What is the Casper test?

If you're applying to one of the following Deakin courses, you'll need to sit a Casper test to demonstrate your suitability for a teaching career:

- Bachelor of Early Childhood and Primary Education
- Bachelor of Education (Primary)
- Bachelor of Health and Physical Education
- Bachelor of Arts/Master of Teaching (Secondary)
- Bachelor of Science/Master of Teaching (Secondary)
- Master of Applied Learning and Teaching (Secondary)
- Master of Teaching (excluding Early Childhood).

If you're enrolled in the Bachelor of Arts/Master of Teaching (Secondary) or Bachelor of Science/Master of Teaching (Secondary), you'll need to complete the Casper test in the final trimester of the undergraduate component of your combined degree.

Casper (Computer-based Assessment for Sampling Personal Characteristics) is an online, video scenario-based situational judgement test, assessing a number of non-academic attributes including communication, ethics, empathy, motivation and professionalism.

All institutions offering initial teacher education courses need to select their students based on academic and non-academic criteria – so you'll need to sit a Casper test to be eligible for selection, no matter where you choose to study.

Deakin covers your Casper test fee

If you're enrolled to start studies from 2024 in an initial teacher education degree, and the Casper test is an entry requirement of your course, we'll cover the test fee with an \$80 payment to you. You do not need to apply for the payment. Deakin will identify and communicate with you at the point of admission.
