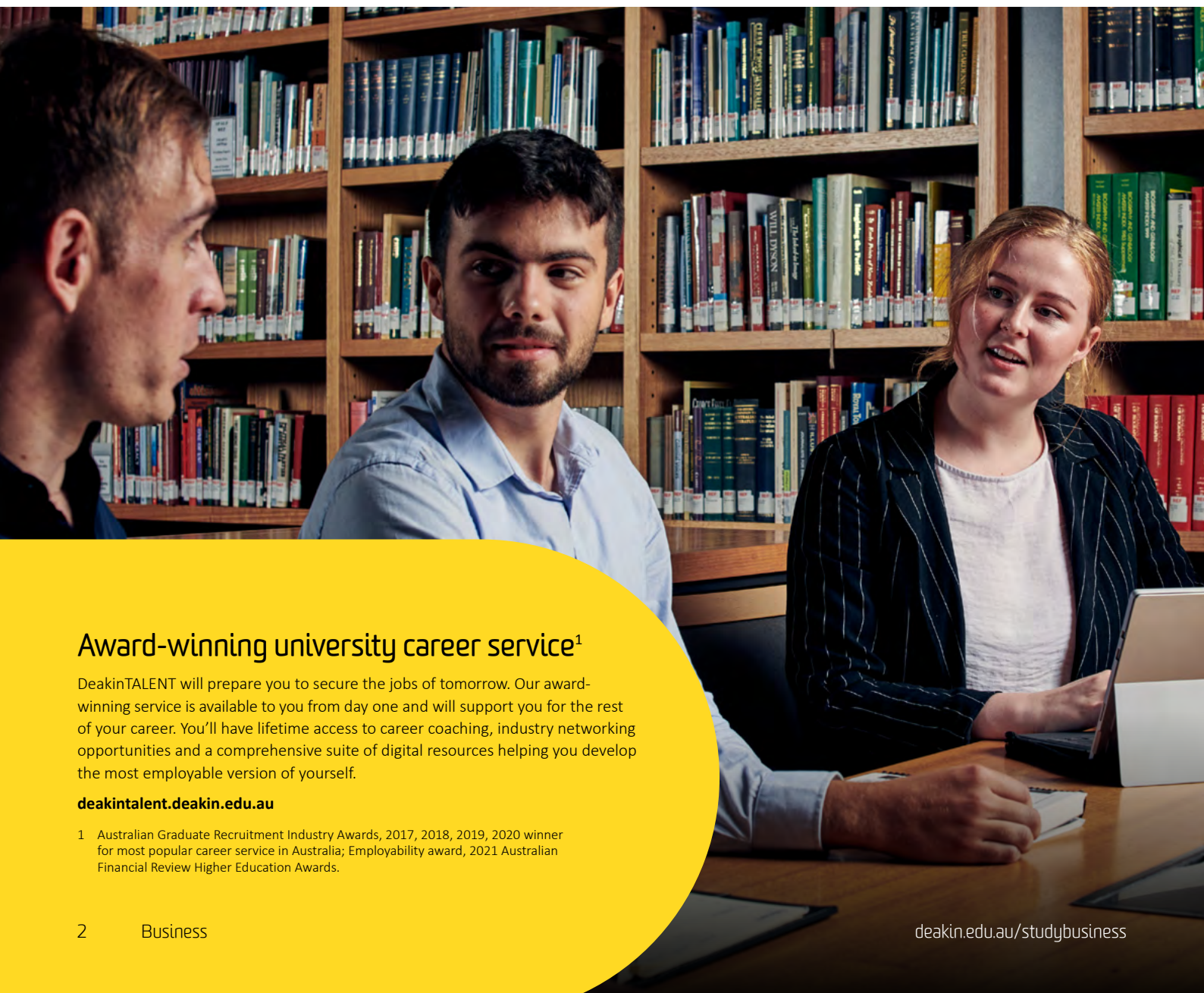

Project management

Join a growing, dynamic profession that involves planning, coordinating, costing and evaluating projects of all sizes, as well as managing the people and risks involved. In a globalised economy, project management is central to developing and delivering new products, services and infrastructure, as well as implementing new techniques and processes to facilitate change.

Property and real estate

The property industry is one of the world's largest employment areas. Deakin's unique property and real estate course leads to careers with long-term employment and rewarding salaries.
