How a scholarship has helped Charlie pursue a wider university experience

What are the benefits of this scholarship?

For me the scholarship provides an array of benefits that allows me to pursue my university education and other interests ranging from sport to volunteering. The ability to connect with likeminded people and have tremendous resources and help available allowed a smooth transition into university life. Further, the scholarship itself, through monetary payments, reduces the economic stress sometimes associated with university.

What has this scholarship allowed you to do?

The scholarship has allowed me to grow my network extensively and has introduced me to individuals that are supportive and invested in my professional development. By connecting and brainstorming with groups and individuals in the Vice-Chancellor's Professional Excellence Program (VCPEP) - which is a professional development program for students who join this scholarship, it has provided me with increased clarity and awareness in relation to my future career path. Whether it is fellow VCPEP members or my academic mentor, they have aided me to lay the foundation for my professional career.

What prompted you to apply?

We are excited to announce that from Trimester 1, 2022, our **Bachelor of Nursing/Bachelor of Public Health and Health Promotion** will now be offered at the Geelong Waterfront Campus, in addition to the Melbourne Burwood Campus – providing greater access to interested students in the Geelong region.

The course gives students the knowledge, skills and ethical understanding to become a successful registered nurse, balanced with a deep understanding of the skills required to empower people to lead healthier lifestyles. Graduates can make a real difference in the health outcomes of individuals, communities and global populations.

Bachelor of Health Sciences – new public health major

From 2022, our diverse and flexible **Bachelor of Health Sciences** will offer students even more choice, with the introduction of a brand new major (and minor) in public health – meaning students will now be able to choose from an impressive list of 13 majors.

The new public health major allows students to develop strategies and techniques to help solve global health challenges, prevent diseases, and promote conditions that optimise population health.

Career opportunities that might arise for students with a major in public health include public health practitioner roles that involve taking action on global public health challenges. Graduates may find employment in a diverse range of areas, such as:

Indigenous Entry Stream – opening up a world of opportunity

In partnership with the National Indigenous Knowledges Education Research Innovation (NIKERI) Institute, Deakin's Indigenous Entry Stream offers places for Indigenous students in our Bachelor of Medical Imaging, Bachelor of Vision Science/Master of Optometry, and Doctor of Medicine.

Bachelor of Medical Imaging and Bachelor of Vision Science/Master of Optometry

The Indigenous Entry Stream for the **Bachelor of Medical Imaging** and the **Bachelor of Vision Science/Master** of Optometry provides a direct-entry pathway for Indigenous Australian applicants. This stream is for non-Year 12 applicants.

Doctor of Medicine

Up to 5% of domestic places in Deakin's **Doctor of Medicine** are held for Indigenous Australian applicants applying through the Indigenous Entry Stream. Indigenous Australian applicants can apply with any undergraduate degree and aren't required to complete the Graduate Australian Medical Schools Admission Test (GAMSAT).

Changes to nursing and related courses

Our **Bachelor of Nursing** and **nursing combined courses** are among the best in the world. With our School of Nursing and Midwifery ranked 30th in the world for nursing by more than one prestigious international ranking system^{*}, our students know they are getting a truly excellent and well-regarded qualification.

We are thrilled to let you know about some changes to our nursing courses that will roll out from 2022 as part of our courses' reaccreditation process and continual improvement.

We are introducing a new unit 'Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples' History, Culture and Health' to provide students with knowledge and understanding of this important segment of our community. We are also streamlining our professional experience placements to take place in each trimester of study, and renaming various units of study to assist students in understanding learning within each unit and to emphasise learning scaffolding across the course.

There will be a restructure of age group related units to emphasise the lifespan approach and have lifespan scaffolded appropriately across the course – 'Care of the Child and Adolescent' will move to the first year, and 'Care of the Older Person' will now be taken in third year.

Changes are in line with the requirements of the Australian Nursing and Midwifery Accreditation Council (ANMAC) and are also reflective of feedback sought from industry, past and present students, and School of Nursing and Midwifery staff to ensure that our courses continue to be among the best in the world.
