

How to apply

To apply for Deakin University's VCE Extension Studies you must download and complete the application form.

Eligibility

Students must have completed or be studying VCE units 3 and 4 Human Health and Development to be eligible for Health Behaviour/ Health Information and Data.

Students must have completed or be studying VCE units 3 and 4 Psychology to be eligible for Introduction to Psychology A/Introduction to Psychology B.

To qualify for the program, above average results are required, including a recommendation from a school teacher.

Permission from a parent/guardian is required.

NEW IN 2013 FROM THE FACULTY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

With three new courses and a new overseas study program, 2013 promises to be an exciting year in Science and Technology at Deakin.


The Bachelor of Engineering Science brings together studies in engineering, physiology, exercise, and sport science in a qualification that could lead to a variety of exciting career opportunities in the fields of sports or medical technology, with a focus on human performance. After a common first year, students choose to specialise in one of the following areas: sports technology – electrical, sports technology – mechanical or medical technology.

The Bachelor of Engineering Science is offered at the Geelong Waurn Ponds Campus.

The Bachelor of Information Technology (Mobile and Apps Development) has been designed to provide the knowledge needed to help graduates thrive in this fast-growing and exciting field. The course focuses on the theories, technologies and skills needed to design and develop apps on modern mobile platforms. From app designer or app consultant to software developer, graduates of this course could find a range of exciting career opportunities.

The Bachelor of Information Technology (Mobile and Apps Development) is offered at the Melbourne Burwood Campus.





The Bachelor of Architectural Technology is a unique offering from Deakin's School of Architecture and Building, in partnership with The Gordon's Advanced Design and Building Department. The course is made up of three years of full-time study – the first two years primarily at The Gordon (East Geelong Campus) and the final year completed at Deakin (Geelong Waterfront Campus). Upon completion, students are conferred with the degree from Deakin University.

Graduates of this course will be professionally qualified architectural technologists. They will have developed diverse and practical skills, giving them the capability to be involved in commercial, industrial or domestic projects covering the full scope of construction.

The Global Science and Technology Program aims to recognise, reward and support high achieving students who would like to conduct part of their studies overseas to help them develop new skills and a broader world view. Successful applicants will be offered a \$3000 scholarship to assist with travel costs and will be required to participate in the Deakin Global Citizenship Program.

The program requires applicants to have a minimum ATAR of 80.00 (or equivalent) and to also meet the published prerequisites for their specific course preference within the Faculty of Science and Technology. Applying is a two-staged process: applicants must first apply for the program through VTAC and then also submit a supplementary information form to Deakin's Faculty of Science and Technology.

STUDY EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION STRAIGHT FROM SCHOOL

School-leavers can now apply directly to the University for Deakin's Bachelor of Early Childhood Education (E330).

The course has been adapted to meet new national and international standards in early childhood education, and now includes a primary teaching component, allowing graduates to teach children up to age eight years. This course is offered at Burwood, Geelong and Warrnambool in a variety of flexible study modes, over four years, or can be fast-tracked by studying under Deakin's three-trimester system, enabling completion in nine trimesters (over three years).

DEAKIN AT YOUR DOORSTEP COMING TO CRAIGIEBURN IN 2013

As part of the Deakin at Your Doorstep initiative, Deakin's Associate Degree of Arts, Business and Sciences will be offered in 2013 at the Hume Global Learning Centre, Craigieburn, in partnership with Kangan Institute.

A two-year, full-time course (or part-time equivalent), the associate degree is the ideal first step towards university for exiting Year 12 students or mature aged students who may not have qualified for study through a traditional route. It is currently offered at Deakin's Warrnambool and Geelong Waurn Ponds campuses and TAFE partner campuses across Victoria.

The associate degree introduces students to university study in a supported tertiary environment. Students develop academic and problem solving skills, giving them the edge to succeed in further study or in the workforce.

The benefits of studying the associate degree include:

- it can be a pathway to a bachelor's degree
 with up to 18 months credit
- study close to home
- entry to university without the usual prerequisites
- dual qualification (TAFE and Deakin)
- study in state-of-the-art facilities
- flexible course options through a variety of subject streams.

A \$1000 Learning and Development Scholarship is also offered for associate degree students.

Elizabeth is part of the PapScreen Victoria program, where she works with a team of health professionals and community workers to reach marginalised women and help overcome the barriers they face in accessing cervical screening.

I really enjoy building relationships with external stakeholders and working together to implement effective and sustainable strategies to assist people in the community to have better access to health.
