## Course overview

# Professional experience

Working with early childhood settings across Australia, a dedicated team will help you find the right placements based on your interests, skills, residential location and mode of transport. We'll arrange at least 80 days of placements for you in early childhood settings where you'll learn from experienced educators, and facilitate ongoing communication between yourself and Deakin staff to ensure you have the best opportunity to develop as a teacher.

You are required to obtain a valid Working with Children Check (WWCC) prior to undertaking professional experience placements.

# Professional recognition

This program is approved by the Australian Children's Education and Care Quality Authority (ACEQA) as an early childhood teaching qualification in Australia. Graduates of this course who are intending to apply for registration in Victoria or interstate may be required to provide further information. Applicants are advised to check the registration requirements in their state or territory, carefully.
