Visitor parking is available at our Waurm Ponds, Burwood and Warrnambool campuses - in some areas, for free. Unfortunately there is no visitor parking at the Waterfront, but there's plenty of [on-street parking nearby](#).

Where to find visitor parking

Visitors can park in the 'General' permit zone white-lined car parking spaces located at our campuses. Don't park in orange or green spaces; these require a different permit type. [Find parking at our campuses online](#).

Payment options

Casual parking can be purchased by the hour or by the day. Payment is made through the CelloPark app, which is free to download and easy to use. Once you download the app or have [accessed the CelloPark system online](#), you'll need to use the relevant zone number for registration:

Campus	Zone number
Melbourne Burwood	1040300
Geelong Waurm Ponds	1040100

Card-only pay by plate (vehicle registration) machines are located on the Burwood and Waurm Ponds campuses. These user friendly machines accept Visa and MasterCard debit and credit cards so you won't be scratching around for loose change.

At Burwood, the machines can be found in car park 1, car park 5 (level 1), car park 6 (levels 1 & 4) and outside building LA on Uganda Street.

In Waurm Ponds, they are on Nicol Drive North and Nicol Drive South.

Free parking options

Parking in General, white-lined bays at our Warrnambool campus is free. There is also a free car park at Waurm Ponds; car park 20. [Maps can be found online](#).

Accessible parking

All our campuses have accessible parking spaces for students, staff and visitors with Category 1 Disabled Persons Parking permits (issued from your local council). Category 1 permits must be displayed at all times. A Deakin parking permit is not required.

Category 2 Disabled Persons Parking permit holders are **not** permitted to park in accessible parking bays. However, vehicles displaying a Category 2 permit are permitted to park in a General parking bay for double the duration of their paid parking.

Parking infringements

Parking Infringement Notices may be issued for any illegally parked vehicles. Instructions for paying infringements are on the reverse side of the Parking Infringement Notice.
