your dual degree.

## Specialisations

- conflict and security
- diplomacy and activism
- human rights and international law.

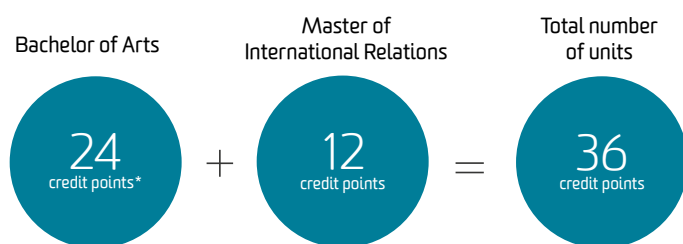

## Entry requirements

Applicants should have successfully completed a Senior Secondary Certificate of Education, including Units 3 and 4—a study score of at least 25 in English (EAL) or 20 in English other than EAL.

All applicants must meet the minimum **English language requirements**.
