



Beyond your degree

A Bachelor of Arts can lead to many options for further specialist study at Deakin for students who wish to deepen their knowledge of a particular discipline.

Bachelor of Arts (Honours)

If you value independent thinking and are looking for a pathway to research degrees and enhanced career opportunities, the Bachelor of Arts (Honours) could be ideal for you. In this specialised year of study, you will conduct in-depth research on a topic you're passionate about, and develop advanced research skills and disciplinary knowledge through coursework.

An honours year is available to high-performing Bachelor of Arts students interested in anthropology, children's literature, creative writing, criminology, history, international relations, literary studies, philosophy, politics and policy studies, and sociology.

Bachelor of Communication (Honours)

Undertake a year of specialist study in a communication discipline that interests you most (advertising, journalism, public relations, digital media) with the Bachelor of Communication (Honours). You will work with experienced researchers and a dedicated supervisor to develop and research your own project, gaining valuable research skills and advanced knowledge sought after by employers.

Bachelor of Creative Arts (Honours)

You can take your creative practice to the next level and explore advanced creative projects and research through a Bachelor of Creative Arts (Honours). In the honours year, you will build your skills, critical engagement and depth of knowledge, and be treated as an independent practitioner exploring your creative practice.

Students from all creative arts disciplines – dance, drama, film, television and animation, photography, design, and visual arts – are encouraged to learn from each other and develop their creative arts practice and scholarly research skills in a collaborative studio environment.
