Your use of the Deakin University InPlace System is subject to your consenting to Deakin providing personal information about you to external agencies. Deakin University requests your consent to:

1. Course Progression

Deakin releasing to relevant placement agencies details of your course progression (e.g. year of study, units successfully completed or currently being taken) relevant to the professional placement;

2. Working with Children Check

Deakin advising external agencies, prior to the commencement of the professional placement, whether you have a current Working with Children (**WWC**) Check Card. Deakin will, if required by the placement agency, provide a photocopy of the WWC Check Card. Note, it is your responsibility to have current WWC at the commencement of the academic year and present this upon request to the relevant placement agency as required;

3. Immunisation Status

Deakin confirming your immunization status and, if requested by the placement agency, identifying those immunizations that you have not received and which are required by the placement agency as a condition of the professional placement;

4. Contact Details

Deakin providing your Deakin contact details (Deakin email and your mobile number) to the placement agency to enable the placement agency to communicate with you; and

5. Photo ID

Deakin reproducing your student card photo to be uploaded into InPlace and shared with the placement agency at its request.

6. Police Record Checks

Deakin has engaged Mercury Search & Selection Pty Ltd trading as “Fit2Work” (**Fit2Work**) to undertake police records checks required to support student placements.

Deakin requests your further consent to:

- Deakin releasing to Fit2Work, your name, aliases (if any), gender, address, previous addresses, identification documentation and numbering, date of birth, and place of birth, for the purpose of arranging a National Criminal History Check via disclosure of this personal information to Australian

police services;

- Australian police services disclosing to Fit2Work details of convictions and outstanding charges including findings of guilt or the acceptance of a plea of guilty by a court. Spent convictions¹ will be disclosed where relevant to the nature of the work or placement area;
- Fit2Work providing the information disclosed by Australian police services to Deakin and you;
- Deakin providing the information disclosed by Australian police services to relevant placement agencies together with your name and student number for the purpose of determining your suitability to undertake placements; and
- Deakin providing your Deakin email address to Fit2Work to enable Fit2Work to communicate with you.

7. PlaceRight

PlaceRight is the Victorian Government on-line clinical placement system. It assists clinical placement providers and educational institutions in planning and administering placements positions and facilitates sharing of student information. Use of PlaceRight requires that personal information about students be entered into the PlaceRight database and be accessed by the educational institution and the clinical placement provider.

¹ A spent conviction is an offence in which the punishment imposed was not more than 30 months imprisonment and the person has not reoffended in the past 10 years if 18 years of age or older at the time of the offence, or in the past five years if under 18 years of age at the time of the offence. A spent conviction is only disclosed in the interest of crime prevention or public safety

- I understand that if I do not consent to the collection and provision of this information as set out in this consent my placement opportunities may be limited and that this limitation may impact on my course completion date. Should I have any concerns I will discuss the matter with my Deakin Placement Coordinator.
- **I understand that this consent will remain in place for the duration of my enrolment at Deakin and that I may at any time revoke this consent in writing. I will receive an email reminder of this consent and my right to revoke each year of my enrolment.**
